906th Murari Bapu's Ram Katha from 29th October at Vishwas Swroopam - Nathdwara

Vishwas Swaroopam will swing with songs of Kailash, a presentation of Siddharth Randeria, and hymns of Hansraj.

Something similar, on the one hand, a new chapter is going to write its history on the world stage. The inauguration festival of the world's tallest Shiva statue of 369 feet, "Vishwas Swaroopam," is being organized from October 29 to November 6 at Nathdwara in the Rajsamand district of Rajasthan. Every particle of Rajasthan, attracts people from abroad due to its bravery, sacrifice, devotion, and spiritual and cultural heritage.



Madan Paliwal, the trustee of Sant Kripa Sanatan Sansthan, said that in this Maha Mahotsav, religious, spiritual, and cultural events would be celebrated for nine days, Murari Bapu's 9-day long Ram Katha will add to this festival, and millions of listeners from all over the world will be witness to it. Murari Bapu's Ram Katha will be like icing on the cake in this launch festival. Madan Paliwal had prepared the dream project of making

the world's giant Shiva idol in the altar posture of Lord Shiva in the city of Shreeji years ago. This wonderful statue of Lord Shiva installed in the town of Shreeji will establish a new dimension in the tourism of the country and Rajasthan, along with attracting the people.

This 369 feet high statue built on the Ganesh Tekri of Nathdwara has been a part of the dream project. Built this statue on a hill of 51 bighas,

Lord Shiva is seated in the posture of meditation and lead, which can be seen from 20 kilometers away. This statue is visible even at night and has been decorated with unique lights. In this festival to be held in Nathdwara from October 29 to November 6, along with the discourses of Murari Bapu, there will be a Mahasangam of faith, culture, music, and art.

One and a half lakh square feet of pandal-Organized by Sant Kripa Sanatan Sansthan, the view of this festival will be no less than Mahakumbh. A mass tide of devotees will come to the holy land of Shreenath Ji; preparations are going on in full swing in such a situation. For the event, a pandal of 1.5 lakh square feet is being set up, and a pandal of food hall has been set up in about 2 lakh square feet. The audience will enjoy listening to the story and bringing food to prasad. These pandals are being made with German technology.

Vishwas Swaroopam Dham will swing with songs of Kailash, a presentation of Siddharth Randeria, and hymns of Hansraj in the launch festival of Vishwas

Swaroopam. There will be a confluence of feelings with devotion. The inauguration festival will be held from November 29 to 6 in Nathdwara. Along with devotion, a cultural glimpse will also be seen in the "Vishwas Swaroopam" unveiling and Ram Katha Mahotsav to be organized by Sant Kripa Sanatan Sansthan in Shreeji's city from October 29 to November 6. Along with the Kavi Sammelan, renowned singers will decorate the program with their tunes in the cultural evening. "Vishwas Swaroopam" Unveiling Festival is being organized to inaugurate the world's tallest Shiva statue, built by Tattapadman Sansthan. Under this, Bhakti Sarita will flow as a nine-day Ramkatha from the Shrimukh of Murari Bapu.



Along with this devotional stream, the cultural stream will also be affected. The King of Gujarati comedy plays, Siddharth Randeria, will perform at Cultural Sarita on November 2. Siddharth Randeria holds the record for most live performances as an actor. "Lage Rahe Guji Bhai" has created a record on the Gujarati stage by completing

800 shows worldwide in three years. He has received the Dadasaheb Phalke Award for the lead role in Nat Samrat



(2018). His "Chal Jivi Lai!" (2019) film has proved to be the highest-grossing Gujarati film of all time after running in theaters for over a year.

On November 3, Baba Hansraj Raghuvanshi, who has forced the audience to dance by spreading the magic of devotional songs in a new style, will present his devotion to Shiva. Raghuvanshi is not interested in any identity among the country's youth, swinging in Mahadev's big hair, tattoos, and dedication to the innocent. Raghuvanshi composed the first song, "Baba Ji," and put it on YouTube. In 2019, "Mera Bhola Hai Bhandari" Bhajan established Raghuvanshi as a singer. Baba Hansraj has developed his style of singing.

On November 4, the country's famous poet "Vishwas Swaroopam" will flow poetry. On November 5, Indian play-

back singer Kailash Kher will spread his voice. Kailash Kher, who has received dozens of awards, took music lessons



from his father in his childhood. Singing inherited music in 18 languages, Kher's style is influenced by Indian folk music.

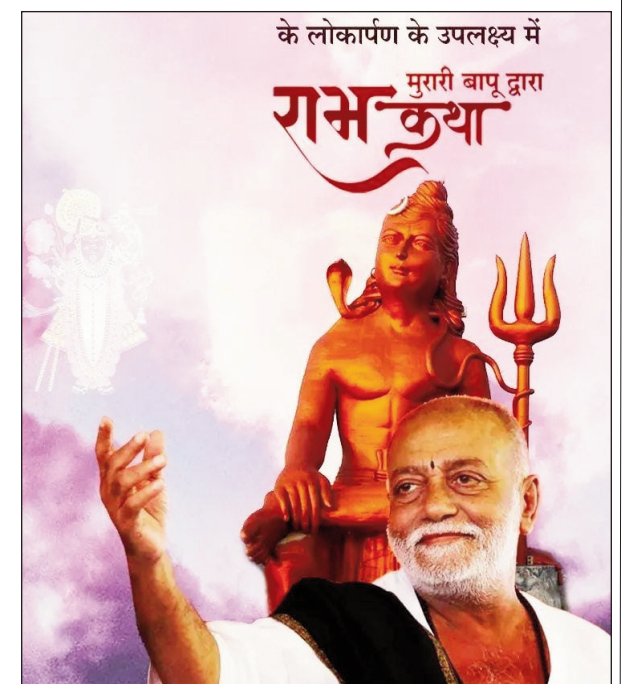

Successful treatment of gastrointestinal stromal tumor at Paras Hospitals

What is Gastrointestinal Stromal Tumor and its Symptoms?

