

Budget 2022 is a development based, not populist : Komal Kothari

Udaipur: "The biggest feature of this budget is the non-imposition of any new tax despite the Covid-19 pandemic and vaccination campaign."

Mr. Sanjay Singhal gave the above information in UCCI, discussed The impact of Union Budget 2022 in the Pyrotech Thompson Auditorium of the Udaipur Chamber of Commerce and Industry. In this, UCCI's Senior Vice President Shri Sanjay Singhal, Former President Shri V.P. Rath, Chairman, Finance, Taxation and Legal Sub Committee of UCCI, CA Dr. Satishchandra Jain, former Chairman of CIRC, ICAI, CA Shri Devendra Somani, CA Shri N.K. Singhvi, CA Mr. Keshav Malu participated.

Chairman Shri Komal Kothari welcomed the panel members and participants at the beginning of the program.

During the discussion on the effects of Union Budget 2022, Senior Vice President Mr. Sanjay Singhal presented an analysis of the impact of the

budget presented by the Finance Minister, Mrs. Nirmala Sitharaman, on the Indian economy. Shri Singhal said that the government intends to gradually eliminate all the subsidies necessary to improve the country's economy. He gave an example of how the elimination of L.P.G. subsidy resulted in a saving of Rs.7 thousand crores.

He gave priority to the production-linked incentive scheme among the merits of this budget and described it as very encouraging for the industries. Along with this, appreciated reforms in Public Procurement Policy, expediting the privatization process, promoting FDI, reducing the fiscal deficit, etc. Shri Singhal said that along with the budget provision for the development schemes of the country, the taxation system had been simplified and strengthened for raising revenue. The convenience of transactions will be simplified and highly secure with the blockchain system.

Shri Singhal noted that according to estimates by various national and international organizations, the country's growth rate is likely to be around 8 percent. India's economy will become the fastest growing economy in the world.

Former President Shri V.P. Rath presented an analysis of the impact of the presented budget on the MSME sector. Mr. V.P. Rath said that the MSME sector would boost infrastructure development projects. Shri Rath suggested the introduction of export promotion schemes for MSMEs to increase exports from the country. He welcomed the extension of the Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme for one year and increased funds to help MSMEs.

They chartered Accountant Shri N.K. While discussing direct taxes, Singhvi said they had made E 84 amendments in the current budget. Giving a detailed analysis of the significant modifications, Shri Singhvi said that the govern-



ment needs to clarify the definition of virtual digital assets. The government has changed the tax rules to reduce corruption by tightening the trusts and N.G.O.s. Therefore, he suggests that all non-government organizations and trusts keep their books of account correct while following the rules. He appreciated giving relief on the corporate tax rate and surcharge.

Chartered Accountant Mr. Keshav Malu informed that the cases of fake input tax credit cases have increased in the last two to three years. Attempts

have been made to curb this. Shri Malu presented a detailed analysis of indirect tax provisions in the presented budget. He also highlighted some complexities in the new system of G.S.T., in which now the buyer has been made responsible, and the supplier suggested submitting a memorandum to the government regarding such circumstances.

Chartered Accountant Shri Devendra Somani gave information about the budget's impact on the capital market. He also explained various tips to save tax. Mr. Somani sug-

gested the participants diversify the business risk by investing their money in other businesses. He said that taking timely advisory services in taxation and investing in the capital market would prove helpful.

About 75 entrepreneurs, people in business, and representatives of chartered accountant firms participated in the discussion.

The program was conducted by the Chairman of Finance, Taxation and Legal Sub Committee of UCCI, CA, Dr. Satishchandra Jain.

Major Jhala of Udaipur (who killed 14 terrorists) honored

Udaipur: Bharatsinh Jhala, originally a resident of Jhala ka Guda in Kailashpuri, killed 14 terrorists in 7 operations against terrorists in different country areas, including Kashmir, during his 12 years of service in the Army, was honored at a function organized at Hotel Bombay House by Rotary Club. Surya

Major Jhala of Rashtriya Rifle Unit 34 has received two army medals for the remarkable work done in the interest of the country during his 12 years of service. He received a letter of appreciation in Manipur for working in the North-Eastern region for two and a half years. This type of honor gives the inspiration to work for the country. Before joining the Army in the year 2009, there was a desire to become a pilot, but the future turned to the Army and got a permanent commission in the Army.

He did seven operations in different areas during his two and a half years of service in Kashmir. During this, 14 terrorists were killed, including the Lashkar commander's killing with a hand grenade. Some people still support Pakistan and terrorists in Kashmir, while some excellent people give intelligence.

Major Jhala, who is currently serving in the NSG, said that when I joined the Army, the family was scared, but my fear also ended when I did operations in Kashmir.

Major Jhala said that the youth who join the Army would first have to take admission in NCC, Sainik School, Military School, RIMC. Children below the age of 45 years can join the Territorial Army.

On this occasion, Major Jhala's wife, Ritu Jhala, said that during the last 12 years, she narrated the memories associated with Major Jhala.

In the beginning, club president Puneet Saxena welcomed everyone and said that the country's flag was waving only because of the soldiers' breath. Behind this, there is a significant contribution of the soldier's family members.

In the function, club president Puneet Saxena secretary Vikrant Shakhdihi honored Major Jhala by garlanding him, giving memento and citation. Many members, including Ritu Jhala, Narendra Verma, Shahid Hussain, Ravi Dhaibhai, and Dhiraj Joshi, were present. Nidhi Saxena conducted the program. In the end, Vikrant Shakhdihi proposed a vote of thanks.

Doctors of PMCH gave new life to the person by adding the severed claws

Hospital Bedla, Udaipur, and his team gave new life to the young man by re-joining the claws of his severed hand.

In this successful surgery, which lasted for 8 hours, Dr. Gurubhushan of the Department of Burn and Plastic Surgery, Dr. Vinod Nagar, Orthopedic Surgeon, Dr. Ashish Batra, Dr. Prakash Audichya of the Department of Anesthesia, Dr. Ravindran, Dr. Nishi, Dr. Devarajan, Dr., The team of. Panth, Dr. Harsh, Subhash, Lalit, Manoj, and

Dinesh had the support.

Burn and plastic surgeon Dr. Gurubhushan said that a sharp weapon cut off the claw of a 56-year-old man during the beating. After the accident, the person's family members gathered courage and, within an hour and a half, carrying a chopped paw in a plastic bag filled with ice, reached the emergency of PMCH Bedla Hospital. Upon reaching the hospital, the patient has immediately transferred to the operation theater for emergency re-

implant surgery. On the other hand, the other team took the severed claws and took them to the OT. All the hand's essential structures, i.e., bone, tendon (nerve), artery, and nerve, were identified here.

Dr. Gurubhushan said that the operation lasted for about 8 hours, where the team of orthopedic doctors repaired the bone, and the plastic surgical team repaired the vascular, nerves, and artery. It was a particularly challenging task for the anesthesia team. Who

monitored the patient and ensured that his pulse remained stable throughout the surgery. After the operation, the patient was shifted to the medical ICU, where the team of doctors continuously monitored the hand and patient. When the condition of the hand was stable shifted, the patient was shifted out of the ICU to the ward. The patient is excellent now. The family members thanked PMCH Chairman Rahul Agarwal, doctors, and staff.

Along with this, one inch of his feet had also become shorter. On this, his hip transplant was done. According to Dr. Suryakant Purohit, the patient was moved the next day after the operation, and he got relief from the earlier pain. Dr. Suryakant Purohit and Dr. Saurabh Agarwal, Dr. Prashant, Dr. Anil, and Dr. Piyush Garg from the Department of Anesthesia were present in this team.
