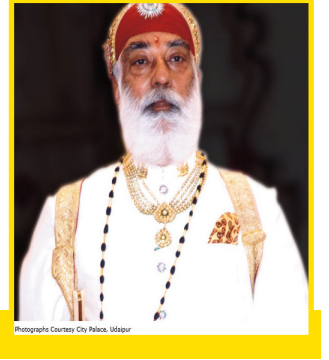

Rahul Gandhi lashed out at the Center in the Mehengai rally

Jaipur: Congress's Mehengai Hatao rally was held in Jaipur, the capital of Rajasthan. Many veteran leaders, including Congress President Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi, and Priyanka Gandhi, reached Jaipur to attend the rally. After a long time, Sonia Gandhi appeared in a rally. However, she did not address the rally. Addressing the rally, Congress leaders fiercely attacked the central government.

Addressing the Mehengai Hatao rally, Rahul Gandhi attacked the central government fiercely. He said that the country's condition is visible to all of you. This rally is about inflation and unemployment, but the country's situation as it is today has never happened before. All institutions of Hindustan are one organization and one hand. The OSD of RSS is sitting in the minister's office. This country is not being run by the people but by 3-4 capitalists. Rahul Gandhi said that the soul of two words could not be the same. These two words are Hindu and Hindutva. Rahul Gandhi said that I am a Hindu but not a Hindutvawadi. These two are not one word; they are different words. Mahatma Gandhi was a Hindu, and Godse was a Hindutva.

Rahul Gandhi further said that a Hindu dies for truth; the truth is his path, he searches for truth for life. Mahatma Gandhi searched for truth throughout his life. But Hindutva Godse shot three bullets in his chest. Hindutvaists have nothing to do with truth. Hindus never bow down in search of truth, but Hindutva is full of hatred because fear is in his mind. Rahul said that. Hindutvawadis have been in power since 2014; Hindus are out of power. We have to remove these Hindutvawadis and bring Hindus to power.



Rahul Gandhi said that we could not be intimidated; we are not afraid of death. Hindutva only wants power, not truth. Their path is not Satyagraha but the planet of power. Hindu faces his fear; he drinks his fear like Shiva.

Who is the Hindu who hugs the most, who is the Hindu who is not afraid of anyone? Whether you read Ramayana, Gita, Upanishad, any scripture where it is writ-

ten, you have to kill the poor, and you have to crush the poor. Could you show me where it is written? It is written in the Gita, fight for the truth. Krishna told Arjuna, kill your brothers for fact; he never said kill for power.

Priyanka Gandhi spoke in the Mehengai Hatao rally

Party general secretary Priyanka Gandhi attacked the central government fiercely. She said that I have come to meet such people whose family members have been crushed by the son of the minister of this government. She said that the PM shares the stage with the killers of our sons. Our tourist Prime Minister could not go 10 km away from his residence to meet the farmers but traveled worldwide. This government does not want the welfare of the people. It's not working for you. For whom are you doing it? This government is working for a few selected people. Priyanka Gandhi said, that leave the rut of seventy years, Modi Ji, tell me what you have done in 7 years.

Priyanka said there are two types of government. One is a dedication to service, speaking the truth to the public, and lies, greed, and loot. Today's central government is the second government. Why is it not used for the public's good as much as is advertised? At the same time, the government cannot provide fertilizer to the farmer. I have met families in line for fertilizer for 3-4 days; those who did not get fertilizer fell there. There is a Congress government in Rajasthan whose intention is correct, you get free treatment up to Rs 5 lakh, but the purpose of the central government is not correct.

India's Harnaaz Sandhu crowned Miss Universe 2021

The Chandigarh-based model, who is pursuing her master's degree in public administration, was crowned by her predecessor Andrea Meza of Mexico, who won the pageant in 2020.

Actor-model Harnaaz Sandhu made history on Monday as she was crowned Miss Universe 2021 -- beating contestants from 80 countries -- 21 years after India last brought home the title.

Only two Indians before Sandhu have won the title of Miss Universe - actors Sushmita Sen in 1994 and Lara Dutta in 2000.

The 70th edition of the event was held in Eilat, Israel, where the 21-year-old bagged the coveted pageant.

