charge about the work done by various departments in the center, benefits given to the applicants of the schemes, and redressal of public problems. The Collector instructed that no villager who came to the camp should return disappointed. He suggested giving relief to the villagers by removing the deficiencies in the applications of departmental schemes.

Collector and public representatives distributed relief:

Apart from District Collector Deora, Udaipur Rural MLA Phool Singh Meena, Girva Pradhan Smt. Sajjan Katara, social worker Vivek Katara and other public representatives also reached Barapal camp and distributed relief to the beneficiaries on behalf of various departments at the campsite. He distributed checks to the heirs of social security schemes, aid devices to the differently-abled, and acceptance letters of pension schemes. The Collector distributed a grant amount of 31 thousand rupees to Devi Lal Meena, resident of Jogiwada, Barapal under the Chief Minister Kanyadan Yojna, on the marriage of his daughter Reena Meena. Similarly, under the Joint Assistance Scheme, the visually impaired, Pintu Meena / Nathu Meena, resident of Barapal, was given to Collector Deora and distributed Smart Can. Pintu told the beneficiary that this would help him in daily tasks and reduce dependence on another person. Under this scheme, the Collector benefited Shantilal Meena, the deaf of Barapal, by giving him a hearing aid. Both the notable persons had not received any equipment to date. On occasion, the Panchayati Raj Department distributed 39 residential leases, 20 pensions, the third installment of 13 houses, and the second installment of one house.

Schemes with a pension are now online

Udaipur: administration seems to be giving relief to the villagers from the very first day under the campaign with the villages. One such case was seen in a camp organized in Makda dev, Gram Panchayat of Jhadol Panchayat Samiti in the district. Meera Naniya of Makdev, with one hand, was not getting a pension even after applying for a disability pension in the last ten years due to a lack of a disability certificate. On Monday, she reached the camp organized in village panchayat Makra Dev and told her problem to the base in charge. While completing the necessary formalities, the center got Meera's application prepared and made online on the spot. Given the situation of non-acceptance in the absence of the Divyang certificate, the officials, taking prompt action, directed the Block CMHO to issue the certificate online, and the online handicap certificate was issued from the ID of the CMHO. Now that Meera was also entitled to Divyang Pension, she looked very happy. The in-charge of the camp told him that now she will get the benefits of pension palanhar and chief minister self-employed especially abled people. The applications of all the schemes have been prepared and made online during the camp itself. Meera said that today her dream came true. During this, Meera thanked everyone by taking a photo at the Chief Minister's selfie point and thanked the government and administration.

Restrictions on guests in weddings removed: Educational activities can be conducted with 100% capacity

Jaipur: Now all types of events can be organized in the state. Along with this, educational activities will also be able to be conducted with 100% capacity. In this regard, the Home Department has issued a new guideline. According to Abhay Kumar, Principal Secretary to the department's Government, after the reduction in corona infection, the state government has decided to relax the restrictions. Under this, wedding ceremonies can be organized, but it will be mandatory for all the guests to wear masks. The ban

on guests at weddings has been removed. Along with this, all kinds of public events can also be held. These include political, sports, entertainment, cultural and religious ceremonies. In these events, along with the mandatory use of masks and sanitization, a distance of two yards will have to be maintained. According to the new guideline, all types of educational institutions can be opened from November 15 with 100% attendance. These include schools from class one to class 12. But the condition is that it will be manda-

tory for all the employees to apply both doses of the vaccine. All the coaching institutes of the state will also be opened from November 15 with 100% attendance. It will be mandatory for these institutions' academic and non-academic staff to apply both doses of the vaccine.

No death due to corona in 100 days in the state

On Monday, four new corona patients have appeared in the state. The significant relief is that there has been no death due to corona in the form for the last 100 days. The last time

he died was on July 31. Till then, 8954 people had lost their lives in the state. Among the new patients found on Monday, three new patients have been found in Jaipur and one in Bhilwara. There is no new patient in the remaining 31 districts of the state. At present, there are 42 active cases in the state. There are 23 active cases in Jaipur, 8 in Bikaner, 2-2 in Jodhpur-Udaipur-Ganganagar-Ajmer, Baran, Barmer, Bhilwara 1-1. The remaining 24 districts are currently corona-free.

Chief Minister warned:

After the new wave of corona in the countries of Europe, Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot has suggested the central Government implement special provisions, including screening, quarantining of travelers coming from abroad. Gehlot, through a tweet, warned the Center on the increasing cases of corona in the countries of Europe and advised people to take precautions. Gehlot wrote that the infection is spreading very fast in the new wave of corona in Europe. It has been seen earlier that after two to three

months of increasing disease in Europe, cases started growing in India. For this not to happen this time, the Government of India should make special provisions for the travelers coming from abroad. At the same time, Gehlot has said that it has also been seen that the common man has now reduced the use of masks. I request everyone not to do this. Keep using the mask as before. Masks, social distancing, and vaccines are the only ways to protect against Covid. Any mistake in these can infect you, so be careful.

Urge to make environment check post

Udaipur: Environmental check posts should be made at the entry borders of the state and district to warn that the domestic and foreign tourists should take a walk, keeping in mind the cleanliness and purity of the local air and water. This suggestion was placed in the lake dialogue held on Sunday.

Dr. Anil Mehta of the Lake Conservation Committee said that tourists come to the state and the city only because of the natural and historical heritage. To protect this heritage and eco-friendly tourist behavior, tourists should be educated through check posts on the borders.

Tej Shankar Paliwal, a Lake Development and Protection Committee member, said that all tourist places, including lakes, should be declared polythene-free areas to protect the local environment. It is also essential to keep in mind the convenience of the residents in the rail map of tourist vehicles.

Nand Kishore Sharma, Director, Gandhi Manav Kalyan Samiti, said that the Tourism Department should prepare an "Environment Charter" and give it to every tourist. This charter should be available in every hotel.

Environmentalists Kushal Rawal and Drupad Singh said that youth services of various projects like NCC, NSS, Eco Club, etc., should be taken as "Environment Friend" at tourist places during the tourist season.
