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Paras Hospitals :Successful treatment of a 67-year-old patient with a gastrointestinal stromal tumor

Udaipur: Another breakthrough was achieved by the oncology team of Paras Hospital, Udaipur. They have successfully treated a 67-year-old patient with Gastrointestinal Stromal Tumor. Dr. Subhabrata Das, Surgical Oncologist at Paras Hospital Udaipur, said that the patient was referred to Paras Hospital after an

unsuccessful incident in Bhilwara and bleeding during the operation. Given the patient's condition, he was taken for surgery, during which a large neurotic stromal tumor from the small intestine was detected. Subsequently, tumor histopathology and immune histochemistry revealed that the patient had a gastroin-

testinal stromal tumor.

Imatinib is an excellent molecular treatment for this type of tumor.

Dr. Subhabrata Das, Surgical Oncologist at Paras Hospital Udaipur, said that Gastrointestinal Stromal Tumor (GIST) is a type of tumor that usually occurs in the stomach or small intestine.

It can be severe and can be cured with the proper treatment. This tumor is thought to be of gastrointestinal origin, arising from specialized cells found in the cells inside the interstitial cell Cajal (ICC). Gastrointestinal stromal tumors are most commonly found in people between the ages of 40 and 70 but can also

occur in children and young people.

Some people with gastrointestinal stromal tumors may experience abdominal pain or bloating, vomiting, loss of appetite, or weight loss. Tumors can cause bleeding, leading to a low red blood cell count (anemia). This can make you feel weak and tired.

Bleeding in the intestines or stomach can cause dark-colored stools.

Bleeding in the throat or abdomen can lead to blood clots and vomiting of blood. All these symptoms are of the gastrointestinal stromal tumor, and they should be consulted immediately without ignoring them so that the disease can

be cured in the beginning before it progresses.

It highlights the importance of cancers operated by qualified cancer surgeons and managed by medical oncologists in the modern development of oncology.

Ram Katha of saint Murari Babu which began with the consecration of the world's tallest Shiva statue installed at Nathdwara, reached its end on 9th Day on Sunday. Babu said that the way Bharat got the support of Lord Rama's Paduka there, we have the support of Vishwas Swarupam here.

Babu asked people to assimilate incidents of Ram Katha in their life practically. Babu prayed for the welfare of the people Society country and the earth from the Vyaspeeth and prayed to the Lord for rendering Grace on everyone. Enthusiasm and decency in the event and present masses along with the flow of rasa rain in the story Murari babu dedicated this story of Manas to Vishwas swarupam. He said that Lord Mahadev himself is the sign of faith and resides in the whole world.

Next, he said faith is in our culture so should be pure and our culture is the epitome of whatever is achieved is sufficient. He said, our whole system stands on the four pillars of sadhumat, lokmat, politicians mat and vedmat. Bharat proclaims that he believes in truth not in power. Five faces of Shiva



Babu gave an account of five faces of Shiva in Vishwas Swarupam. He said, the first face is sunmukh which does not go against anyone but does welfare of all. The second face is the mouth of Guru knowledge comes from the mouth of Guru only. The third face is Vedas mouth which is the voice of Mahadev himself. Fourth face is the mouth of cow from where river Ganga is originated. 5th and the last face is innocent face of mother cow which denotes Bholenath himself.

Further Babu said that we all want Ramrajy again and Ramrajy will come through dialogue only not through any controversy. Next Babu said that politics should be done out of love for the nation. Describing the essence of Ram Katha Murari Babu said that if the story of Ram is to be told in one sentence it begins with faith and ends in relaxation. Even the liberation of a degraded person is possible by speaking Ram once. The yoga described in Geeta is experimented in Ram charitmanas. In Ram Katha competition goes not for achieving but for giving up, imparting the message that whatever they have achieved is enough for them. Manas asks to remember, sing and listen to Ram only. As long as Ganga, Yamuna and Saraswati flows on the earth, Ram Katha will also flow. Babu said, last person of the society also should be given due respect. That is called special honor which Ram gave to Kevat. When Ram

expressed his will to give something to Kevat, then kevat requested, as he had brought Ram, Lakhan and Sita in his boat, so also Ram should take Kevat and his family in his plane. Ram agreed and that was the special honor given to kevat by taking him along in viman. Viman means plane as well as special honor. In the context of burning Lanka by Hanumanji using his tail, Babu stated that people also burn tails of saints because they cannot come and oppose them in the face. So people try to condemn saints from behind by doing back biting.

Eight vas of Ram

Babu told the eight abodes of Rama in the context of Manas. First, was in Balkand that was important vas. Second, in ayodhya that was avadhwas all know. Third in janakpur that was sadan vas and fourth in ayodhya kand Bhavan vas. During exile in aranyakand vanvas then in kishkindha kand girivas. GMCH A patient was treated with HITHOC technique, first time in Rajasthan

Udaipur: Geetanjali Hospital is a hospital with all facilities. The patients visiting here are treated with state-of-the-art technologies. Recently, a 37-year-old patient of Udaipur, a beneficiary of Mukhyamantri Chiranjeevi Yojana, was successfully treated for pleural mesothelioma at Geetanjali Cancer Center after a lot of challenges and provided a healthy life. Cancer Surgeon Dr. Ashish Jakhethia performed this high-risk operation; Dr. Ajay Yadav, Cancer Specialist Dr. Ankit Agarwal, Dr. Renu Mishra, and Anesthetist Dr. Naveen Patidar completed with the tireless efforts of OT & ICU staff. To the patient.