While Paraguay's Nadia Ferreira, 22, finished second, South Africa's Lalela

Mswane, 24, came third.

During the final question and answer round, Sandhu was asked what

advice would she give to young women on how to deal with the pressure they face today.

"The biggest pressure the youth of today is facing is to believe in themselves, to know that you are unique and that's what makes you beautiful. Stop comparing yourselves with others and let's talk about more important things that's happening worldwide.

"This is what you need to understand. Come out, speak for yourselves because you are the leader of your life, you are the voice of your own. I believed in myself and that's why I am standing here today," she said to a thundering applause.

Sandhu started her journey in pageantry when she won Times Fresh Face in 2017, representing Chandigarh at the age of 17. She later won the LIVA Miss Diva Universe 2021 title.

Sandhu has also worked in a few Punjabi films, including "Yaara Diyan Poo Baran" and "Bai Ji Kuttange".

The ceremony was hosted by Steve Harvey and saw performances from American singer JoJo.

The selection committee included actor and Miss Universe India 2015 Urvashi Rautela, Adamari Lopez, Adriana Lima, Cheslie Kryst, Iris Mittenaere, Lori Harvey, Marian Rivera and Rena Sofer.

Even after 75 years of independence, the national character has not been formed, and this is the biggest challenge for us, so the responsibility of you and all of us teachers increases even more. Today, we have many challenges like security, unemployment, women's security, class, caste, and a social problem we all have to face together.

The chief guest, former parliamentarian Raghuveer Meena, while praising the attitude of the founder Janubhai, said that before independence, to connect the working person with the mainstream of education, the Shramjeevi College was established. He said that we all are the guides of the future generation; the coming generation will have to tell that what our ancestors gave us, whether we kept it safe or not, what we did after that, and we are handing it over to you. Our country is a country of different classes and castes. We have many dialects here, and by taking everyone along, the country can be taken forward.

Keynote speaker Pawan Khera said that for the last 100 years, many generations have been struggling to ignite the spirit of one ideology which is the country's soul. Two countries got independence, one we and one Pakistan, it is necessary to compare; it is a small country in the area also smaller than us in population, could not have developed a lot. Pakistan has lagged behind us in every respect. We are big in the area. We have a huge population, here different caste, religion, class, different food, tradition, rites, and culture. Everything is different, yet we are somewhere ahead. He said that we are not on the verge of losing what we have found; we are worried about this. He said that there had been mistakes, no matter who the government has been, whether a society or the government. There are mistakes in such a big journey of any country, but if we do not come to the verge of losing what we have found, then after 75 years, there is a need to worry.

He said that we need to remember the foundation stones that gave freedom to the country, due to which the country has reached this stage today. Praising Janubhai, he said that he did the work of lighting the flame of education in the poor and tribal sections. He said that the leader could not show the way to the country. Only the teacher can show the society. If you expect the leaders to lead the community, then it is wrong; if there is any weak section in the country, he is the leader - no matter what party he belongs to.

He said that our hands are tied, we want votes from you, we cannot make you angry, we always try to persuade them that no one should get angry. In the last 75 years, only the leaders have done everything for society; it is not possible. Today we stand with the developing countries, along with the society, governments have a big contribution in this. Today, we are ahead of all of us in every field. Only by taking all classes, religions, sects together, the country can be taken forward.

Presiding over the Kul pramukh, Bhanwar Lal Gurjar said that Janubhai has taken every section along with the organization and took it forward. The institute has brought laurels not only to the country but to the whole world in the field of education, and it needs to be promoted further. Keeping in mind that the commoner should get an education and medical treatment, a hostel has been constructed in Dabok campus for the poor and deprived sections of people at the cost of Rs.13 crore, which will be launched in the coming days. Gujarat tops the position as most resilient State

Gujarat tops the position as most resilient State in FY2021 according to a comparative analysis conducted by PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry on the macroeconomic resilience of the States in the pandemic times for FY 2019-20 and FY 2020-21 on the basis of broad macroeconomic parameters of the States.

The 5 broad macroeconomic parameters include Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) growth rate, Consumer Price Index (CPI) Inflation, Fiscal Deficit as percentage of GSDP, Industrial Investment Proposals and Unemployment.

