



5th road show organized for Rajasthan Domestic Travel Mart

Udaipur: There is immense potential for investment in the tourism sector in Rajasthan. This is mainly due to the steady increase in the number of tourists to the state, accounting for 75 percent of the heritage hotels in India, the sixth place in foreign tourist arrivals and 10th in domestic tourist arrivals, setting up of a tourism development fund of Rs 1000 crore. This is due to

a significant emphasis on marketing, branding, infrastructure development, etc. This was stated by Gayatri Rathod, Principal Secretary, Tourism.

She addressed the Tourism and Hospitality Fraternity at the 5th Pre-Event Roadshow at Durbar Hall, City Palace, Udaipur. This promotional roadshow was organized for the upcoming Rajasthan Domestic Travel Mart (RDTM) 2022. It was jointly organized by the Department of Tourism and the Federation of Hospitality and Tourism in Rajasthan (FHTR).

Singh Mewar; Chairman, FHTR, Mr. Apoorva Kumar, Senior Vice President, FHTR, Shri Kuldeep Singh Chandel, Vice President, FHTR, Shri Surendra Singh and others attended. Many potential buyers and sellers of RDTM also participated in the roadshow.

Gayatri Rathod further said that with the announcement of industry status for the tourism and hospitality sector in the Budget for 2022-2023, this sector is eligible for all industrial tariffs and levies. As defined in the Rajasthan Tourism Unit Policy 2015, all tourism units are eligible for these industry benefits. Online Entitlement Certification is also being done. So far, more than



560 applications have been received in this regard, and 200 certificates have been issued. Similarly, the Energy Department and JVVNL, JVVNL, and AVVNL have given orders to levy industrial duty on electricity from tourism units, and the LSG department

has issued orders to charge UD tax on industrial rates.

Divisional Commissioner Shri Rajendra Bhatt said that Udaipur city and other division districts are also rich. He informed about the efforts being made by the state government for tourism develop-

ment in Banswara, popularly known as the City of Hundred Islands. He said that the tourism sector contributes 14 percent to the state's GDP.

District Collector Shri Tara Chand Meena said that the rural areas of the district have better sites than Udaipur city, so there is a need to promote rural and tribal tourism. He also informed about the decision to organize the Tribal Festival on World Tribal Day and called upon the Tourism Department to encourage it.

Former royal family member and tourism advisor to Governor Lakshyaraj Singh Mewar said that three hotels in Udaipur are the best in the world. With this, the time has

come that Udaipur should not be called the Venice of the East, and on the contrary, Venice should say that we are the West of Udaipur. Mr. Apoorva Kumar, Chairman of FHTR, said that the industry is poised for recovery and revival after battling the prolonged COVID pandemic. This can only be possible with strong public-private partnerships and support. For this purpose, significant events like Jaipur Literature Festival, Rajasthan Day, etc., have already been organized in Pink City. Continuing this journey of promoting Rajasthan, the second edition of Rajasthan Domestic Travel Mart is being organized in Jaipur next month.

Roadshows have been successfully organized in cities like Jaipur, Mandawa, Jodhpur, and Bharatpur to promote it before the advent of RDTM. With a greater emphasis on domestic tourism, RDTM 2022 will celebrate all aspects of Rajasthan, representing the tourism industry and the state's potential and promoting sustainable, inclusive growth of Rajasthan. Earlier the welcome address was given by the Honorary General Secretary, FHTR, Mr. Mohan Singh Mertia. Mr. Kuldeep Singh Chandel gave the valedictory address, Senior Vice President, FHTR, and Mr. Surendra Singh, Vice President, FHTR.

Chief Minister appealed not to close the cities

Jaipur: Chief Minister Shri Ashok Gehlot appealed to the representatives of all political parties and the state's people to cooperate in maintaining peace. He said that Rajasthan had been in a state of communal harmony and peace. It is the critical responsibility of all of us to keep the glorious common tradition here. He said that the Udaipur incident was not a religious incident but a terrorist incident. The strings of criminals have been found from international organizations involved in illegal activities. The criminals will be punished harshly by the state government without delay. We all should unite and condemn such incidents peacefully.