Detailed information: Dr. Ashish said that pleural mesothelioma (pleural mesothelioma is rare cancer that occurs in the lining of the lungs) is a severe type of cancer. It begins at the outer layer of the lung called the parietal pleura. Gradually this cancer spreads to the whole lung. It is a rare type of cancer, and the sources of its treatment are also limited. For this reason, its successful treatment is usually unavailable or only in high centers of big cities. There are many reasons for the occurrence of this cancer, in which asbestos, mining, and silica are the main ones. It is generally seen that the effect of this type of cancer is more in Durgapur, Banswara.

When a 37-year-old patient from Durgapur was brought to the Geetanjali Cancer Center, he was first given three chemotherapy cycles. After this, the patient underwent surgery which is called extrapleural pneumonectomy.



Extrapleural pneumonectomy is surgery to remove a diseased lung, including part of the pericardium (the membrane covering the heart), part of the diaphragm (the muscle between the lungs and the abdomen), and part of the parietal pleura (the membrane of the chest). They are removed simultaneously. A similar treatment for pleural mesothelioma cancer was used until a few years later. In today's context for pleural mesothelioma cancer, advanced techniques are called extrapleural pneumonectomy radical surgery combined with hyperthermic intrathoracic chemotherapy (HITHOC). This patient was successfully treated with this state-of-the-art technique. Under this, all the disease is removed during surgery, but some microscopic disease remains, which is not possible to see by the eyes; for that high-temperature machine comes, Chemotherapy is given at a 42-degree temperature. Usually, this type of operation is expensive. It is done by keeping only one lung running, and the critical anesthesiologist has a significant role in it because this surgery takes 5-6 hours by a single lung and has to be managed.

Chemotherapy is circulated in the patient's chest for a dead hour at 42 degrees. In such a case, a heart attack can occur. Apart from this, there can be side effects on the patient's body. A critical team is used for post-operative care. The patient has to be kept in ICU for about 2-3 days, and all necessary support has to be given. After this, the patient starts getting health benefits.

This case of Extrapleural Pneumonectomy Radical Surgery Combined with Hyperthermic Intrathoracic Chemotherapy (HITHOC) is the first case in the entire Rajasthan that has been done free of cost under Mukhyamantri Chiranjeevi Yojana. This type of technology is available only in the high centers of big cities.

The CEO of Geetanjali Hospital, Mr. Prateem Tamboli, said that with the experienced team, multidisciplinary approach, and state-of-the-art techniques in Geetanjali Hospital, complex operations are being performed on the patients here, which further reduces the risk. This type of high-end operation at Geetanjali Hospital reflects the state-of-the-art approach. The team that made this operation a success was congratulated by Mr. Tamboli.

Free treatment under Chief Minister Chiranjeevi Yojana

Udaipur: Dr. Atul Luhadia, Dr. Ronak Kankrecha, Dr. Hiren Hadiya, and Technician Lokendra of the Department of Respiratory Diseases removed the piece of betel nut stuck in the windpipe without operation binoculars in Geetanjali Medical College and Hospital, Udaipur. He provided a healthy life by doing a bronchoscopy.

The patient suddenly developed a cough, shortness of breath, and chest pain in the last few days. In such a situation, the patient's relatives met Dr. SK Luhadia and Dr. Atul Luhadia in the Department of Respiratory Diseases of Geetanjali Hospital. It was found in the X-ray that the patient's left lung had collapsed completely. The patient's oxygen level was decreasing, so the patient was admitted to the ICU and given oxygen.

A video bronchoscopy of the patient was done, and it was found that there was a lump-like foreign body in the windpipe leading to the left lung, due to which the left lung was utterly deflated.

Dr. Atul and his team pulled out the foreign body with binoculars by holding the three-prong biopsy forceps with the help of local anesthesia without making the patient unconscious.

On coming out, it was found that the foreign body was a piece of betel nut (3 x 1 cm) stuck in the left side of the windpipe while the patient was sleeping while eating the betel nut. As soon as the betel nut was taken out, the patient started feeling better, and his throw-



ing was also back to normal. Usually, foreign body rigid bronchoscopy is performed by sedating the patient, there are more complications. Dr. Atul and his team removed the piece of betel nut under local anesthesia by video bronchoscopy. This complex examination and treatment of the patient were done free of cost under Chief Minister Chiranjeevi Yojana in Geetanjali Hospital.

The patient is now completely healthy and has been discharged from the hospital.

Geetanjali Hospital is a tertiary care multi-specialty hospital; here, all advanced technology and resources are available in the respiratory diseases department, due to which the complex problems are being solved continuously.