The comparative analysis is the part of PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry's report titled 'States' Policy Conclave 2021: Role of States' in Making Atmanirbhar Bharat (Self-reliant India)',

According to the performance in key economic indicators, the top States in 2021-21 came out to be Gujarat, Karnataka, Odisha, Maharashtra, NCT Delhi, Telangana, West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, said Mr Pradeep Multani.

Gujarat emerged as the most resilient State and maintained its top position among the top 10 States in FY 2020-21 as the State was also at top in FY 2019-20, according to the five broad economic parameters, said Mr Pradeep Multani.

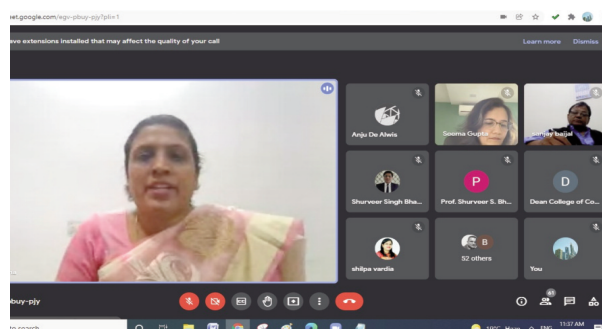

According to Dr. Ashish Singhal, Consultant, Orthopedics and Joint Replacement Surgeon, Paras JK Hospital, Udaipur, the root cause of this can mostly be considered to be rheumatism or arthritis. Some of these problems may be genetic, which become more active in winter. Apart from this, blood vessels also constrict comparatively in winter, due to which blood flow is also affected, and there may be a problem in being physically active, due to which there can be additional pain in case of bone pain. Apart from this, many people have to face this condition due to neglect of nutrition and an inactive lifestyle.

The solution to this problem can be found by following the following points:-

Take proper amount of calcium and vitamin-D:- Give preference to adequate nutrition. For better bone health, consume an appropriate amount of calcium. Also, ensure the proper amount of vitamin C in food and do regular 20 minutes of physical exercise in the sun for vitamin D because vitamin D plays an essential role in absorbing calcium. For proper intake of vitamin D, take a supplement after getting tested on the advice of a doctor. Instead of eating junk food, excessive fried roast, etc., take a balanced diet.

Regular exercise:- Physical activity is significant in winter, but many people often distance themselves from it due to the weather, which is incorrect. Exercise for at least 20 minutes a day as per your physical ability and expert advice.

Dr. Mangal became the principal and controller of PMCH



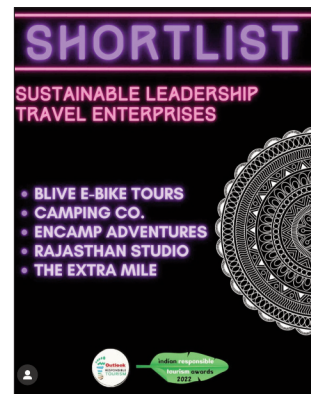

During a press conference in the National Federation of Indian Railwaymen (NFIR) held in Udaipur, Rao admitted that the railways were contracting out profitable trains, which would later cause more damage to the public. As IRCTC was formed, the public was forced to buy expensive food in the railways. The same thing will happen again because the contractor means profit, later the situation is not under control, and the public is forced to grind.



Rao said that Indian Railway Welfare Organization is not treating the railway employees well. The flats were not constructed at the places mentioned to the railway employees. In the Sonepat Kundli Yojna. When the plan was not prepared in the Kundli, why was it publicized and broadcast? Today, the railway employee feels like you have been cheated by buying flats under Sonepat Kundli Yojana. The quality of the apartment is not good, and there is no means of commuting, there is no drinking water, even after seven years there is a lack of basic facilities. In such a situation, IRVO is torturing railway employees by increasing the price, and this fraud should be investigated. Rao said that in the next two years if railway employees' problems are not resolved, the strike will be done with the cooperation of all the unions because the government is not sensitive. The railway is constantly battling with the shortage of staff, increasing the danger to the operation of the railway. Railways have planned to hand over 400 stations to private hands, out of which 40 stations have been handed over to private hands. This is not going well with the common citizen of the country.
