In the camp of National Service Scheme on Water Conservation, which was held in the workshop of College of Dairy Food Technology, Dr. P.C. Jain asked how water can be saved throughout the day, for this, that there is a change in our water-spending habits—not running timing tap, proper use of RO system, etc. We can save water regularly and save it from wastage by doing this, like using soap instead of shampoo, cleaning utensils with lemon ash soap instead of liquid detergent, cleaning vehicles with a wet cloth, and brushing shaving. TDS Check App - By checking the TDS of water brought by the students, he said that 300 to 400 is the best, and the waste-water of RO can be used in a latrine.
