

"Nutrient Management - Major Basis of Sustainable Production" - Dr. Rathore

Udaipur - On the online lecture and discussion program organized by the Directorate of Extension Education, Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur, on the subject of Nutrient Management, for the progressive farmers of the progressive farmers of Rajsamand, interacted in a webinar held at the leading hospitality of Udaipur. The main objective of this program was to motivate farmers to adopt nutritional value and management. At the beginning of the program, the Director, Directorate of Extension Education, Udaipur, Dr. Sampat Lal Moondara, during his welcome address, said that we are exploiting the land heavily for intensive agriculture and the desire for more production. We are not supplementing those nutrients in proportion to the number of nutritious plants that we are taking from the land. As a result, there is a shortage of various essential nutrients in the ground, which has led to stagnation in production. Some

areas also see a decrease in production and a severe reduction in soil bacteria, which is a matter of concern. The only solution to all these problems is nutrient management.

The chief guest of the program, Dr. Narendra Singh Rathore, Vice Chancellor MPUAT, Udaipur, said in his address that nutrient management is the mainstay of increasing soil fertility and productivity, and now the time has come that farmers should adopt proper management of integrated nutrients so that the soil is broadened, to keep fertility balanced, otherwise by continuously cultivating, the physical, chemical and biological functions of the soil are adversely affected. He also said that crops take 15 nutrients from the ground in their dosage form for good growth and rich production, while three nutrients are automatically mixed with air and water. An adequate quantity of all these 15 nutrients is available in the ground. If any one of these nutrients is deficient,



then the production will be adversely affected. Therefore, fertilizers and organic fertilizers, bio-fertilizers, and green manures should be used in the soil to maintain a proportionate amount of all the necessary nutrients in the ground. During the discussion, Rathore told the farmers that using organic fertilizers gives the crops a balanced amount of all nutrients, improves soil structure, and increases the number of beneficial organisms in the soil, increasing soil fertility. Organic fertilizers mainly used in crops should include green manure, cow dung manure, compost, super com-

post, vermicompost, prom organic manure, moths, various organic fertilizers, Rozobium culture, and Vam culture, etc. He said that the three significant components of farming are production, productivity, and income, and these three can be easily increased by coordinated nutrient management.

Vice-Chancellor also said that despite the abundant use of fertilizers in the country today, the expected success in crop production is not being achieved as we are using many fertilizers, which has made their use very unbalanced. The soil there is a lack of sub-

tle elements in it. He also said in his statement that today's urgent need is to increase fertilizer use efficiency and not use them more. Vice-Chancellor Dr. Rathore stressed the need for greater use of nano fertilizers, bio-fertilizers, customized fertilizers, vermicompost, and water-soluble fertilizers.

Dr. Rathore called upon the farmers to say that they need to pay more attention to the rate at which fertilizers are used, at what time, in which place, and method. With the proper coordination of these things, we can achieve higher crop production and maintain soil fertility for a more extended period. He advised the farmers to get their soil certificate prepared after completing their soil analysis, get the soil health card renewed every year, and use manure and fertilizers accordingly.

The keynote speaker of the discussion program, Dr. Ram Hari Meena, Co-Archery and Head of Department, Soil Science and Agrochemicals,

Rajasthan Agricultural College, Udaipur, elaborated various aspects and importance of nutrient management during his lecture. He provided detailed information to farmers about multiple types of nutrients, their significant functions in crops, and diseases caused by their deficiency through his presentation. He explained that soil is a natural body that is synthesized as a profile from a variable mixture of various substances formed by decomposing and decomposed mineral substances and decaying organic matter.

It covers the earth in the form of a thin cover and, after mixing the appropriate amount of water and air, provides a mechanical basis and partial sustenance to the plants. Agriculture is not possible without good soil. It is the soil that provides the necessary nutrients for the good growth of crops. Food production can be easily increased by proper management of these nutrients.

Covid service: in 45 days, 27500 food packets send to families

Udaipur - 2nd phase of the corona epidemic, has tortured a person physically and mentally. The treatment of the patient suffering from Corona is the concern of the family. 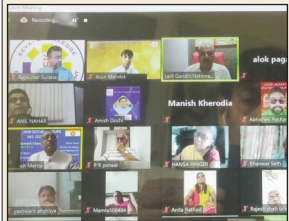

Oxygen plant will be set up at CHC Kherwara - Dr. Dayaram Parmar

Udaipur - Dr. Dayaram Parmar, MLA and former Higher Education Minister of Udaipur, Kherwara Assembly constituency, has said that every government hospital in the state will be made self-sufficient as per the state government's decision in oxygen. The setting up of this plant will benefit the patients of rural areas.