Udaipur: Another breakthrough was achieved by the oncology team of Paras Hospital, Udaipur. They have successfully treated a 67-year-old patient with Gastrointestinal Stromal Tumor at Paras Hospital.

Dr. Subhabrata Das, Surgical Oncologist at Paras Hospital Udaipur, said that the patient was referred to Paras Hospital after an unsuccessful incident in Bhilwara and bleeding during the operation.

Given the patient's condition, he was taken for surgery, during which a large neurotic stromal tumor from the small intestine was detected.

Subsequently, tumor histopathology and immune histochemistry revealed that the patient had a gastrointestinal stromal tumor. Imatinib is a perfect molecular treatment for this type of tumor.

Dr. Subhabrata Das, Surgical Oncologist at Paras Hospital Udaipur, said that Gastrointestinal Stromal Tumor (GIST) is a type of tumor that usually occurs in the stomach



or small intestine.

This tumor is thought to be of gastrointestinal origin, arising from specialized cells found in the cells inside the interstitial cell Cajal (ICC).

Gastrointestinal stromal tumors are most commonly found in people between the ages of 40 and 70 but can also occur in children and young people. It can be severe and can be cured with the proper treatment.

Some people with gastrointestinal stromal tumors may experience abdominal pain or bloating, vomiting, loss of appetite, or weight loss. Tumors can cause bleeding, leading to a low red blood cell count (anemia).

This can make you feel weak and tired. Bleeding in the

intestines or stomach can cause dark-colored stools. Bleeding in the throat or abdomen can lead to blood clots and vomiting of blood. All these symptoms are of the gastrointestinal stromal tumor; they should be consulted immediately without ignoring them so that the disease can be cured in the beginning before it progresses.

It highlights the importance of cancers operated by qualified cancer surgeons and managed by medical oncologists in the modern development of oncology.

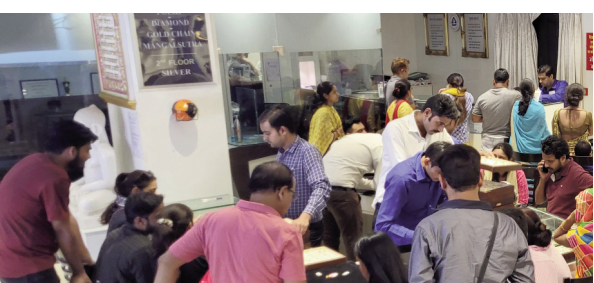

Ophthalmologist Dr. Nitin Singh said that this operation takes only 7 to 10 minutes, and the patient can return to his home. This facility is being provided free of cost to the patients in PIMS. Apart from this, more operations are being done, including black glaucoma, squint, honeycomb, eyes screen, canker, and membrane of eyes.

Webinar held on Effective Writing in Scientific Research by SMRIM & IBS, Udaipur

Udaipur: 4th October. Society for Microvita Research and Integrated Medicine (SMRIM), Udaipur, and Indian Botanical Society (IBS) - Udaipur Chapter jointly organized a webinar on Effective Writing in Scientific Research on Tuesday, 4th October, 2022 on Zoom platform. Moderator and organizing secretary of the webinar, Dr. Vartika Jain welcomed the keynote speaker and all the participants of the webinar. Then she introduced the eminent speaker of the event, Dr. Deeksha Dave who is working as an assistant professor in Environmental Studies, School of Interdisciplinary and Transdisciplinary Studies, IGNOU, New Delhi, India.

Dr. Deeksha spoke on the basics of writing effectively in scientific research. She discussed the difference between academic science writing and general public scientific writing and explained all the important features of scientific writing. She said that there are five stages of scientific research and on every step, the author has to be vigilant. Dr. Dave emphasized that while writing one should avoid sesquipedalian words, flowery description, duplication of words, inconsistent use of terms and jargon and apply fog index to make the article more readable. She further said that a proper citation is required to make the document authentic and effective editing is a very important step before finalizing the document for publication. Dr. Dave also talked about various ethical issues in authorship and motivated students to write early and write often to fetch the deadline of their research work in time. Several queries of the participants related to effective writing were resolved by Dr. Deeksha. Webinar was also streamed live on YouTube. In the end, convener of webinar, Dr. Vineet Soni, Head, Dept. of Botany, Mohan Lal Sukhadia University, Udaipur gave thanks to Dr. Dave for delivering an excellent deliberation and motivating students and scholars for writing efficiently to get effective publication in reputed journals.
