Team GBH saved a girl injured in an accident



Udaipur: The girl was brought here in a serious condition. The girl injured in the accident was treated safely by the board of doctors at GBH American Hospital.

Agirl resident of Banswara had an accident recently. The girl was seriously injured in this. In this accident, she had severe injuries in her stomach and ribs. There was a fracture in the joint between the spine and the hip. The arm vein was cut and the urinary tract was injured. Amidst all these injuries, the hemoglobin of the injured girl was only four grams. It was difficult to save the girl who was brought unconscious.

Group Director Dr. Anand Jha said that for the treatment of the girl who reached this critical condition, a board of doctors was formed, in which orthopedic and joint replacement surgeon Dr. Rahul Khanna, Neuro Surgeon Dr. Nitin Bhakal, General Surgeon Dr. Rajesh Agarwal, along with plastic surgeon Dr. Vimal Mittal, ICU intensivist Dr. Satyanarayan Nagar was formed. The first saved her life by giving CPR to the girl and started treatment by keeping her under ICU care. After this, the joint rupture between the spine and the hip bone is treated, which is medically called sacroiliac joint distension. She was operated upon with a neuro-monitoring device, saving the nerves safely. Apart from this, the cut veins of the girl bleeding in the stomach were stopped. This girl was discharged on Monday while in a moving condition with the help of a walker.

Indian Institute of Science (IISc) inks MoU with Ajit and Sarah Isaac

Mumbai: The Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru, entered into a MoU with Mr Ajit Isaac, Founder and Chairman of Quess Corp, and Mrs Sarah Isaac, for establishing a Centre for Public Health at the IISc campus. Mr and Mrs Isaac have committed a sum of INR 105 crore

towards setting up this Centre, which will be called the Isaac Centre for Public Health (ICPH), and will be a part of the postgraduate Medical School, soon to be established on campus. The Centre will be operational by 2024 and is expected to encourage aspirants to pursue careers in clinical research to develop new treatments and healthcare solutions driven by a bench-to-bedside philosophy.

The Centre is poised to create world-class post-graduate education and research programmes in public health to redefine healthcare models for India and for the rest of the world. It will offer dual degree programmes such as Master of Public Health (MPH)-PhD (5-6 years) and Master of Public Health (MPH)-MTech Research (3 years). The total annual student intake will be about 10 per year with a steady-state student population of about 40 over time. The Centre will also host state-of-the-art biomedical research computing infrastructure to host the data, develop and test big data analysis methods tailored for public health.

A patient suffering from diaphragm disease was cured by surgery

What was the issue - The patient said that he was suffering from problems like abdominal pain, weakness, etc., so he showed up at a private hospital in Ahmedabad for the last few months, but there was no improvement in the situation. A close friend advised me to go to Geetanjali Hospital Udaipur. On coming here, when the patient was questioned, he said that he was taking pain killers and drugs in large quantities to reduce the pain in his stomach for a long time. When Dr. Dhaval Vyas did the patient's endoscopy, it was found that the patient had three blockages in the D1 (first) and D3 (last) part of the small intestine (duodenum).
