In the meeting, increase the grant amount of ten thousand to at least fifty thousand rupees, increase the loan limit for simplification of loans and implementation of new schemes, increase the additional budget amount, and fill the vacant posts at the district and headquarters at the earliest. In the meeting, SC Commission President Bairwa, after reviewing the department-wise cases through memorandums, directed the officers for disposal and asked the officers to hold public hearings in their offices regularly so that the problems of maximum people could be resolved. He also requested the LDM give timely loans to the Scheduled Caste applicants for the establishment of industries and to remove the bottlenecks. In the meeting, he reviewed the works related to police, rural development, municipal bodies, enterprises, labor department, education, livelihood, etc.
