By-Elections in two assembly seats of Udaipur division of southern Rajasthan

Congress's upper hand in Vallabhnagar and BJP's hope of victory in **Dhariyavad**

New Delhi: The prestige of both the ruling Congress and the opposition BJP in the state is at stake in the by-elections being held in Vallabhnagar and Dhariyavad assembly seats in the Udaipur division of southern Rajasthan. Polling is to be held on these seats on October 30. The election results will be declared on November 2.


In these elections being held in the Mewar region of Rajasthan, the Congress is showing a heavy edge in Vallabhnagar, while in Dhariyavad, the BJP seems to have some hope. The Vallabhnagar general seat is dominated by Meena, Rajput, and Brahmin votes, and the Dhariavad seat reserved for the Scheduled Tribes is dominated by tribal voters.

Nine candidates from the Vallabhnagar assembly seat are UdaiLal Dangi of RLP, Preeti Shaktawat of Congress, Himmat Singh Jhala of BJP,

Sukhsampat Bagri of BTP besides independents Gajendra, Narendra Chaudhary, Bherulal Kalbelia, Randhir Singh Bhinder, and Vijay Kumar Virwal. In the same Dhariyavad assembly seat, seven candidates are Khet Singh Meena of BJP, Nagaraj Meena of Congress, Ganesh Lal Meena of BTP, Pooranmal of CPIM, Ram Singh Meena of Bahujan Mukti Party including independent Kailash and Thawarchandare contesting quadrangular contest in Vallabh Nagar seat

Nine candidates are in the

fray for the Vallabhnagar seat of Udaipur district, but the main contest is between four candidates. This seat has been vacated by the death of Gajendra Singh Shaktawat, the younger son of the late Gulab Singh Shaktawat, who was a strong leader in Mewar for four decades of Congress and several times minister. There are a total of nine candidates in the fray and Congress, BJP, RLP, and Janata Sena are trying to outdo each other in a quadrangular contest. Here Preeti Kunwar Shaktawat, wife of late Congress MLA Gajendra Singh Shaktawat, BJP's Himmat Singh Jhala, Janata Sena's Randhir Singh Bhinder, and c



Udailal Dangi contested on BJP ticket in the 2018 assembly elections and now MP Hanuman Beniwal's party became candidate from RLP. By the way, BTP's Sukh Sampat Bagri, independent Gajendra, Narendra, Bherulal Kalbelia, and Vijay Kumar are also trying their luck in the electoral fray. No significant effect of BTP in Vallabhnagar is visible in this election ground.

The Congress here wants to take advantage of the sympathy wave in the name of its late MLA Gajendra Singh Shaktawat in favor of his wife Preeti Kanwar.

BJP is incurring double losses in Vallabh Nagar because here Udai Lal Dangi,

who contested the election on BJP ticket in 2018, was third in the assembly as well as Randhir Singh Bhinder of Janata Sena who was fiercely opposed to Leader of Opposition in the Assembly Gulab Chand Kataria, may harm BJP. Thus the path of BJP is not easy in this seat as there is a contest between candidates of four parties in Vallabhnagar which is a very tough struggle.

Congress's trouble is also not working. The party has given the ticket to Gajendra's wife Preeti Kanwar in his place, ignoring the ticket claim of Devendra Singh, elder brother of late MLA Gajendra Singh. That's why Devendra Singh is

engaged in an election campaign with so much heart? It is interesting to watch. Devendra Singh himself wanted to inherit the legacy of his father and Congress veteran late Gulab Singh Shaktawat, but the party has given preference to his younger brother's wife. That is why the Congress has named Devendra Singh Shaktawat, the district level assemblywise election committees in Udaipur for both Vallabhnagar and Dhariyavad assembly elections, and he has been made a member of the district level election steering committee. It is difficult to say in whose favor the result will go.

tested the 2018 assembly elections on a BJP ticket. Now RLP candidate Udai Lal Dangi's path does not look easy in the four-cornered struggle going on in Vallabhgnagar. The party now has to take on the candidates of Janata Sena and Congress along with Udai Lal Dangi here. The Leader of the Kataria, seems to have accepted this and started paying more attention to the Dhariyayad seat, Janta Sena leader Mangi Lal Joshi claims that two-time MLA here and Randhir Singh Bhinder, who has won civic elections, is in high spirits, so Vijayshree will choose him. However, political pundits assess that here the Congress can get the benefit of being in power in the state. Apart from Rajputs and Brahmins, voters of other Vallabh Nagar.

