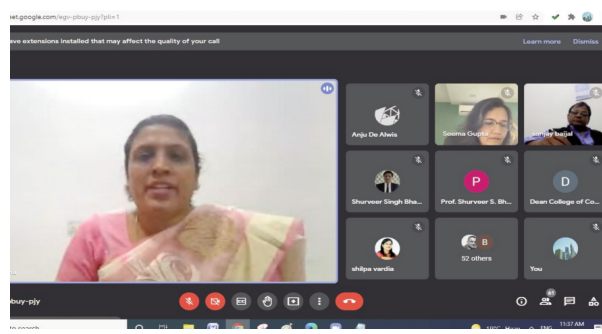


Online International Seminar on Use Cases of Blockchain Technology held

Take proper amount of calcium for better bone health - Dr. Ashish Singhal

Udaipur: With the cold weather comes additional measures of health care is required. It is often seen that as soon as the temperature drops, the problem of joint pain also starts in many older adults. In our experience, there is an increase of about 25 percent in the patients with arthritis or joint pain in winter. Also, in such a season, women have to face comparatively more issues related to bones, which can be seen to be active around the age of 35 to 40 years. In this case, it is important to pay attention to this problem and try to find the right solution.

Why there is a problem of pain in bones and joints in winter:-

According to Dr. Ashish Singhal, Consultant, Orthopedics and Joint Replacement Surgeon, Paras JK Hospital, Udaipur, the root cause of this can mostly be considered to be rheumatism or arthritis. Some of these problems may be genetic, which become more active in winter. Apart from this, blood vessels also constrict comparatively in winter, due to which blood flow is also affected, and there may be a problem in being physically active, due to which there can be additional pain in case of bone pain. Apart from this, many people have to face this condition due to neglect of nutrition and an inactive lifestyle.

The solution to this problem can be found by following the following points:-

Take proper amount of calcium and vitamin-D:- Give preference to adequate nutrition. For better bone health, consume an appropriate amount of calcium. Also, ensure the proper amount of vitamin C in food and do regular 20 minutes of physical exercise in the sun for vitamin D because vitamin D plays an essential role in absorbing calcium. For proper intake of vitamin D, take a supplement after getting tested on the advice of a doctor. Instead of eating junk food, excessive fried roast, etc., take a balanced diet.

Regular exercise:- Physical activity is significant in winter, but many people often distance themselves from it due to the weather, which is incorrect. Exercise for at least 20 minutes a day as per your physical ability and expert advice.
