Grand launch of the Pacific Premier League

Former Indian cricketer Chetan Sharma inaugurated

Run Yudd will last for 12 days

Udaipur: The popular cricket competition PPL, which started at the local level and became a national identity, has begun on Saturday. It was ceremonially inaugurated on the eve of the competition by former Indian cricketer Chetan Sharma and Lakshyaraj Singh Mewar of Mewar royal family. Rajasthan Cricket Association Secretary Mahendra Sharma, Pacific Medical University's Founder Rahul Agarwal, Wonder Cement's Vice President Siddharth Singhvi, Sponsor GS Sports' Govind Khandelwal, Pacific University's Registrar Sharad Kothari and PPL Founder Aman Agarwal in the Organizing Committee as guests on the occasion. Co-Founder Manoj Choudhary, Commissioner Dr. Prakash Jain, Organizing Secretary Yashwant Paliwal and Udaipur Cricket Association President Manoj Bhatnagar were present. Players and Franchisees also participated in the opening ceremony of the fourth season of the Pacific Premier League and interacted with Chetan Sharma, all the matches of the competition are being telecast live on four cameras similar to national level competitions. This time special prizes have been kept for the spectators of the competition, in which a prize of one thousand rupees is being given for the ball being caught outside the boundary for sixes.

On the occasion of the inauguration, former Indian cricketer Chetan Sharma said that cricket is more like a festival than a game, which is associated with

the feelings of every player. At the same time, he said that players like Mahendra Singh Dhoni, Hardik Pandya, Umran Malik have gained fame on the world stage due to the local level competitions being held in the country. Having a national level tournament in a city like Udaipur will provide a bigger platform to the players.

In the program, Lakshyaraj Singh Mewar of Mewar royal family said that they are seeing the level of competition going up to the heights since last three seasons.

Mahendra Sharma, Secretary, Rajasthan Cricket Association said that RCA is happy that the level of the game is going up high by organizing a cricket competition like PPL. Local players are getting the opportunity to play with state and national level players. PPL Founder Aman Agarwal said that the purpose of organizing PPL is to provide a platform to bring forward the talent of rural areas so that they can move forward after proper training and guidance. He also said that matches will be played between eight teams for 12 days. International level players like Ajay Jadeja, Munaf Patel and Stuart Binny have come in PPL to encourage the players. Pacific Medical University Founder Rahul Agarwal said that PPL is a mini IPL in which such players have got an opportunity to showcase their talent, who do not get the opportunity to



play anywhere else.

Sharad Kothari, Registrar, Pacific University said that the pitch, umpires, balls and grounds in the competition are as per the prescribed norms, so that the players and spectators will enjoy the national level competitions

PPL co-founder Manoj Choudhary said that the matches of the competition will be of 20 overs, along with India, players from USA, Sri Lanka, Canada and Nepal are participating in the PPL. The success of PPL is "certified" by the fact that the players who have played here have played at the state level and 3 players have also gone to India camp. There is a plan to make PPL at the level of IPF in future.

PPL Commissioner Dr. Prakash Jain told that each team will have to play seven matches in the tournament and the team will reach the final through play-off. It is an indicator of growth.

PPL Organizing Secretary Yashwant Paliwal said that PPL matches are being played with colored clothes and white ball.

Approval of Rs 12 crore issued by government for Modal Rani Road

Udaipur: Chief Minister's Budget/Announcement "Works for renovation and beautification of Nehru Park, Rani-Road located in Fatehsagar" are being to be done for the convenience and attraction of the tourists. Approval of Rs 12 crore has been issued by the state government to develop Rani Road as a model.

UIT President and District Collector Tarachand Meena informed that DPR was prepared by Indian Institute of Architects, Udaipur sub-division, as a pilot stretch by the Urban Development Trust, Udaipur, to develop Rani Road located in the Fatehsagar Lake peripheral as a model road. The work was prepared by the

team of the local architects of the center so that the work could be proposed according to the convenience of the general public of Udaipur and the tourists visiting Udaipur throughout the year.

UIT Secretary Balmukund Asawa informed that a detailed proposal with drawing and design was prepared by the team of Architects, Udaipur sub-division, as a pilot stretch by the Urban Development Trust, Udaipur, to develop Rani Road located in the Fatehsagar Lake peripheral as a model road. The work was prepared by the

been proposed on the other side of the lake with the support of hills. The work of pilot stretch has been approved at the trust level and work order has been issued and work has been started on the spot.

Administrative and financial approval of Rs 12 crore has been given by the state government to develop Rani Road as a model road. After getting the approval from the state government, now after the technical approval of the work by the Urban Development Trust, Udaipur, tender action will be taken soon.

Bird Park built at a

cost of 11.49 crores:

This attractive bird park has been jointly constructed by the Tourism Department, Forest Department, Municipal Corporation and UIT at a cost of about Rs 11.50 crore. The construction work has been done by RSRDC Ltd. A bird park has been constructed in 3.85 hectares of Gulab Bagh, spread over an area of about 5.11 hectares. Tourism Department has given 8 crores, Municipal Corporation 1.75 crores, UIT 1.74 crores for this park.

Gulab Bagh was established in 1878:

It is noteworthy that the Gulab Bagh zoo was established in 1878 by the then Mewar ruler Maharana Sajjan Singh. This zoo was the sixth oldest zoo in India. It was established as Sajjanniwas Bagh, which is today known as Gulab Bagh.

All the wildlife of the zoo was shifted to the Sajjanganarh Biological Park created in the year 2015.
