Successful treatment of an only 4-year-old child by PDA device closure

made him disease-free. Dr. Danny said that the child had a heart operation at the age of 4, in which the hole in his heart was closed and the abnormal wall inside the heart was removed. When the patient came to Geetanjali Cardiac Center, her heart pumping was weak, and there was a hole left that was straining the heart, it was decided by the cardiac team to close the hole. PDA device closure is a procedure that is usually performed by cardiologists,

but this child has had an earlier operation due to which the structure of the heart has been rotated (rotate anatomy), due to which there were complications in the procedure.

Dr. Danny also explained that this procedure was challenging because the patient's heart was previously operated on due to excessive rotation and coronary sinus, making both finding and closing the hole very difficult, despite the skilled team of doctors. The hole was successfully completed through the leg vein; the patient is now healthy.

Welcomed decision not to allow boats to hotels by road

Udaipur: Lake lovers, has welcomed the conclusion of the Municipal Corporation not to allow ships to hotels by road. At the same time, it is also requested to cancel the permissions of speed boats, motorboats, and regular maintenance of sewerage lines in the lake area.

In the lake dialogue held on Sunday, Dr. Anil Mehta, a member of the Lake Conservation Committee, said that more boats are plying in the lakes than their tolerable capacity. Unauthorized jetties remain, which are being used commercially as restaurants. The corporation's decision will give relief to the lakes from these shocks.

Tej Shankar Paliwal, a member of the heel Sanrakshan Samiti, said that sewerage maintenance in the lake area would be prioritized. The sewer line central hole on Amba Mata road has been jammed for ten days. Even after a lot of effort, the corporation workers were not successful in correcting this main sewer hole; then, this work was given to L&T Company. Due to the slowing down of L&T company, sewage is going into the lake, spreading on the road. Paliwal said that the corporation should direct L&T to resolve the problem quickly.

Nand Kishore Sharma, director of Gandhi Manav Kalyan Samiti, said that the corporation should have a separate team and a fixed in-charge officer to maintain the sewerage lines of the lake area. In addition, the maintenance team should have modern equipment and machines.

Environment lover Digambar Singh said that the corporation should also cancel the permission of the cruise.

Trouble in breathing cured

Udaipur: The patient who arrived in this condition was cured while undergoing treatment at GBH General Hospital. The patient started having difficulty breathing due to the infection wisdom tooth. When the patient reached the hospital, he was corona positive, but because of their condition and the severity of the disease, the doctors gave priority to treatment.

Group Director Dr. Anand Jha said that Rajkumar Goyal, a resident of Neemuch, was having trouble breathing in the past. The family took him to GBH General Hospital in Bedwas. he met a dental specialist. Dr. Vardan told Maheshwari that the infection had spread in his wisdom tooth and reached the throat. Because of this, his breathing tube was blocked. On examination here, it was found that the patient is corona positive, but his condition remains critical due to throat closure. If immediate relief is not given to them, it may even cost their lives.

Both the patient's kidneys are also deficient and have to do dialysis every other day. He is also a cardiac patient, from whom he is also on medication to thin his blood. Given all these circumstances, Dr. Vardan Maheshwari, Monika Bhardwaj, Kidney Specialist Dr. Neeraj Nirala's team started his treatment. He provided immediate relief by making a new way of breathing by piercing his throat. After this, about three liters of pus was removed from the infected part up to his throat and the continuous dressing was done, and dialysis was also continued. Now the patients became corona negative, and they were cured and discharged. Dr. Vardan Maheshwari's team with Dr. Monika Bhardwaj, Kidney Specialist Dr. Neeraj Nirala, Kamlesh, and Prakash were present.
