Udaipur: The climate of the biodiversity-rich Lake City Udaipur is now pleasing to the wildlife. The latest example of this is the Biological Park located in the foothills of Sajjangarh in the city. For the first time, Indian Wolf has given birth to 5 children, which are entirely healthy.

Dr. Ajit Unchoi, in charge of Sajjangarh Biological Park and Deputy Conservator of Forests (Wildlife), said that a pair of Indian wolves were brought to the Bio Park at Arigana Anna Zoological Park, Chennai, on February 22, 2021. In this, the age of males was two years six months, and that of females was three years two months, which was kept in the display area of Bio Park. After mating, for the first time in the history of Udaipur, this Indian wolf has given birth to 5 children, which are completely healthy. He said that Indian wolf had never grown in Gulababagh Zoo even before this. The Bio-Park family has a wave of happiness due to the wolf's genealogy after coming to Bio Park's climate.

Elaborate security arrangements:

Dr. Unchoi informed that senior veterinary officers, head caretakers, and staff had been deployed for the safety of newborns. It is being fully taken care of. Dr. Hansraj of Biopark has told that separate enclosures and cages have been arranged for wolf cubs, and a detached small house has also been prepared in which they can be completely safe and their health by giving necessary attention. After growing up, all the children will be released together in the display area for the tourists to see, seeing which the tourists will be thrilled and will be happy to see the wolf and their children in the flock.