In such a situation, it can be said that in the Dhariabad by-election, the Bharatiya Janata Party has felt great relief from the withdrawal of rebel Kanhaiyalal Meena from the electoral fray and the BJP is hoping to retain the seat of Dhariyawad. Here both the parties have breathed a sigh of relief even after the rejection of the nomination of the declared candidate of BTP Thawarchand Meena. BTP's dummy candidate is also not showing any special effect in castes are also not less in the election field Ganesh Lal Meena.BJP is seeing some hope of its victory in this seat and Leader of Opposition paigning loudly here.

Modi launched PM Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission

New Delhi: Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi launched PM Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission. He also inaugurated various development projects worth around Rs 5200 crore for Varanasi. Governor and Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, Union Ministers, Dr Mansukh Mandaviya, Dr Mahendra Nath Pandey, State Ministers and people's representatives were among those present on the occasion. Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister said the country has achieved a

major milestone of 100 crore vaccine doses in its fight against the corona epidemic. "With the blessings of Baba Vishwanath, with the unwavering glory of Maa Ganga, with the unshakable faith of the people of Kashi, the campaign of free vaccine for all is progressing successfully", the Prime Minister said. The Prime Minister lamented that in postindependent India, health infrastructure did not get the required attention for a very long time and citizens had to run from pillar to post for proper treatment, leading to worsening of the condition and financial strain. This led to a persistent worry about medical treatment in the hearts of the middle class and poor people. Those whose governments remained in the country for a long time, instead of the all-around development of the country's healthcare system, kept it deprived of facil-

The Prime Minister said that PM Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission aims to tackle this deficiency.

The aim is to strengthen the critical healthcare network from village to block to the district to the regional and national level in the next 4-5 years. Describing the initiative taken by the government under the new Mission, the Prime Minister said that there are 3 major aspects of the Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission to address the different gaps in the health sector of the country. The first is related to the creation of elaborate facilities for diagnostics and treatment.

Under this, Health and Wellness Centers are being opened in villages and cities. where there will be facilities

for early detection of diseases. Facilities like free medical consultation, free tests, free med-

icine will be available in these centres. For serious illness, 35 thousand new critical carerelated beds are being added in 600 districts and referral facilities will be given in 125 districts

Due to the tireless efforts of Urologist Dr. Vishwas Baheti, Dr. Pankaj Trivedi, and their team, the patient, a resident of Dungarpur, was successfully treated and given a new life.

Dr. Vishwas told that a 45-year-old patient from Dungarpur came to Geetanjali Hospital due to pain and fever in the armpit, she was admitted and given antibiotic injections to control the

infection. The patient's increased blood sugar was controlled with the help of Endocrinologist Dr. Omkar Wagh. Patient's CT On examination, it was found that she had large stones in the left kidney tube (ureter), due to the large size of the stone, it was not possible to perform laparoscopic surgery for the patient, so open surgery was planned for the patient. During the surgery it was found that the ureter of the patient was almost filled with many stones, all the stones were taken out. The total measure of all the stones was about 17 cm. The patient's kidney was bleeding, which was cleaned and the ureter was closed with DJ stenting. The patient is still healthy after the operation, he has been discharged after 5 days of the operation. The patient told that she was suffering for the last 3 years and she was unable to bear the expenses, in such situation it came to know that the patient was treated under the Chief Minister Chiranjeevi Health Insurance Scheme in Geetanjali Hospital, she is now completely healthy and was given to her by the hospital. leave has been granted.
