Jallianwala Bagh massacre symbolizes British repression and brutality

Udaipur: The Jallianwala Bagh massacre was the most barbaric act of British rule. These tales of repression of the British and the sacrifice of the innocent still make the story stand up. These views were expressed by Prof. Chandrashekhar Sharma of Meera Kanya Mahavidyalaya as the keynote speaker at a classy border event organized by the U.C.S.S.H. Dialogue Series Jallianwala Bagh Massacre organized by the College of Social Sciences and Humanities of Mohanlal Sukhadia University Udaipur. In a program organized under the chairmanship of Vice-Chancellor Prof. Amarika Singh, Professor Sharma said

that the genocide of Jalianwala

Bagh on 13 April 1919 was the cruelty of General Dyer. One of his decisions killed thousands of people. The British rule also gave a clean chit to Dyer, calling this decision correct. This incident was a conspiracy to weaken the independence movement and break Hindu Muslim unity. He said that proved to be a turning point of the national movement.

The Jallianwala scandal is like that of a Knight Mayor, with villains O Dyer and MR Dyer. It would be wise to call Dyer the Ahmad Shah Abdali of modern India. The Jallianwala carnage resulted from Dyer's bloodshed, his colonial zealotry thinking that Indians should be made a creeping worm, and

broke their morale so that they could bear the British oppression. For this reason, the Rowlatt Act, which was called the Black Act, first misused Satpal Arya and Saifuddin Kichlu in Amritsar and roasted about 2 thousand people with 1650 rounds of bullets. There was a game of hiding the death toll in the British Commissions and Inquiry Committees.

O Dyer, avenging this massacre, had O Dyer go to London to be an orphaned 21-year-old Udham Singh, who worked as a chef after 20 years of work, shot Dyer in London in 1940 and was sentenced to death, Indian national pride. The Jaliwala incident is tragic, but it remains clas-

sical in the national image; only then the Mangadh of 1913 is called Jallian wala of Raiasthan.

Vice-Chancellor Singh said that our history has been proud. The knowledge of historical fact reaches the new generation suitable form such ceremony. Efforts are constantly being made in this direction from Sukhadaia University. He said that the topic of discussion had been selected with similar intentions.

More than 100 million doses of approved vaccines- Covaxin and Covishield are being provided in coun-

try.Government is planning to immunise around 200 million to 250 million of people by this July.

Rajasthan conducted first round of covid 19 vaccination on 3rd January 2021 in 7 districts of the state. Jaipur and Udaipur received its first consignment of covid 19 vaccines on 13 January 2021 which includes Bharat Biotech's Covaxin and Serum Institute of India's Covishield. On 16 January the first dose of vaccines were given to selected front-line health workers under national vaccination programme, at 16 sites across the Rajathan. According to the state head of WHO rajathan is the best state in terms of preparation for covid 19 immunisation.

Public awareness related to vaccination programme is very important as many of the people are taking that for granted. Health care professionals should provide adequate information regarding the vaccines introduced, in terms of its quality, cost etc. People need to understand the importance of getting vaccinated.

Rajasthan Opens Sufficient Oxygen Supply For Covid-19 Patients

ajasthan, along with 11 other States of India is counted as 'High Burden States' by Central Ministry on Thursday, April 15, 2021. This decision is made accounting the heavy quantity oxygen shortage concern arising there for Covid-19 patients. Giving it a top priority, Union Home Secretary, Ajay Kumar Bhalla, has mentioned to provide each of these High Burden States more than 17,000 MT of oxygen by April 30. Besides Rajasthan, other 11 States under this category are Maharashtra, Gujarat, Delhi, Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Karnataka, Kerala and Tamil Nadu.

Following the growing demand graph pointing more than 60 percent of daily oxygen production being used for Covid treatment purpose, Central Government has imposed a ban on oxygen supply for industrial use from April 22 to be continued until further order. Allowing even more, unrestricted free inter-state transportation of oxygen is permitted. No limitation is there on oxygen manufacturers and suppliers for oxygen delivery to hospitals located in their own State. Special freight trains 'Oxygen Express' are proposed to be running to supply liquid oxygen and oxygen cylinders through Green Corridor, a quick delivery route as suggested by Rail Ministry.

In Rajasthan, situation is worsening day by day. As found on Friday, April 16, through Rajasthan's State Health Department Data, 7359 Covid Positive patients were admitted in various hospitals. Major cities such as, Jaipur, Jodhpur, Udaipur, Kota, Bhilwara, Rajsamand, Sirohi, Dungarpur and Baran are already marked under Red Zone Area.

On Saturday, April 17, 2021, the State Health Department has instructed all divisional commissioners and collectors of Rajasthan to maintain sufficient buffer stock of oxygen supply for Covid Hospitals. To keep it All-Time-Ready in this emergency, 24 Hours power supply will be given in three phase to the oxygen-generating private plants to ensure their full production. Together with other States, Rajasthan has made all its support system available to eliminate this alarming pandemic danger.
