

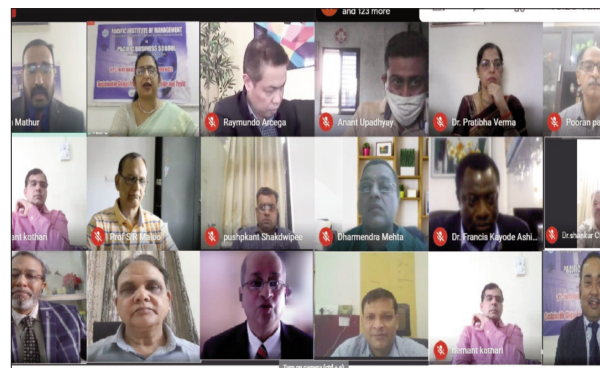
235 Researchers from India and abroad participated in the online international conference

Udaipur: The two-day twelfth online international conference was launched on April 16, 2021, under the joint aegis of the Pacific Institute of Management, Pacific University, and Pacific Business School. Conference Chairperson Prof. Mahima Birla, Dean Faculty of Management, stated that Pacific University, being the premier leading educational institution in North India, has always been aware and alert to various events on sustainable global topics and while discharging its academic responsibilities and the challenges of covid-19. Marfatia, Senior Vice President, ENAM Asset Management Company Pvt. Ltd., presented their views in the context of Environment and Resource Management

(ERG). He focused on using various technologies used in the country and abroad, which can preserve the incomparability of the environment and the planet Earth. The emphasis was mainly on preventing the use of paper and the implementation of various areas of the Environmental Protection Act related to that. Meena told Congress President Sonia Gandhi and members about the efforts being made by Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot to deal with the second wave of Corona, and said that Gehlot, through public representatives, as well as people from social, religious areas, through VC they are moving ahead of everyone's opinion after the meeting. Meena also praised Gehlot's innovative attempt to broadcast live meetings on social media by the VC and said that this would increase public confidence in the government.

15 CM lumps of pancreas and gallstones removed



Udaipur: In Geetanjali Medical College and Hospital Udaipur, following all the necessary rules related to the

Recently, a 40-year-old Bhiwara resident patient underwent a successful laparoscopic procedure of a lump of pancreas and gallstones at the same time. The team that made the operation successful by a Surgeon of General Surgery Department Dr. Mohit Kumar Badgurjar, HOD Dr. Pankaj Saxena, Dr. Suman Parihar, Dr. Charu from the Department of Anesthesia, & Dr. Vikram, OT Incharge Hemant and Assistant Prakash, etc. Dr. Mohit said that the patient was complaining of pancreatitis; although the patient was taking his treatment at Bhiwara's private hospital for the last four months, the patient had developed a lump during treatment & had unbearable pain, due to the pain, it became tough even for the patient to lie down, as well as he could not even eat food, because after eating something for a little, the lumps put pressure on the stomach, which caused the patient The stomach could not even eat food, or it would vomit and have a fever. The patient was admitted to the General Surgery Department of Geetanjali Hospital and was thoroughly examined. Examination revealed that the patient's lump had become 15 centimeters, and also, there was a stone in the patient's bile. Both these diseases were successfully operated by laparoscopy, and the patient was freed from the disease. The patient is still healthy, can eat, and is maintaining his routine.