Shri Gehlot was addressing an all-party meeting held at the Chief Minister's residence on Wednesday evening. He said that in a tense atmosphere, parties should make efforts to maintain peace and brotherhood in the society by leaving political ideology.

The Chief Minister said that even during the Corona period, all the parties had tried to come together and fight the



grave situation. Religious leaders, political parties, various social organizations, and the general public cooperated. He said that today again, we must come forward together in the same way and fight the criminals who spread fear and terror. The common man need not be afraid of criminals and threats; the state government stands with them in every situation.

Mr. Gehlot said that the National Investigation Agency (NIA) had registered a case. Rajasthan SOG and ATS will fully cooperate in the investigation. The Rajasthan Police said the police team had set an example by making quick arrests. He condemned the incident of assault with the policeman in Bhim.

The Chief Minister assured the people that just as the criminals were punished by taking prompt action in many cases of the POCSO Act, similarly strict action would be taken in Udaipur and other issues. He said that the entire state is standing with the family of the deceased Shri Kanhaiyalal. Financial assistance of Rs 50 lakh will be provided to the dependent family.

Rajasthan is becoming an example of maintaining peace.

Rajasthan Assembly Speaker Dr. C.P. Joshi said that the representatives of the parties should give a message to their booth-level workers to maintain peace. We all should set the example of Rajasthan in the country by maintaining stability. He suggested pre-

The incident is not relat-

This is the first time such an incident has happened in the state. It is the political parties' responsibility to communicate solidarity with the state government in such a situation.

CPI(M) representative Shri Balwan Poonia said the party strongly condemns such terrorist acts. Strict action should be taken against those who try to crush the Constitution.

cooperation of all parties

Bharatiya Janata Party representative and former minister Shri Arun Chaturvedi said that the Rajasthan Police had immediately arrested the criminals. The government should make Rajasthan a model state by punishing them at the earliest. Only then will the crime stop in the state. There will be cooperation of all parties in this. MLA Mr. Sanyam Lodha said that soon after the incident, the

government constituted the SIT. Thanking the Rajasthan Police, he said that we must stop the incidents' origin. He appealed to spread the message of brotherhood on social media. MLA Shri Rajkumar Gaur strongly condemned the matter and thanked the Rajasthan Police team. He said peace remained in the state on the second DayDay of the incident. In the future, we must maintain peace while fulfilling our responsibility.

It is everyone's responsibility to stop the communal frenzy. Representative of Kisan Mahapanchayat Shri Rampal Jat said that such incidents are a big challenge for the entire country.

In such a situation, we must stop the communal frenzy arising out of them. There should be fear of punishment among criminals. MLA from Bharatiya Janata Party, Shri Ram Lal Sharma, appealed to the state's people to post on social media about maintaining harmony instead of anger. He said that the entitled should get justice, and the guilty should be punished.

TAD commissioner gave instructions in the state-level meeting

Udaipur: A virtual meeting of the principals of the residential school and the superintendent of the ashram hostels was held under the chairmanship of Tribal Regional Development Commissioner Rajendra Bhatt, run by the Tribal Regional Development Department Udaipur.

In the meeting, the Divisional Commissioner emphasized various programs and innovations to improve the quality of education in the coming session. He instructed to make the schools of tribal areas hi-tech through technological innovation and state-of-the-art facilities and to make the education system effective through e-content.

He said schools and hostels would be given a 5-star rating based on various parameters. In which 100% enrollment, last session's board exam results, literary and cultural activities, regular sports, e-content learning, effective prayer meetings, better Use of laboratories, teaching through computer and intelligent classes, campus beautification, environmental protection and Use of reading room and the library will be a routine basis. Instructions were given to ensure 100% enrollment in schools and hostels.

