Deceased Organ Donation for the first time in Geetanjali Medical College and Hospital

Organ donor gave new life to five people

Udaipur: Cadaveric organ donation was made at Geetanjali Medical College and Hospital, Udaipur, for the first time. For the first time in South Rajasthan, Green Corridor was made for Organ Transportation. This organ donation was made according to the State Organ and Tissue Transplant Organization (SOTO). This organ donation was made on the decision of the family of 44-year-old Mrs. Snehlata Ji were donated. After organ donation, the liver and two kidneys were sent from Udaipur to SMS Hospital, MGM Hospital, Jaipur by the Green Corridor at 7:00 (19.00 hrs) Sunday for this procedure. The family members were advised to donate organs by the team of doctors. The family members together decided to donate their organs. Coordination was made with the unit of Geetanjali Hospital. They were organizing team members at Geetanjali Hospital under Dr. Pankaj Trivedi, Dr. Kamal Kishore Bishnoi, Dr. Sanjay Gandhi, Dr. Ankur Gandhi, Dr. Kalpesh Mistry, Dr. Nilesh Bhatnagar, Dr. Vinod Mehta, Dr. Govind Mangal, Dr. Sanjay Paliwal.

The organs of Mrs. Snehlata Ji were donated. After organ donation, the liver and two kidneys were sent from Udaipur to SMS Hospital, MGM Hospital, Jaipur by the Green Corridor at 7:00 (19.00 hrs) Sunday for this procedure. District Police Udaipur, Chittorgarh, Bhilwara, Ajmer,



and Jaipur made an exceptional contributions. The organs have covered a distance of 430 km in about 270 minutes.

After that, at 8:00 pm (20.00 hrs), the patient's body was respectfully left for the place of residence along with his family members. All the administrative officers, doctors, nurses, and attendants of Geetanjali Hospital were present. All the

people present were filled with emotion, and at the same time, tears started flowing, and slogans of Snehlata Ji Amar rahe started.

Mr. Lalit Kumar Dalal (Husband of the organ donor) said that he wants everyone to understand the importance of organ donation and its usefulness. According to him, how many people will get a new life

from his wife's organ donation, do not know anything about the time when someone needs it, and anyway, they burn the body, all the parts get burnt. In such a situation, they work for someone. Come on, and this is more important.

It is necessary to understand the importance of organ donation. Manan Dalal (son of an organ donor), who is prepar-

ing for NEET and wants to become a doctor, said that his sister Surabhi Dalal both decided that they will give full support in organ donation as he is today's youth. Geetanjali Hospital appreciates the spirit of this young generation.

So far, five kidney transplants of live donors have been done in Geetanjali Hospital. Let us know that the state government authorizes the hospital for kidney, heart, and cornea transplants.
