

MPUAT Farm Machinery Testing Center sets new record



Udaipur: Farm Machinery Testing Center at Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur, has developed a new record in this financial year 2021-22 by collecting revenue of Rs 1.25 crore from testing of agricultural machines.

This test center is located in the Farm Machinery Department of the College of Technology and Engineering.

The machines manufactured by agricultural machinery manufacturers are tested and issued their test certificates.

During the "Revenue Generation Augmentation Program" organized by the Revenue Generation Cell of the University, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Professor Narendra Singh Rathore, told that this testing center was established by the Government

of India in the year 2011, with the main objective of developing Rajasthan and other states of the country, to issue test certificates of agricultural machines manufactured by agricultural machinery manufacturers.

The government subsidizes the farmers on only those machines that have a test certificate issued from a recognized institute.

Dr. SK Sharma, Director of Research of the University, said that 97 agricultural machines from Rajasthan, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, and Maharashtra come to us for certification. Certification is also necessary to properly assess the quality, safety parameters, and working efficiency of the manufactured equipment.

Dr. PK Singh, Dean of the

College and President of Revenue Generation Cell, said that 97 agricultural machines had come for testing this year, in which Thresher, MB Plow, Cultivator, Rotavator, Land Leveler Kutti Machine, etc. are prominent.

During the program, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Dr. Sanwal Singh Meena, Head of the Department of Farm

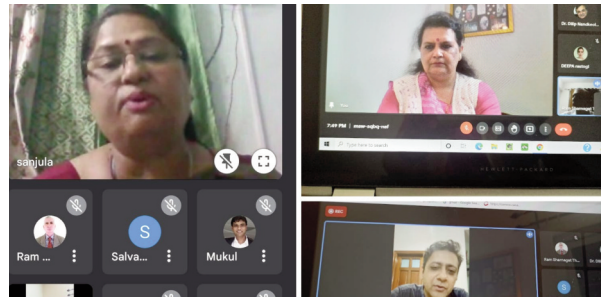
