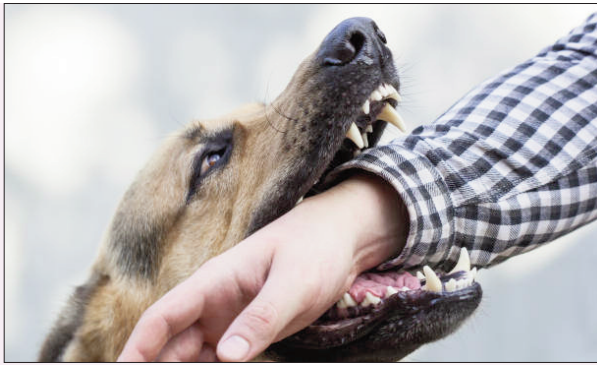
American Pit Bull Terrier, Rottweiler, American Bulldog, Siberian Husky, Bullmastiff, Tosa Inu, Malamute, The Saint Bernard, The Great Dane, Akita, Boxer, Wolf Hybrid, Chow Chow, Doberman Pinschers, German Shepherd, Caucasian Ovcharka, Gull Dong, Rough Collies and some other breeds are extremely dangerous.

The pit bull is considered to be the most dangerous dog in America and UK. Every year many people are killed by pit bulls. These dogs were originally bred to fight and hunt.

These dogs are incredibly muscular and powerful. These dogs look very cute to some of us, however, many Pit Bull owners make alterations to the dog to look aggressive. There are many people out there who train these dogs to fight each other for revenue. To train them, they starve, beat and torture them. If you don't give proper training to these dogs, they can become aggressive.

Only a small mistake may trigger their instinct to kill. You will be surprised to know that according to PETA, pit bulls are the most abused and neglected dogs in the world. Today, they're the number-one breed euthanized in many animal shelters across the world.

A dog can appear and act aggressively when experi-



encing high levels of pain, abuse and health issues. If your pit bull presents any sudden behavioural change, take him to the veterinarian immediately. A vet will be able to analyze the dog's state of health and rule out any possible pathological causes of aggression. If your pit bull is aggressive with other dogs or towards people, it is vital that you do

not ignore this behavior or put off treatment for later. If you do not understand the situation immediately, it may be too late to control the situation effectively. Aggressiveness is a serious behavioural problem that must be treated promptly. It should be noted from the beginning. If you notice any signs, even if they are slight, immediately rush to the train-

er or the vet. canine hypothyroidism or any hormonal disease may also cause aggression in your dog. These diseases can be detected with simple veterinary tests.

The problem with pit bulls is in their DNA, that is a propensity to fight to the DEATH, even when the VICTIM is trying to escape and not fighting back. Once they are ready to fight, these dogs will not spare you until death. A dog needs 12 to 14 hours of sleep in a day and food according to its weight and health. Old people can not give them proper time. Big dogs need to exercise and play every day. If you can not take them out, their energy will not be channelised. Some dog owners beat their dogs for their smallest mistakes. These dogs become aggressive and

may attack weak people, children or other pets.

Some dogs have reputations for being dangerous based on the way that they were raised and the way that they were treated. With love, proper guidance, and proper training, most dogs can be good, friendly, and loyal dogs. Dogs are very intelligent and can learn to relate positively with people, other animals and with their environment.

Everything depends on how you raise these voiceless animals. It is not advisable to keep them in flats and with kids. Small dogs generally don't attack people but if you ill-treat them, these dogs may bite you. Many people shout or run to see a dog, this act may trigger the dog to chase. Every time you enter a dog owner's

home, listen to the instructions given by the owner. Do not shout or run to see an unchained dog. Dogs don't like being noisy. At first, they want to smell you to understand. They are voiceless and can not talk like you. Please allow them to be friendly with you. If the owner is well trained and asks you to be calm, please cooperate with the owner. If you still have fear of dogs, please take Cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT) to change the way you respond to fear and think about dogs in a different way. Do not tie your dogs for long hours. Do not keep them isolated. Give them time, food and value. If you can not give necessities, please don't keep dogs. They have a life too.

