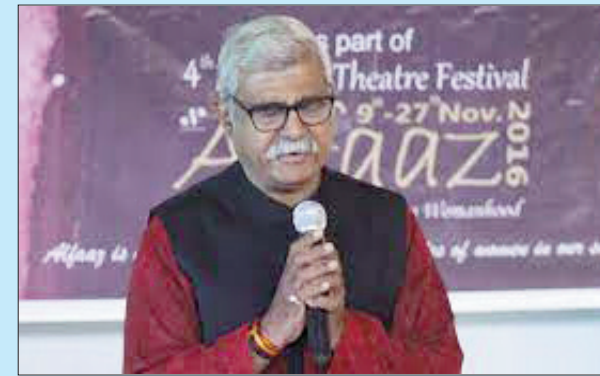

It was a Monday afternoon. I was studying in University Central Library. I had grown beards since it was a passion with me. A student of I Year B.A., I used to study often in the Central library without spending much time with friends in the college after classes were over. A soft voice drew my attention as I read. I looked up and found a young teacher with longish beards, broad rimmed spectacles looking at me very affectionately. I stood up and wished him. He made me sit down and asked whether I was pursuing research. I told that I was only studying in my I Year B.A. He spoke at length and asked me about my interests. Since then we used to meet often. He took me to his home and offered sweets. The entire family was very affectionate. With the tips received from him I could fare well and obtain good marks. We talked about University, students' problems and also about broader issues concerning the country and the world. Things were changing fast in the world. USSR was undergoing turbulent changes. Still the exhibition of Russian books along with other progressive writers of India was laid out every year by Progressive Publishing House. It was my dear sir, Prof. R.N.Vyas who took me to such exhibition once. Those were the days when we used to travel long distances on bicycles. Money was a scarce thing. Still we used to save small amounts to be able to buy good books. It was sir who made me look beyond my subjects and opened a vast new world to see and learn about. Years rolled by and I never knew how and when I became a part of his family. He taught us to cook vegetable Khichdi which would save time and still satisfy us fully. His office and home were open to us almost the whole day. There was little which we hesitated to discuss with him. We felt no hesitation in asking favours from him including his byke if we were to go somewhere. We knew he would never say NO.

Prof. Vyas had obtained M.Phil. from Jawahar Lal Nehru University, New Delhi used to wear Khadi Kurta and Pyjamas. His simplicity inspired us. I too adopted that attire. He used to carry a Jhola to keep his books. I also started keeping one. He was my role model. His politeness was infectious and so was his laughter. He would always keep a smile and encourage students to do better despite hardships. Every meeting with him was a lesson in academics. He used to work till late in his department. We wondered what all he was studying even after becoming a scholar of such eminence. He was so comfortable with using computers and other latest technologies that we were always filled with awe. He would always welcome us with a cup of hot black coffee in his office. When we came to know about his projects with Israel and later with France we were filled with a sense of pride.

When I became a teacher I tried to emulate him. It was not easy. He treated me and my other friends too as his friends. He would insist on calling us his friends whenever we introduced or addressed him as our teacher. His generosity knew no bounds. It was his motivation that I could participate in two conferences of Rajasthan Geographers Association and also in a conference of National Association of Geographers of India. Whenever he organized an academic event we were inevitably there and he would insist that we should make academic contribution and not just help in organizing the event. He gave me a world view. Other teachers like Prof. B.C.Mehta and Prof. Naresh Bhargava were also very affectionate and moulded my personality. Literature taught me to be sensitive and such teachers made me conscious of my social and political responsibilities. Forty years long association with Prof. R.N.Vyas has been a pleasant journey with ups and downs but without even a single moment of fatigue or disappointment. I cannot thank him enough and no amount of writing could pay sufficient tributes to him.

