Elections in Uttar Pradesh

Will the Samajwadi Party's OBC Move Upturn the Applecart?

Five States are going to polls in the next two months. The focus is however, on Uttar Pradesh. This is so because Prime Minister Narendra Modi is an MP from Varanasi and the Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath is also projected as a Prime Ministerial candidate

by the hardcore Hindutva brigade. The scenario is changing fast. Once it was felt that BJP may have to face a tough fight in Punjab but Uttar Pradesh will be an easy win for the NDA. But the Samajwadi Party has been working silently and seems to have succeeded in wooing the OBC leaders of BJP. The resignation of three ministers of Yogi government and seven other BJP MLAs from the BJP has suddenly changed the equations in Uttar Pradesh. With Indian National Congress and BSP losing ground, the direct

fight seems to be between NDA and the Samajwadi Party and its allies most of which have a strong holding in the OBCs. The polarization of OBC leaders with the Samajwadi Party has forced the state BJP leaders to state that Prime Minister Narendra Modi is the biggest BJP leader.

An analysis of the demographic structure of Uttar Pradesh can help us understand the situation clearly. The OBC constitute 40% of the population, Muslims constitute 20%, Dalits constitute 20% while the general category

constitutes the rest 20% of the population of Uttar Pradesh. The general category population is further divided into 8% Brahmins, 6% Rajputs and 6% others. Samajwadi Party has succeeded in mobilizing leaders of OBC and has also a good support of the Muslims who have been traditionally with Samajwadi Party. The latest slogan of 80% versus 20% raised by Yogi Adityanath has clearly antagonized the Muslims. This slogan has been powerfully countered by Swami Prasad Mourya's slogan of 85% versus 15% in which he

puts the Hindutva Brigade at 15%.

The elections in Uttar Pradesh are also important because it is said that one who rules UP rules the country. This is why Narendra Modi had to come to Varanasi to contest Lok Sabha election. Will this new alliance of Samajwadi Party upturn the NDA's applecart in the forthcoming elections is something to be keenly observed because this will affect the prospects of NDA led by BJP in the next Lok Sabha elections.

Plants and Wildlife in Prabhat Samgiita: Dr. Vartika's Talk in National Webinar

Fourth series of a National Webinar on Heritage sites, National Parks, Tiger Reserves, Wild Life Sanctuaries & Botanic Gardens, Zoological Parks, Museums of India- Identification, conservation and management is being organized by Govt. M.S. Golwalkar College, Rewa (M.P.) from 8th to 13th January 2022. Dr. Vartika Jain, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Botany, Govt. Meera Girls College, Udaipur was invited to deliver a talk on "A glance of Cultural abstract Man-plant relationships: Plants and Wildlife in Prabhat Samgiita" on Monday, 10th January, 2022. Chairperson of the session was Dr. Dr. Anis Ahmad Ansari, Retired Scientist E & HOD, Botanical Survey of India, CRC, Allahabad and Co-chair of the session was Dr. Prasann Mukherjee, Head, Dept of Botany, KMM College, Pakur, Jharkhand.

Dr. Vartika gave a brief introduction about Cultural-Abstract relationships existing between Man and Plants and also between Man and Animals. She explained that in such relationships, plants/animals are so much engrossed in the thoughts of the human mind that are expressed through various media, for example through music and poems, literature, paintings, sculpture, idioms and proverbs etc. Dr Vartika illustrated this with her research work done on Prabhat Samgiita which is a prolific collection of 5018 songs composed by Shri P.R. Sarkar. In Prabhat Samgiita, 83 plant species are mentioned in 1081 songs and 57 faunal species are mentioned in 755 songs. She discussed how the plants are described in the songs depicting different seasons, through their aroma or their morphological characters or through various similes and metaphors. Dr Jain told that some of the uses of plants such as the use of flowers of Albizia lebeck as earrings and flowers of Mimosa pudica as nosepin are ethno botanical uses which have been revived through these songs. She told that the linguistic beauty of Prabhat Samgiita is unparalleled as some of the very rare synonyms for plants and animals have been used for example, Khadyot for Firefly, Vaaran for Elephant, Sahkaar for Mango etc. She explained that relationships between man and plants and between man and animals have existed since time immemorial and literature is an effective tool to showcase the thoughts and feelings and to make people aware about so many aspects related to nature and its various components. The webinar was organized through Google Meet and participants from all over the world including USA have joined the virtual platform and appreciated the talk of Dr Jain. In the end, organizer of the webinar, Dr. Skand Kumar Mishra from Rewa gave thanks to Dr Vartika for giving an excellent talk on such an interesting topic and for motivating scholars to work on this newer aspect as part of Ethnobiology.