Additional Commissioner Govind Singh Ranawat directed that on July 1, the students should be welcomed with tilak, and from July 2, regular teaching work should be started. He said that EMRS Simalwada, Patan, Niwai, residential schools, Sagwada, Nayagaon Mahwa, Kishanganj, and Ramgarh schools, along with the Principal and warden who gave the best results in art class and class 10, would be felicitated as well as subject teachers.

He said that the monthly syllabus had been divided to ensure continuous evaluation of students for the upcoming session and monthly examinations. To make the teaching effective, a uniform timetable will be prepared from which a panel will be ready to teach the model lesson by different experts. One hundred sixty smart class devices have been installed in 123 schools and hostels. Schools and hostels will have to submit a demand to assess the need for minor repairs and maintenance.

He instructed the principals to make an annual action plan for homework inspection of students and class teaching. From July, alternative educational arrangements will be made for various vacant posts under Vidya Sambal Yojana to bring continuity to the education system for the students. In this session, literary, cultural, and expression capacity enhancement sports competitions and Van Mahotsav will be organized.

All wardens were instructed to ensure the quality of food and accommodation arrangements. The Joint Director of IT Cell, Giriraj Kataria, informed about uploading the information of various modules of the Hostel School Management System Portal and creating a mobile app for monitoring. Officer-in-Charge Buddhisagar Upadhyay gave instructions on alternative arrangements and the cent percent enrollment process under Vidya Sambal Scheme on staff vacancies. Deputy Director Education Kailash Chandra Koli suggested the upgradation of examination results. Senior Education Advisor Subhash Sharma proposed a vote of thanks.

In Social Science, the most increased effects were 95 while 30 students got distinction, and in English, the highest marks were 96, and 36 students got distinction marks.

Unchi Udaan started in 2017 as an innovation in education by Hindustan Zinc with technical partner Resonance and host partner Vidya Bhavan. Its purpose is to bring forward those meritorious students studying in government schools who are deprived of higher education due to a lack of proper guidance and resources. Under this, deserving students from 6 districts of the company's area of work, from Udaipur, Rajasamand, Chittor, Bhilwara, Ajmer, and Pantnagar of Uttarakhand, whose minimum marks are selected based on percent-

Successful surgery of a patient suffering from acute necrotizing pancreatitis

Udaipur: life was there, but due to pain moment by moment, life was being lost due to which it became difficult to live, but as soon as Dr. From within, he started praying to the person in the form of God, who created the spir-

it of living life again in his mind.

Pacific Medical College and Hospital gave a new life to the patient through the successful operation of a patient suffering from the problem of acute pancreatitis. In this successful operation, the team of Gastrosurgeon Dr. Vikesh Joshi, Dr. Prakash Audichya of the Anesthesia Department, Dr. KG, Dr. Panth, and Anil Bhatt had the support. 40-year-old Rakesh Lohar, a resident of Basra, has been suffering from pain in the upper abdomen and loss of appetite for the last two months, due to which the weakness and weight were getting reduced; he was treated in many places but got frustrated. The family brought Rakesh to Pacific Medical College and Hospital, where he showed it to Gastrosurgeon Dr. Vikesh Joshi. On examination, the patient came to know about the problem of acute pancreatitis (acute necrotizing pancreatitis), which was only possible to be treated by operation. The patient has also suffered TB and asthma for the last eight years. Gastrosurgeon Dr. Vikesh Joshi said that 23% of people die from acute necrotizing pancreatitis. The cause of this disease in men is alcohol. The biggest reason for this disease in women is not getting timely surgery for stones in their gallbladder. Dr. Joshi clarified that in acute necrotizing pancreatitis, due to the filling of water in the upper part of the patient's stomach, there is sudden swelling due to the patient's inability to eat. Most patients of this disease get completely cured after getting the proper treatment. In severe cases, acute necrotizing pancreatitis causes bleeding, severe tissue damage, and infection. It can also damage other vital organs such as the heart, lungs and kidneys. The patient is now fully recovered and has been discharged.

Schools of Udaipur celebrated 'No Bag Day' with enthusiasm on Saturday