According to Block Chief Medical Officer Dr. Arun Kumar Meena, one thousand eight hundred square feet of land has been identified by the Medical and Health Department to set up an oxygen plant in the premises of the Government Community Health Center, Kherwara, in which two rooms of 25 by 25 feet have been constructed. It will have a manifold and control and another chamber for oxygen generation. He said that this plant would produce 34 jumbo cylinders per day. Along with this, oxygen facility will be provided on the bed itself to the patients through the central line in all the wards and Operation Theater of the hospital. He informed that a D.G. set would be made available for power backup.

1880 cartons of illicit liquor recovered for about 1.5 crore



Udaipur - Excise Department has done the biggest acts in history so far, it has been successful in recovering 1880 cartons of English liquor manufactured in 15 vehicles worth Haryana and Punjab and Chandigarh worth Rs 1.5 crore.

Excise Commissioner Dr. Jogaram said that the state government is taking continuous action against illegal liquor. Information was received from the informer that a large quantity of illicit liquor was deposited in an enclosure behind the powerhouse near Bhujela village between Swaropganj and Abu Road in the Rohida police station area Sirohi district. On this, a five-member team consisting of Pradhikari Narayan Singh, Narendra Singh, Jagdish Bishnoi, and Pankaj Singh was formed under the leadership of Additional District Excise Officer of the department, Rana Pratap Singh. On Sunday, the team recovered 1880 cases of English liquor of various brands manufactured in Punjab, Haryana, and Chandigarh, loaded with six trucks and nine luxury cars, at the place mentioned by the informer. Its price in Rajasthan is around Rs 1.5 crore. While taking action, 11 accused were arrested against whom a case has been registered at Abu Road Excise Police Station.

Most of the confiscated liquor has "For Sale in Arunachal Pradesh" written on it. The Excise Commissioner said that for the first time, such a significant action against illegal liquor had been carried out in one place. He said that the Government's informer plan is getting positive results, and people are giving factual information about illegal liquor to the department. Information about illicit liquor under the informant scheme can be given on toll-free number 18001806436. The informer's name is kept secret, and he/she is also rewarded financially when the action takes place.

Udaipur Collector at door-to-door asking people - did they get the medical kit or not?

Udaipur - District Collector Chetan Deora visited the tribal-dominated area Kotra on Friday. During this period, Collector Deora took stock of the current situation of corona infection and the arrangements regarding treatment in hospitals. He also talked to the villagers and public representatives to know the ground situation.



The Collector came out on foot in Kotra and went to every house to confirm the medical services here and asked the people - did you get the medical kit or not?

Whether the surveyors came or not? Anyone having a cough or cold or fever?

Collector visited the village: Collector Deora also reached the Juda village of Kotra Panchayat Samiti. Here, he went door-to-door to talk to the people and asked him to cooperate with the Kotra Panchayat Samiti to make it Corona free. The Juda Sarpanch and the villagers also spoke openly to the Collector and assured him of defeating Corona soon.

Talk to the policemen at the check post. Given the geographical and cultural diversity in the Kotra region adjacent to the Gujarat border, the Collector talked to the policemen present at the check post and got information about the traffic. The Collector inspected the covid Consultation and Care Center and got information from the doctors about the oxygen system, availability of medicines, and other arrangements. He also boosted their morale by talking to patients, and family members admitted there.

Arrives at CHC. Collector Deora inspected Kotda CHC and directed to strengthen the medical facility, effective use of the mobile medical unit. The Collector also checked the Quarantine Center Ambedkar Hostel and gave necessary instructions.

Officials meeting. Collector Deora reviewed the officials meeting in Kotra Panchayat Samiti, Corona treatment arrangements, vaccination, and door-to-door survey work. SDO Sadhuram Jat presented the details of the door-to-door survey work. The SDO said that three door-to-door surveys had been conducted in the area, in which 870 people with ILI symptoms have been exposed. Similarly, medical kits were distributed to 800 people at home, isolation at home, while 70 people were treated elsewhere. The Collector instructed to monitor the Corona infected and suspects. In the meeting, instructions were given for door-to-door survey, medical kit distribution, and better medical services and to ensure lockdown in the area.

Survey work should be quality.

The Collector instructed the Block Chief Medical Officer to provide medical kits to all survey teams and take special care of their safety and extend the sampling and vaccination sessions. In addition, he emphasized that survey work should be quality and that local survey teams should try to bring awareness among others with the help of local public representatives, conscious people, and survey work should be done with the confidence of common people.

Block Development officer Dhanpat Singh informed that ration kits are being made available to needy people. Regular masks are being distributed, and oximeters have been made available in all gram panchayats.

Narayan Seva gave ration to 40 laborer families
