Shock defeat for BJP in Rajasthan & Himachal Pradesh, Congress wins all seats

Udaipur: In a major setback to the ruling BJP in Rajasthan and Himachal Pradesh, the Congress won the Mandi Lok Sabha and all three Assembly seats of Jubbalkotkhai, Arki and Fatehpur and Vallabh Nagar and Dhariawad where bypolls were conducted on October 30.

"Every victory for the Congress is a victory of our party workers. Keep fighting hate. No fear. — Rahul Gandhi, Congress"

The Congress retained Fatehpur and Arki seats while it wrested Jubbalkotkhai and Mandi from the BJP. In Mandi, former Chief Minister Virbhada Singh's wife Pratibha Singh, who had also represented the seat in 2004 and 2013, defeat-

ed BJP's Brigadier Khushal Thakur (ret'd), a Kargil war hero, in a keenly contested election.

Rajasthan Assembly Bypoll Results 2021: Massive Setback for BJP, Congress Wins Both Dhariawad And Vallabh Nagar Seats

In a massive setback for the Bharatiya Janata Party, the



Congress on Tuesday registered a huge victory in both Vallabh Nagar, Dhariawad Assembly seats. Congress candidate Preeti Shaktawat won the Vallabh Nagar Assembly seat by a margin of 20,606 votes. The party also won the

Dhariawad Assembly constituency with a margin of 18,725 votes. The elections were necessitated after the demise of Congress MLA Gajendra Singh Shekhawat from Vallabh Nagar and the BJP's Gautam Meena from Dhariawad.

Pratibha polled 3,69,565 votes (49.14 per cent) while Khushal got 3,62,075 (48.14 per cent). The victory margin of 7,490 was less than 12,626 votes that went to NOTA. In 2019, BJP's Ram Swaroop Sharma, whose demise in February necessitated the bypoll, had won the seat by a record margin of 3.98 lakh votes. The Congress secured lead in nine of the 17 Assembly segments (part of Mandi Lok Sabha seat), including Manali, Banjar, Anni, Kullu, Bharmour, Kinnaur, Lahaul & Spiti and Nachan. The highest lead of 19,253 votes was from Rampur, Pratibha's native place.

The poll debacle is being seen as a setback for CM Jai

Ram Thakur, whose constituency Seraj too is part of the Mandi parliamentary segment. The BJP got the highest lead of 19,903 votes from Seraj. The drubbing in all the four seats could make the going tough for CM Thakur as his detractors could raise the demand for change in leadership. Viewed as semifinals ahead of the Assembly elections next year, the Congress won despite facing a crunch of resources. Poll analysts claimed price rise and unemployment tilted the scales in favour of the Congress, though the sympathy factor too worked in favour of Pratibha, whose husband and six-time CM Virbhada Singh had passed away on July 8.

Mewar Trail Expedition is Indian Army's homage to heroes of Mewar: Mr Lakshyaraj Singh Mewar

Udaipur: The Mewar Trail Expedition, led by the Indian Army, today culminated their 20-day long expedition at the Maharana Pratap Smarak Samiti, Moti Magri, in the city for the flag hoisting ceremony to mark the final destination of the Trail.

Speaking on the occasion, Mr Lakshyaraj Singh Mewar of Udaipur, a member of the former royal Family of Mewar and President of Maharana Pratap Smarak Samiti said, "During the Mewar Trail Expedition in the historical sites, the Indian Army projected the sacrifices of the heroes of Mewar and the valor of the Indian Army to the children and youth of the concerned area."

The Mewar Trail Expedition was flagged off from Eklingsgarh Military Station, Udaipur on 8th October 2021 and trekked through the world-famous battle sites of Haldighati, Kumbhalgarh, Dewair, Chittorgarh and covered a distance of 550 kms.

A total of 70 soldiers from the 9 Grenadiers (Mewar) including 2 women officers from Konark Corps participated in this expedition. Its aim was to awaken the spirit of patriotism in the children and youth of the country, highlighting the history of the 'Veer Bhoomi' that is the region of Mewar.

Mr Lakshyaraj Singh Mewar of Udaipur said that the Mewar Trail Expedition marked the 75th anniversary of India's Independence, 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' and to celebrate the Golden Victory Year, the 50th year of India's historic victory over Pakistan in the 1971 war.

Desert Corps, Battle X Division and the 9 Grenadiers (Mewar) paid their tribute to the land of Mewar and its heroes.

Earlier the Indian Army paid homage to the statue of Maharana Pratap at the Maharana Pratap Smarak Samiti, Moti Magri. The soldiers of the Mewar Trail Team carried the tradition prevalent in Mewar by hoisting the Nishan (Mewar Flag) at Moti Magri.

