Director Extension Education, Udaipur, Dr. R.A. Kaushik, while welcoming the guests and the farmers present in the beginning, while congratulating everyone on the holy festival of Holi, said that the Directorate of Extension Education, Madhya Pradesh University, Udaipur is always ready for the upliftment of the farmers, even before that for the upliftment of the village. Also, in the program, he said that making full use of unconventional solar equipment improves health and saves time and labor. Labor-intensive tools, sewing machines, training for self-employment, small tools, etc., were also distributed.
