If any part of you gets burnt while lighting a flower or lamp, immediately pour cold water there and contact the nearest doctor

After cleaning the area where there is a burn for a while, wipe it with water and apply the medicine immediately. Before using the treatment, you must consult a good doctor. If 10 percent or more of the body is burnt, directly go to your nearest hospital or

During Diwali, adulterated sweets of milk and dry fruits are found in many shops, which is very dangerous for our

There is a risk of food poisoning due to those sweets, which can cause vomiting and diarrhea, so drink ORS solution first and contact the doctor immediately. It is imperative to

At the time of Deepawali, winter starts, due to which moisture remains in the weather, and at this time, the atmosphere is filled with smoke and harmful gases due to stubble burning in the fields.