Mr Lakshyaraj Singh Mewar of Udaipur had presented a sword to the Mewar Trail expedition team during flag off ceremony. Today it was ceremoniously handed over to him by the expedition team at the flag-in ceremony at Moti Magri.

Ex-Army personnel and all the members of Mewar Trail expedition team were honoured with mementos. Dignitaries present today were Brigadier Shekhar, ex-Army Officials including Lieutenant General NK Singh, Captain Rishabh Suri and RNT Principal Dr. Lakhan Poswal, among others.



The Expedition team members met the veterans and gallant soldiers of the 1971 war at all the trail stopovers. They shared with them the various welfare schemes run by the Indian Army. To inculcate the spirit of patriotism in the youth, they met the students of schools and colleges and inspired them to work for the nation.

The Expedition became even more special as the soldiers of Mewar Bhil Corps also joined them. Mewar Bhil Corps is composed of the native Bhil tribals of the Mewar region who had fought in the Mewar Army, under the leadership of many legendary generals like Maharana Pratap for centuries.

The day of 27th October holds a special significance in the history of the Indian Army as the Infantry Day as on this day the Indian Army started the mission of expelling the Pakistani soldiers and infiltrators from Kashmir.

NATIONAL CAMPAIGN TO PROMOTE DRIVING FOR WOMEN FOR BETTER ACCESS TO LIVELIHOODS AND OPPORTUNITIES



Udaipur: Shell Foundation, a UK based charity and the UK Government in association with Moving Women Social Initiatives Foundation (MOWO) have launched 'Moving Boundaries', a campaign to encourage women to pick up driving skills and remove roadblocks within the ecosystem to increase their job prospects in transportation businesses including as taxi and e-rickshaw driver or as delivery agents for e-commerce companies. Under this campaign, Jai Bharathi, founder of MOWO is touring India on her motorbike from October 11th for a period of over 40 days and covering over 20 cities to create awareness and encourage women to learn driving to increase their job opportunities. Today, Ms Bharathi reached Udaipur on the current leg of her tour. Starting from Hyderabad, she has covered Bangalore, Chennai, Kochi, Goa, Pune, Mumbai, Surat, Ahmedabad and would now be covering Jaipur, Amritsar, Srinagar, Chandigarh, New Delhi, Lucknow, Varanasi, Patna, Guwahati, Kolkata, Ranchi, Bhubaneswar, among others.

The campaign seeks to promote awareness on the importance of women acquiring the power of driving and travelling safely to expand their horizons in all aspects of their lives. The focus is on enabling women to not only learn driving but also own electric vehicle to generate income which in turn can also reduce carbon emissions from transport.

'Even Cargo', a social enterprise providing training, employment, and electric vehicle ownership to women drivers is also supporting this campaign.

As part of the campaign, a WhatsApp based chatbot has been rolled out for women who would like to learn driving a two or three-wheeler vehicle or apply for a job as taxi, auto or delivery rider. Any interested person can express their interest by dropping "Hi" on the WhatsApp number +91 8885916606 and the chatbot will connect them to nearby partner organisations like Even Cargo which offer training and employment opportunities to women. The chat support is available in multiple languages.

Commenting on 'Moving Boundaries', Ms. Jai Bharathi, Founder of MOWO said, "Women all over the world face restrictions on their mobility. They are unable to travel long distance to acquire decent education or take up jobs which involve complex or unsafe commute which results in a restricted pool of job opportunities. I am very excited to take on this 40-day journey on my motorbike across the country to meet women from all strata and hold workshops to make driving an aspirational and achievable employment choice for them. Creating a safe environment where women have access to reliable transportation and they can drive their own vehicles to earn a living is a great way to increase employment opportunities for women in a sector which has predominantly been male-centric."

Speaking on the partnership, Mrs. Shipra Nayyar of Shell Foundation said, "We launched 'Moving Boundaries' to promote safe, affordable, and clean transportation for women for better access to basic amenities like healthcare, education, and jobs. The focus is also to create an environment where by more women can enter the workforce by learning how to drive and becoming owner-entrepreneurs of their vehicles in the transportation linked sectors such as e-rickshaws and as delivery agents. Our ambition is to enable equal access to opportunities for women by helping them become more mobile. We hope that in the next 5 years, by supporting and helping build capacity of more such enterprises that train and employ women from low-income households, we will see a sizable number of women drivers owning and driving electric vehicles in over 100 cities and villages across India increasing safe transportation and connectivity for other women." Promoting employment and entrepreneurship opportunities for women is an important goal for Shell Foundation. Together with the Government of UK, Shell Foundation launched POWERED (Promotion of Women in Energy Related Enterprises for Development) in 2017, a women-focused programme to increase participation of women across the clean energy and mobility value chain in India. POWERED programme supports enterprises that promote inclusion of women in jobs in the transportation and logistics sector as well as enable them to own electric vehicles to earn an income.
