Prof. Singh informed that this proposal of Shri Kallaji Vedic University had been approved by the meeting of the Academic Council of Mohanlal Sukhadia University and the joint mini-BOM meeting of both the universities. According to the proposal of the Joint Bom, the management and sponsoring body of Shree Kallaji Vedic University have sent to the Hon'ble Governor and the State Government for appropriate action. In this sequence, a request has been made to meet the Governor and the Higher Education Minister to implement it. Welcoming this

action plan for the development and expansion of Mohanlal Sukhadia University, Shri Bhati hoped that it would give historical strength to the ancient Indian knowledge tradition and preservation of Vedic literature and culture. Prof. Amarika Singh, Vice-Chancellor of Mohanlal Sukhadia University, informed that Shri Kallaji Vedic University Nimbahera would in the future be known as the constituent institute of Mohanlal Sukhadia University - Shri Kallaji Campus Nimbahera

24 Universities declared fake by UGC

University Grants Commission (UGC) has declared 24 universities as fake. Bhartiya Shiksha Parishad, Lucknow, UP and Indian Institute of Planning and Management (IIPM), Qutub Enclave, New Delhi have also been found functioning in violation of the UGC Act, 1956. Uttar Pradesh has the highest number of fake universities. There are 8 universities in Uttar Pradesh that have been declared fake.