Surgeons who are new to robotic-assisted surgery will be able to access expertise from surgeons anywhere in the world, reducing the need for physical travel while maintaining a high-quality information exchange. Our continuous endeavour is to utilise the latest technological innovations in support of continuous learning for our surgeons with a potential for improving clinical outcomes." Over the past two decades, as evidenced in over 24,000 peer reviewed publications, robotic-assisted surgery with da Vinci technology has revo-

Much of the benefit that robotics brings to a surgeon is about vision, precision and control. Memorandum submitted to SDM about the Demands of the Tribal People by a Delegation of Eka Manch

Dungarpur: A delegation of the district committee of Adivasi Janadhikar Eka Manch met the SDM at Dungarpur and submitted a memorandum regarding the demands of the tribal people of the region.

The President of the district committee of the Manch Gautam Lal Damor told that the Committee has demanded the implementation of the constitutional provisions for the tribes in total. He said that the union government as well as the state government are not implementing these provisions in letter and spirit. The provisions of the V and VI schedule are not being implemented.

There is a serious lack of the facilities of health care and education in the tribal areas. The PESA and Forest Rights Act are also not being fully implemented. The committee has demanded that the lands of the tribal people should be left free of acquisition and at all if they are acquired the compensation should be six times of the DLC rate.

They also demanded withdrawal of police cases against innocents in the Kankari-Dungari case. In the memorandum it has been demanded that the government should make budget provision according to the population of the tribes in the tribal regions. The demand for Roadways Bus, free electricity up to 100 units and construction of check dams for water conservation has also been made.

"A Dialogue on Biopsychology and Microvitology in context with Meditation"

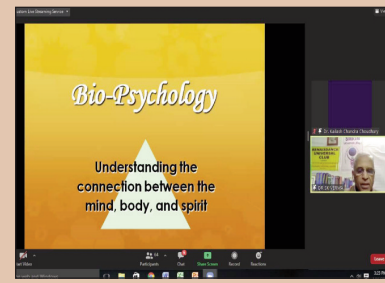
Udaipur: Society for Microvita Research and Integrated Medicine (SMRIM), and Renaissance Universal (RU), Udaipur jointly organized "A Dialogue on Biopsychology and Microvitology in Context with Meditation" on Sunday, 16th January, 2022. Program was started with Prabhat Samgiita 'Vishva Dolay Do Diyecho'. Then, the 13th volume of the official journal of SMRIM, Bulletin on Microvita Research and Integrated Medicine (BOMRIM) was virtually released. In the beginning, Dr. Kailash Choudhary introduced the various achievements of the Keynote speaker Dr. S. K. Verma, who is currently working as Professor Emeritus, Pacific Medical College and Hospitals, Udaipur.

Dr. S. K. Verma addressed the theme of the Dialogue in detail through his PPT presentation. He told that, Biopsychology is a new science given in 1987 by Shri P. R. Sarkar and tells about the relation between biology, psychology and cosmology and in individuals, it gives the connection between human propensities; their expression and control by mind, glands and hormones. Changing the biology can change the psychology and vice versa.

The best examples of this are various yogaic postures (Asanas) which act on different plexi, glands, nerves, hormones and change the propensity of different plexi leading to change in human behavior or psychology. This change in psychology and control on propensities will help in physico-psycho spiritual practice that is meditation.

Similarly, the microvita as the smallest living entity created by the cosmic mind also acts on these plexi and controls hormonal secretion. For the proper process of meditation, positive microvita should be increased in its density through engaging in good music, good literature, good thinking, good company, meditation and service. Negative microvita can also be utilized by doing social service.

In general, there should be a balance between positive and negative, individually and collectively. Presently, we are living in the era where there is dominance of negative microvita over positive microvita and producing a status of degeneration. Efforts should be made to raise the number of positive microvita for better psycho-social development. Dr Verma told, that there is an urgent need for research in this arena to solve the many problems of society in a nice way. Organizing Secretary and moderator of the Seminar, Dr. Vartika Jain said that more than 100 participants have attended the program held on Zoom platform with live streaming on YouTube from all over the country and also from Nepal and USA. She said that the Microvita concept was given by Shri Sarkar as the Presidential address of the RU platform on 31st December, 1986 and SMRIM is working to propagate Microvitology among the masses through various media and planning for organizing more such programs in future. Queries of all the participants were also resolved by Dr. Verma in the question and answer session. Program was smoothly conducted with active support of Rajesh Sharma, Bhavika Kunwar and Yash Verma. In the end, Vice President of SMRIM and the convener of the Dialogue Shri Dinesh Sharma proposed a vote of thanks to Dr. Verma, all the participants, and the entire organizing team.