Many important decisions were taken in the general meeting of the Urban Development Trust

Udaipur (Dr Munesh Arora): Urban Development Trust President and District Collector Tarachand Meena has said that the quality of development works under the Urban Development Trust should be fully taken care of so that the general public can benefit from the product works as per the instructions of the State Government.

Collector Meena was addressing the trust members and officers while presiding over the general meeting of the Urban Development Trust on Wednesday.

During this, he discussed 52 points in detail about the various development works through the Trust and gave essential instructions. He calmly took factual information from the Trust and departmental officers on every development work and approved them after confirming the overall public interest.

Plantation should be

done on the lines of Chandigarh: In the meeting, the entire focus of Collector Meena was on the quality of development works, while he said that why the white line is



not visible on the road built by us for more than 15 days? He directed to get the quality white line done on the National Highway. This discussion also discussed making another hockey astroturf in the Khel Village. The Collector was required to get the saplings planted on the hills of Khelgaon at the earliest and said that flowering plants of local species should be grown like

Chandigarh only during monsoon. The Collector instructed the Transport Officer to make a plan to make Rani Road free from heavy traffic. Along with this, instructions

drains of Trust converted residential colonies, and cleaning of main highways and rainy drains of Trust's jurisdiction will be done regularly. MoU to be done through Municipal Corporation, Udaipur. Administrative and financial sanction of Rs. 4 crores was issued after execution. Under this, Rs 4 crore will be provided by the Trust to the Municipal Corporation for one year, and regular cleaning of 167 colonies, roads, drains, etc., will be done by the Corporation.

Decisions taken on these subjects: In the meeting, permission was given to transfer Rs 15 crore of trust contribution to Smart City, and administrative and financial sanctions of Rs 35.20 crore were issued for various development works under the jurisdiction of the Trust. Similarly, for the development of works of sports at Maharana Bhupal Stadium, an amount of Rs 174.99 lakh Administrative and financial

sanction was issued. In contrast, administrative and financial approvals of Rs 10.73 crore issued for development works in various colonies in the last three months were confirmed.

2686.43 lakh sanctioned on renovation and beautification works:

During the meeting, technical approval of Rs 2686.43 lakh was given on various renovation and beautification works in the trust area. Under this, technical support of Rs. 890.43 lakh was given for the construction of a revenue drain upstream from Dhikli pond, Rs. 596 lakh for the renovation and beautification of Nehru Garden located in Fatehsagar lake, and Rs. 1200 lakh for the development of Rani Road as a model road.

Allotment of land for various development works:

In the meeting, in compliance with the Chief Minister's budget announcement year

2022-23, for construction of various government offices/institutions such as the Chief Medical and Health Officer's office, Cyber Police Station, Primary Health Center Daroli, Village Service Cooperative Society for construction of godowns of Gudli, Vaidyanath Mahadev Great Agriculture MULTIPURPOSE COOPERATIVE SOCIETY LTD. For the construction of Sisarma's godown and building, Rehabilitation Home Scheme and free land allotment proceedings for the Savitri Bai Phule reading room were confirmed. Similarly, it was decided to allow 2,50,000 square feet of land for a sports stadium in Girwa block to Regional Sports Training Center at the reserve rate. In the meeting, Secretary Balmukund Asawa, SE K.R. Meena, and Vipin Jain, senior city planner Arvind Singh Kanawat, along with other officers of the Trust, were present.

In these 75 days, a free vaccine dose of covid vaccine will be installed at all the health centers of the district. Along with this, this facility will also be available at all Urban Primary Health Centers in urban areas as well as Vaccination Centers running in R.N.T. Medical College.

Dr. Kharadi said that beneficiaries above the age of 18 years who have been given the second Dose of vaccine for more than six months or more than 26 weeks would be eligible for the free preparation dose.
