Bird count held in City Palace before World Environment Day

Udaipur: Arun Soni, Officer-in-Charge of WWF-India, said that Bird Census (Bird Count) was organized at City Palace by WWF India Udaipur Divisional Office and Maharana Mewar Charitable Foundation in which the famous ornithologist of the city retired from the Forest Department. Dr. Satish Sharma, bird lover Vinay Dave, wildlife photography expert Sharad Agarwal, Deepal Kalra, bird researcher Kanishka Mehta and Hitesh Ameta, Alok Upadhyay, Niramay Upadhyay, Nischal Shrimali, Devendra Shrimali, Purva Bhatia from Maharana Mewar Charitable Foundation, etc. collectively in bird census. And recorded 45 different species of birds. With 300 birds were sighted during the census. During the reckoning, a dog fight of Black Kite was also seen, which was a big thrill for everyone, in which both were seen fighting for their place and territory. Simultaneously, a Greater Indian bird fruit bet was rescued by Vinay Dave and again released safely on the tree. Apart from Black Kite, White Rumped Swallow, Dusky Craig Martin, Indian Gray Hornbill, Yellow-footed Pigeon (Hariyal), Shikra, Indian Golden Oriole, Common Iora, Tony Belled Babbler, Great Cormorant, Indian Cormorant, Indian Pitta (Navarang - Monsoon Breeder/ Migrant), Knob Build Duck (Nakata), Purple Sunbird, among many other species. At the same time, Dr. Satish Sharma said that last year in February 2021, when birds were counted in the City Palace, 32 species of birds were recorded; on the contrary, today, June 2022, again during summer at the same place and route. In which 45 types of bird species were found, this is a perfect sign for the environment and it can also be seen that there is diversity in the appearance of the species according to the season.

Dr. Shanti Kumar Sharma, Director of Research, said that to save the Earth, the hour needs to keep our balance between the Panch Mahabhutas (water, land, fire, air, and space). If the work of human and science development disturbs the balance of the five significant elements, then these techniques are not favorable for us.
