



## A major milestone

The administration of 100 crore vaccine doses is a major milestone for India in its valiant fight against the Covid-19 pandemic. The nation has every reason to celebrate this feat, which has been achieved through the joint efforts of Central and state governments, healthcare and frontline workers, scientists and the citizens on the whole. India's vaccination drive, which commenced on January 16, proceeded at a tardy pace early on, mainly because of vaccine hesitancy and shortage of doses. It took the country as many as 85 days to reach the 10-crore mark. Had the inoculation programme gained momentum in March-April itself, the devastating second wave would have caused far less damage and tens of thousands of lives might have been saved. The contrast is stark: India consumed 203 days to cross the 50-crore mark; it then took just 76 days to go past the 100-crore figure.

He has exhorted people to keep following Covid-appropriate behaviour during the festival season, when overcrowding in public places is a common sight. The complacency that crept in after the first wave abated early this year had contributed largely to the havoc wreaked by the second surge.

Around 75 per cent of India's adults have received at least one dose of the Covid vaccine, while over 31 per cent have been administered both shots. One in every four Indian adults is still unvaccinated, at a time when the country is striving to meet the December deadline for inoculating all of them. The Centre will also have to take a call sooner than later on the vaccination of children, besides booster shots for adults. Among the other challenges are ramping up production of Covaxin, which accounts for only 11 per cent of the 100-crore doses given so far, even as the wait for this vaccine's international recognition is getting longer. The journey ahead may not be easy, but the vaccination gains achieved over the past nine months should give the nation confidence to deal a decisive blow to the virus.

While congratulating every Indian for the monumental teamwork, PM Narendra Modi has also sounded a note of caution.

Gynecologist and obstetrician Dr. Minal Chugh said that due to the latest technology in this type of operation, the patient does not have any pain and other problems in the surgery and recovery are also quick and there is no need for blood transfusion in this surgery. Would have been in this type of telescopic operation, small incisions are made on the abdomen. Due to which there is no scar on the stomach and the risk of infection is greatly reduced. The patient gets better soon with antibiotics given after surgery. Due to the state-of-the-art technology, there is no pain and any other problem in surgery. The woman is now completely healthy. It is worth mentioning that Dr. Chugh has taken fellowship degree in specialized laparoscopy from Kochi.

## Treated an elderly woman with brain hemorrhage without surgery



**Udaipur:** 60-year-old Prerna (name changed) resident of Chittor was suffering from headache for a long time due to severe pain fell unconscious on 22nd September, later and was brought to Paras JK Hospital, Udaipur. It was found in the patient's medical history that 5 years ago, Prerna had suffered a brain hemorrhage, which was also treated in another hospital, but still, she was suffering from the problem of headache.

After preliminary examination and angiography of the brain at Paras JK Hospital, Udaipur, it was found that Prerna has an aneurysm (a type of balloon-like shape in the brain artery) in the left side of the brain. In this condition, the arteries of the brain become weak and sometimes they start swelling somewhere in the middle. If it is not treated at the right time, it can even lead to the death of the patient due to its rupture. Usually, surgery is done to correct it but under the experienced guidance of Dr. Tarun Mathur at Paras JK Hospital, Udaipur it was decided to fix it without surgery flow diverter procedure. This procedure lasted about 40 to 45 minutes. Now Prerna is out of risk and on post-procedure medicines.

In the process of flow diverter procedure, a type of wire and catheter is delivered through the leg vein to the affected area in the brain. After that, a type of mesh is put on the site of the aneurysm, which is called a flow diverter, this mesh stops the blood flow in the aneurysm, and after applying it, the aneurysm gradually starts shrinking in size and is completely cured. Any leakage that occurs during the process is sealed by inserting coils. Dr. Tarun Mathur, Consultant, Interventional Neurologist, Paras JK Hospital, Udaipur said, "Flow Diverter is a new and best option to cure aneurysm. It can be understood to some extent like a stent in the heart. In this, the risk of tearing is less, as well as there is no risk of bleeding a lot. The patient also gets discharged from the hospital soon."

In this type of case, the sooner the treatment is started, the better the patient's chances of getting better, so it is important not to ignore any kind of neurological problems. Symptoms like unusual headache, dizziness, and vomiting with the headache, fainting, etc. should not be ignored and a doctor should be consulted immediately.

## Successful operation of a 5-day-old girl in PMCH for "enteric duplication cyst" disease

**Udaipur:** Pacific Medical College and Hospital successfully operated on a 5-day-old girl suffering from a disease called "enteric duplication cyst". The successful operation was supported by the team of child and neonatal surgeons Dr. Praveen Jhanwar, Dr. Prakash Audichya, Dr. Shilpa, and Anil Bhatt.

The 5-day-old girl was suffering from a rare disease called enteric duplication cyst since birth. The child's mother was diagnosed with the disease during pregnancy. The woman was delivered at PMCH. After delivery, a newborn baby girl was born, whose small intestine remained double, as well as the other part of the intestine, was extra and inactive.
