

CSR @Hindustan Zinc



Udaipur: Various projects are being run under the CSR of Hindustan Zinc, and promoting small-scale industries is prominent. In the last two years, two women industries

were established in which women have emerged as entrepreneurs. The spice and garment manufacturing industries are located in Putholi in the nearby village of Zinc,

Moonga Ka Kheda. 50-60 women are directly and indirectly connected through these industries. These women have seen the path of self-reliance by joining these industries,

and now these women are moving towards self-reliance by generating an income of Rs. 4 to 5 thousand per woman. In these units, from the responsibility of manufacturing to marketing in the market, all the work is done by women only. Spices manufactured by women are available in more than eight districts and more than 300 shops in the state, including Delhi, Ghaziabad, and Agra.

Apparel manufactured by women is available from the Upaaya brand; various organizations in the market purchase all the products due to their high quality. Continuing this industry chain, under the Samadhan project of Jai

Chittod Agricultural Producer Organization Hindustan Zinc, a mineral mixture unit is being established in the village Moonga Ka Kheda. With its establishment, the mineral mixture will be made according to the local requirement, which will increase the livestock's health and the farmer brothers' income. The spice industry and garment manufacturing unit are operated under the Sakhi project of Hindustan Zinc.

Spices and clothes made by Sakhi became the choice of the common man.

Considering the priority of income generation of Sakhi groups, Zinc has tied up with local and state-level sales and

markets to sell Sakhi products so that the products made by Sakhi women reach the market directly. The spices and clothes being manufactured by Sakhi are now also available in the market, ensuring the guarantee of purity; more than 35 women are working as spice entrepreneurs, out of which 12 women are involved in the production of spices and others marketing them in the village and urban areas. Similarly, more than 25 women are interested in making garments, which prepare designer clothes, bags, and home decor, which the common man likes.

They are playing an essential role in making

women entrepreneurs.

Hindustan Zinc is essential in making rural women entrepreneurs by connecting them with the mainstream of society. Under its social concern, Hindustan Zinc has been trying hard to make women self-dependent for the last 14 years. Strengthening health services at RNT Hospital



Udaipur: More than 300 CCTV cameras have been installed in 3 hospitals (MB, Janana, and Super Specialty) of Udaipur RNT Medical College. The purpose of installing these CCTVs is to monitor the functioning of the staff with arrangements for patients and carers so that they can be dealt with if there is any disturbance or inappropriate activity and theft by the team. From General Ward to Oxygen Plant, ICU Ward, OPD, IPD, and Covid Ward, every small and big movement of patients and staff is on the screen. Nodal officers from the principal's office in the server room monitor 24 hours in 3 shifts, while analysts have fewer programmers in one shift.

At the same time, more than 100 more cameras will be installed in halls, galleries, porches, entrances, and parking lots to increase security. During the Covid period, 180 cameras were installed, and 120 more cameras have been added as the system improves.

Dr. Lakhan Poswal, principal of RNT Medical College, says that emergency-like situations were occurring due to the high number of patients in the second phase of Corona. The reason was that the bodyguards were not allowed to go to the ICU and there were many complaints that the staff was not paying attention, so CCTV cameras were installed to monitor the patients and staff. With the success of cameras, the control room has been made permanent with the increase of cameras.

Discipline is maintained by CCTV.

CCTV Surveillance has maintained discipline in ICU admitted patients, presence of a guard, the duty of staff, cradle of time, etc. At the same time, the complaints of thefts on the hospital premises have now stopped and the complaints about the team have also started decreasing. Dr. Richa Purohit, nodal officer of CCTV in the principal's office, informed that in the second phase of Covid, monitoring has been done on the oxygen plant, ICU, etc. Every hour on the social media group, readings of the plant's pressure meter, the patient had a sheet of health parameters (patient's name, BP-plus, oxygen saturation, etc.) on the monitor. When the crowd of relatives around the patient's bed, nursery, or doctors are not visible, they make arrangements by calling the ward in charge or super-

intendent. RNT has surveillance from CCTV since 2018, but then the rooms were fewer, due to which cases of theft were coming to the fore every day. With the rise of cameras, theft cases are no longer coming

Dr. Kharadi said that an action plan for the Healthy Liver Campaign had been prepared in the district in which various activities will be carried out till July 28 with the cooperation of the District Administration, Medical Department, Public Health Engineering, Women and Child Development, Panchayati Raj and all other related departments. It will be organized. All the activities will be carried out in a campaign in village Dhani, and the general public will be made aware of Viral Hepatitis. He said that viral hepatitis is mainly caused by contaminated water and food and infected blood, and it affects the liver, and in severe cases, it can lead to death. In this regard, the work of cleaning and chlorination of all drinking water sources coming under the Public Health Engineering Department and Panchayati Raj Department will be done, along with this, through the Department of Women and Child Development, the necessary nutritious food for the healthy liver will be provided to the village Dhani through the Women and Child Development Department. For this information will be given to pregnant women and lactating mothers. Dr. Kharadi informed that under the campaign, the inmates of the jails located in the district would be screened for hepatitis B and C. At the same time, Hepatitis B screening of pregnant women will also be done at medical institutions on the day of MCHN Day, Shakti Diwas, and PMSMA. Various competitions will also be organized in schools to explain the importance of clean water and food to make children aware of this disease. Dr. Kharadi informed that the officers and personnel who have done excellent work under the campaign would also be honored at the state level on July 28, World Hepatitis Day.

He did Surya Namaskar during the Mount Unam Expedition. Mount Unam is located in the Lahaul district of Himachal Pradesh. Both the climbers started the expedition from Bharatpur Tent Colony, located on the Leh Manali road. This was the expedition's base camp, whose altitude was 15,419 feet above sea level. Here Nivedita and Karthik performed 75 Surya Namaskars and dedicated the Amrit Festival of Independence. The climbers performed Ultimate 30 Surya Namaskar at the summit camp, which had a height of 17,163 feet. The temperature was - 10 degrees Celsius, and the oxygen level was 11%. Why did he target Ultimate 30? On this, the climbers said that they want to promote free fitness. Surya Namaskar is a whole-body exercise in which all muscles and lungs are exercised. Surya Namaskar is such an action that does not require equipment or any expenditure. They aim to make Surya Namaskar to the international level.

He gave the fact about doing 30 Surya Namaskars that there are 12 poses in Surya Namaskar, and multiplying 12 by 30 gives 360. 360 is the value of a perfect sphere that represents our earth. And 30 Surya Namaskar is a number that any ordinary person can do daily. Thus he named the project Surya Namaskar, Any Time, Anywhere, Any One.