Former Chancellor of Janardan Rai Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth Bhawani Shankar Garg Passes Away



Udaipur: Bhawani Shankar Garg, former Chancellor of Janardan Rai Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth passed away on 13th May, 2021 following a brief illness. He was 93 years and was staying at his residence in Ashok Nagar. Sh. Bhawani Shankar Garg was born in 1928 at Sitamau, Malwa, Madhya Pradesh. He joined Rajasthan Vidyapeeth in 1948 as a clerk and rose to the position of Chancellor by dint of

his dedication and perseverance. He was also the patron of All India Adult Education Association where he had served in various capacities for a pretty long time. At Rajasthan Vidyapeeth Sh.Garg served in various capacities such as Principal, Janata College, Dabok, Director, Lok Shikshan Pratishthan, Kul Pramukh and finally as Chancellor. He was very close to Manishi Pdt. Janardan Rai Nagar and used to call Mrs. Nagar as his sister. After the untimely demise of Sh.Kalyan Mal Jaisani, Mukhyadhishtata who was second in command in Rajasthan Vidyapeeth, Sh.Bhawani Shankar Garg rose to Prominence and assumed very powerful position in the institution.

Sh. Bhawani Shankar Garg was the last official of Vidyapeeth who was living till recently. He had seen the rise of Rajasthan Vidyapeeth to prominence and also was witness to the recent deterioration in its internal democratic functioning. He was editor of Samaj Shikshan, a monthly magazine devoted to Adult and Non-formal education for years. On every 21 August, the foundation day of the institution his message used to be circulated among the workers of Vidyapeeth when he was Kul Pramukh and when he became chancellor, his message as Chancellor. It used to be an official document carrying an authentic data about the health of the institution including its financial health. He is survived by his son Rajeev Garg and daughters Snehlata, Bharati, Anjana. His grandson Gaurav Garg is an Assistant Professor in Department of Computer Science, Janardan Rai Nagar Rajasthan Vidyapeeth.

Udaipur: Minister-in-charge Pratap Singh Khachariwas arrived in Udaipur on Friday. Here, Minister Khachariwas held a covid review meeting in the Zilla Parishad auditorium. During the meeting, Khachariwas appreciated the efforts being made under the leadership of District Collector Chetan Deora and S.P. Dr. Rajeev Pachar for covid management and cradle of lockdown in the district. On occasion, District Collector Chetan Deora, S.P. Dr. Rajeev Pachar, ZPCO Dr. Manju, A.D.M. Administration O.P. Bunkar, and other officials were present.

Appreciation of Udaipur model

Minister Khachariwas said that efforts are being made in Udaipur to control the corona infection in a very planned and organized manner. The people here are aware, and the administration is ready. Collector Chetan Deora informed about the work being done by the district administration about the treatment of covid patients. CMHO Dr. Dinesh Kharadi informed the Minister through Block wise Corona patients, Close contact, Positive rate, Sampling, Oxygen demand, etc., in the district through PPT.

Got information about black fungus

Khachariwas said that there is the availability of oxygen beds in Udaipur hospitals, which is good. Not a single patient should be deprived of treatment. Principal of R.N.T. Medical College, Dr. Lakhan Poswal, and M.B. Hospital Superintendent Dr. R. L. Suman said that patients need more oxygen this time. Most of the patients are being brought to the hospital in criti-



cal condition from home. Khachariwas also inquired about cases of black fungus in Covid patients.

Praise on reducing oxygen consumption

Zilla Parishad C.E.O. Dr. Manju said that the Oxygen Audit Team inspects the hospital twice a day to reduce oxygen leakage. Nodal officers monitor high consumption hospitals and identify them.

During this time, posters were pasted in hospitals, and families were also made aware of saving oxygen. This reduced oxygen consumption per patient and also reduced leakage.

Patients' enhanced morale

Earlier, Minister Khachariwas increased patients' morale by visiting the covid wards in ESIC and M.B. Hospital. Appreciating the efforts of the hospital administration, Khachariwas said that patients here need to be strengthened from the heart. There is a very good system in the hospitals. I salute you for oxygen management. This time will not come again, but our work will be remembered.

Rajasthan is a family- CM is our role model

Addressing the officials in the Zilla Parishad auditorium, Khachariwas said that the whole of Rajasthan is a family and CM Ashok Gehlot is our role model. CM himself is working for 18-18 hours despite being Corona positive. The battle is sure to be won by Koreana.
