Jodhpur: After facing 20 years of struggle in the fetters of child marriage which was tied at the age of just one year, finally with the help of Dr. Kriti Bharti of Saarthi Trust, Rekha got the gift of annulment of child marriage on her birthday. After the support of Saarthi Trust's Managing Trustee and Rehabilitation Psychologist Dr. Kriti Bharti, Rekha had filed the case for annulment of child marriage in the Family Court to get rid from her child marriage. On which Judge Pradeep Kumar Modi of Jodhpur's Family Court No. 2 gave a strong message against the evil of child marriage and gave a historic decision to annul Rekha's child marriage. A 21-year-old girl, Rekha resident of Jodhpur, was caught in the



clutches of child marriage with a youth resident of a village in Jodhpur in the year 2002, on the occasion of mausar of her Grandfather. Rekha was only one year old at the time of child marriage. Rekha's in-laws pressurized her for the ritual Gauna and to send her in-laws house few years back. Due to which Rekha's dream of becoming an ANM shattered and she fell into depression.

On the other hand, the in-laws put the pressure of caste penalty of up to 10 lakh rupees on Rekha and her family.

Saarthi Trust supported, knocked into the court

Meanwhile, Balika Wadhu Rekha came to know about the campaign of annulment of child marriage of Dr. Kriti Bharti, Managing Trustee and Rehabilitation Psychologist of Saarthi Trust

who is one of the World Top Ten Activist and included into the list of BBC 100 Inspirational Women. Rekha, with the help of Dr. Kriti Bharti of Saarthi Trust, filed a case in Jodhpur Family Court for annulment of her child marriage. On the other hand she motivated Rekha to take admission in ANM course.

Order of Child marriage annulment, strong message against evil practice

Dr. Kriti Bharti, while advocating in the family court, made aware of the facts of child marriage and age related proof. On which Judge Pradeep Kumar Modi of Family Court No. 2 gave a historic order to annul the child marriage of Rekha, which took place at the age of just one year, about 20

years ago. Judge Modi gave a strong message against the evil practice of child marriage. He said that since a century, the evil of child marriage has not been eradicated. Now everyone should together take a pledge to eradicate child marriage.

Leading in child marriage annulment

It is worth mentioning that Dr. Kriti Bharti of Saarthi Trust, who was involved in a unique campaign to annul child marriages, had got the country's first child marriage annulled and after that 47 child marriages have been canceled and at the same time she has stopped more than 1600 child marriages. In 2015, history was also created by getting the child marriages of two minor

couples annulled in three days. Dr. Kriti Bharti's name has been recorded in 7 international and national records for creating different records in the campaign of child marriage. Dr. Kriti Bharti has been honored with many national and international honors including BBC Hindi's list of 100 Women List and USA's Taffd Magazine's World's Top 10 Activist.

Paras Hospital Udaipur successfully treated three patients with the help of a flow diverter

Udaipur: Another breakthrough was achieved in the Neurology team of Paras Hospital, Udaipur. In the last few months, three patients aged 55 to 60 were successfully operated on Capture Brain aneurysms with the help of flow diverter technology at Paras Hospital, out of which two were female and one male. Dr. Tarun Mathur, Senior Consultant Neurology and Interventional Neurology, Paras Hospital Udaipur, said that all three patients were brought to Paras Hospital Emergency in a state of headache and unconsciousness. As soon as the patients were admitted to the hospital, angiography was done to see their condition, which showed that balloons formed in the brain's arteries, called brain aneurysms. His condition was so critical that treatment was not possible with the help of simple coiling, so he was treated using the flow diverter technique.

In such a situation, if the pressure is too high, if not treated on time, it can disrupt the blood and oxygen supply to the brain, and the patient can die. Dr. Tarun Mathur, the Senior Consultant in Neurology and Interventional Neurology, said that a brain aneurysm is a problem related to the brain in which any part of the brain's arteries gets swollen, and blood accumulates in the swollen part.

The swollen part of the artery looks like gouty blisters from the outside. This disease mainly affects people in the age group of 35 to 60 years. Too, more women are more likely to have it than men. No one can ultimately tell the reason for such a condition, but there are some risk factors you may have to face this disease, such as old age, high blood pressure, and cigarette habit.

About 76,500 to 204,100 new cases are reported in India every year. According to some reports, the annual incidence of brain aneurysms is between 6 to 16 per 100,000 of the population. It is such a common disease that we can generally say that 1 out of every 100 people will have it. When this aneurysm ruptures, 1/3 percent of people die from it, and 1/3 of the patient can reach the hospital, but he can come in a state of coma, paralysis, or ventilator. Still, even in such a situation, people get high treatment features that can be saved.

A flow meter is a technique that works to divert the flow of blood away from a dilated

artery. This is a new technique to treat brain aneurysms without open brain surgery. Flow diverters may be particularly useful in giant aneurysms that cannot be safely treated with other techniques. The detection method of aneurysms is MRI or MRI angiography, which is safe but costly. In our practice, we see 80 percent of ruptured aneurysm patients and only 20 percent who are cured through screening. After successful treatment, the patients were cured and discharged.
