

## Encouraging electric vehicles in the city

**Udaipur:** District Collector Tarachand Meena has taken the initiative in the direction of getting rid of the pollution caused by petrol and diesel vehicles to the tourists and local residents of Lake City Udaipur, a favorite place of tourists around the world, and 37 for charging electric vehicles in the city. DM Decided to set up the station. In this regard, District Collector Meena took a necessary meeting with UIT Secretary Arun Hasija, Municipal Corporation Commissioner Himmathsinh Barath, Rajasthan Electronics and Instruments Limited (RIL), Deputy General Manager Rupesh Chawla, and other officials, who set up an elec-

tric vehicle charging station. DM Gave instructions.

**MoU will be signed between UIT and RIL:**

During the meeting, Collector Meena directed the concerned officers to prepare the MoU draft at the earliest for signing the MoU between UIT and RIL. Similarly, for setting up charging stations in multi-story buildings, the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Government of India, asked to send a proposal to the Chief City Planner, Jaipur, to implement the amendments issued in the Model Building Bylaws-2016. Along with this, the officials of AVVNL and REIL were instructed to select the location for four charging



stations for providing electricity connection at the charging stations.

**33 places fixed for charging station:**

It was informed during the meeting that 37 charging points

would be set up for electric vehicles in the city where the vehicles would be charged at the rates approved by the Central Government.

At present, 20 charging points will be installed at 14

places under the jurisdiction of UIT in 33 designated places, while 13 points will be installed at 13 places in the Municipal Corporation area. The remaining four places are yet to be selected. BL Kothari of UIT said

that there would be double charging points at six places in UIT, one for slow charging and one for fast charging.

**Currently, this is the situation:**

District Collector Tarachand Meena said that only nominal electric vehicles are being run in the city. They need to be encouraged so that the residents and tourists can be freed from air pollution.

He said that at present, a total of 881 Electric Vehicles are registered in the Transport Department, out of which 620 Two Wheelers, 122 Three Wheelers (E-Rickshaws), 94 Three Wheelers (E-Carts) and 45 LMVs (Light Motor Vehicles) are registered.

## ICDS commissioner took a review meeting of departmental officers

**Udaipur:** Under the chairmanship of Commissioner of Integrated Child Development Services Rajasthan, Urmila Rajoria, Udaipur, a departmental review meeting of child development project officers of the district was held at Circuit House Udaipur.

During the discussion regarding the control of anemia in the district, the Commissioner directed that the Child Development Project Officer conduct blood tests of children and adolescent girls at 5 Anganwadi centers per project and submit the report so that the status of anemia in the district can be observed. She gave instructions to ensure compliance with the newly issued guidelines for fixation of rent of Anganwadi centers operated in rent.

The Commissioner said that children enrolled for registered Divyang and Palanhar, among them eligible children, should also benefit from Anganwadi centers. During the discussion on minorities, she directed the child development project officers to take action according to the newly issued circular of the 15-point program. During the discussion on the Udaan scheme, instructions were given to keep the record of the supply of sanitary napkins organized by the Anganwadi workers, from the record worker to the companion online.

Commissioner Rajouri also discussed the continuous inspection of Nandghar, Nutri Garden, and Anganwadi centers operating in the district. While discussing the awareness of nutrition in the section removing malnutrition, instructions were given to conduct a survey for identification of malnutrition in 15 days. After getting information regarding the construction of the building from the Panchayati Raj Department, instructions were given to complete the progressing works at the earliest.

The Food and Civil Supplies Corporation Limited gave instructions for a regular supply of nutrition from Udaipur and for effective monitoring by the ration dealer to provide nourishment to the Anganwadi worker on time. After receiving information regarding the acceptance of drinking water at Anganwadi centers, instructions were given. She emphasized on effective implementation of Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana. All the child development project officers of the district, personal assistant Hariprasad Ameta, district project coordinator PMMVY Lokesh Krishnawat, etc were present in the meeting along with Pankaj Kumar Dwivedi, Deputy Director of Women and Child Development.
