was introduced in the year 2017 by the Indians.

It was implemented for graduate students in all agricultural universities and colleges on the recommendation of the Fifth Dean's Committee

After that, the co-development of allied agricultural activities such as crop travel, livestock management, and fisheries, leading progressively to the pre-modern development of farming technologies and classification of crops, marks the time before and after the Green Revolution and finally Led to the present agricultural scenario surrounded by modern technologies and prospects of the country, which will prove to be very important in today's system.

District administration will run a campaign to make Udaipur free from begging

Giving information on this occasion, Deputy Superintendent, Udaipur, Mahendra Kumar, as a representative of the Police Department, said that strict action would be taken against those who habitually and small children begged.

Groundwater Conservation Engineers Know Rain Water Conservation With Compact Filters

Udaipur: So far, rainwater conservation has been done by the tank or filter pit in the ground. Often, these surface tanks become useless due to lack of maintenance; similarly, the filter pit is made in the environment gradually from the soil soaked in the roof's rainwater. They get choked. In this way, the goal of groundwater conservation is not entirely successful.

For this, the compact water filter made in PVC pipe, recognized by the Central Ground Water Board, is cheap, simple, easy, and maintenance-free. How to use it, the water hero of the city, Dr. P.C. Jain, today watershed at Pratapnagar. The review meeting of the engineer brothers present in the meeting building of the Development and Soil Conservation Department was told in his presentation. The compact filter can be successfully installed in villages for groundwater conservation at just Rs 5500. For this, he shared his experiences, including recharging the dead hand pump, tube well, and step well. Before installing it, he put tree leaves on the roof. There should be no junk, and the top should be cleaned equally during the rainy season.

The program was presided over by Superintendent Engineer Atul Jain.

These will be installed in the second phase of the Rajiv Gandhi Jal Sanchay Yojana.

At the end of the presentation, women engineers performed a water dance and a water song with Dr. PC Jain.

Rajasthan became the national winner with a double hat-trick

Udaipur: In the 13th National Kudo Championship 2022, organized under the joint aegis of Kudo, Rajasthan Headquarters Udaipur, Ministry of Youth and Sports, Government of India, and Kudo International Federation of India (KIFI), the Rajasthan team won 57 gold, 28 silver, and 37 bronze. By winning the Champions Trophy for the third time in a row and 122 medals, Rajasthan created a golden history and gave a wonderful gift of Diwali to the sports world.

In the 13th National Kudo Championship held at Uka Tarsadia University, Bardoli, Gujarat, from October 24 to 31 under the leadership of Shihan Rajkumar Menaria, President and Chief Coach of Kudo Rajasthan, 148-member women, and men's team won

the title of this National Championship to Rajasthan and not only did he top the national medal tally, but he also created undefeated history by scoring a double hat-trick of championships.

In this national championship, team 'Gujarat' stood second with 22 gold, 37 silver, and 40 bronze, and team 'Maharashtra' stood third with 18 gold, 22 silver, and 35 bronze medals. In the 14th Akshaykumar International Kudo Championship, the champions of Team Rajasthan captured the most medals and made the history of a hat-trick in three. Team Rajasthan, returning after creating golden history, was welcomed in more than 13 districts, including Udaipur, Jodhpur, Bikaner, Alwar, Jalore, and Sri Ganganagar; medal winners

were honored by playing drums and taking out processions, the grand Swat with fireworks was extraordinary.

When the President of the Kudo Federation of India, Hanshi Mehul Vora, and the Trustee of Uka Tarsadia University Gujarat, Mr. Dinesh Shah, announced the winner of the National Team Champions Trophy, the entire players of Rajasthan Kudo danced for half an hour carrying the trophy with various proclamation slogans. And expressed happiness. Shihan Rajkumar, Joint Secretary of the Kudo Federation of India and President of Kudo Rajasthan, said that in the competition, Bollywood star and Chairman of Kudo India Shihan Akshay Kumar presented medals and certificates to the best players. Dr.



Rajkumar Pandyan, Director General of Police Surat Range, as the Chief Guest, felicitated the winners. It is noteworthy that along with the 13th National Kudo Championship, recognized by the Ministry of Youth and Sports, Government of India, the undefeated history of its excellence by capturing both the 14th Akshaykumar
