



To repay loans

THE National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) and the National Commission for Women (NCW) have done well to initiate action by taking suo motu notice of a newspaper report which says that men in Rajasthan are selling their young daughters and sisters to repay loans. CM Ashok Gehlot, who initially tried to dismiss the report as an 'old one', has had to bow down as clamour grew over the horrible happenings. Along with the CM's promise of catching and punishing the guilty, the NHRC and NCW intervention should instill fear of the law of the land into anyone commodifying women.

Inevitably, the sold girls end up being sexually abused, tortured, enslaved and trafficked. One such girl, a minor whose father had to sell her for Rs 6 lakh, is reported to have been sold three times and become pregnant four times.

Editorial

The moneylenders are rich sharks who exploit poverty-ridden families stuck in the quagmire of loans taken for the treatment of a sick family member or other exigencies. The scenario raises concerns about the prevalence of an organised trafficking ring run by the high and mighty, enjoying impunity. A thorough investigation and exemplary action against the criminals are warranted.

This regressive mode of justice is being delivered by caste panchayats, whose writ still runs in many rural areas of North India. The disputing parties prefer to approach these kangaroo courts; non-compliance of the verdict is a crushing ostracism from the community. Settling matters of marriage, inheritance and also, apparently, loans, these panchayats have been largely known for ordering the 'honour killing' of couples who opt for inter-caste or inter-faith marriages. It is abominable that such practices giving ownership rights over girls and women to men should still be around in this age. Education of both boys and girls is the key to gender equality and justice. It can change notions of what constitutes right and wrong. That some khaps in Haryana are tilting towards progressive ideas is encouraging and should inspire Rajasthan.

Successful surgery for basilar artery occlusion in a 70-year-old male

Udaipur: A stroke is a medical emergency; Early diagnosis and treatment are essential to prevent permanent disability. With the help of the Mechanical Thrombectomy Technique, Basilar Artery Occlusion in a 70-year-old male has been successfully operated on at Paras Hospital. Dr. Tarun Mathur, the Senior Consultant of Neurology and Interventional Neurology at Paras Hospital Udaipur, said that the patient had progressive symptoms for 48 hours until he became unconscious and hemiplegic.



Initial MRI scans revealed a major arterial disease called basilar artery occlusion. Initially, there was a sudden loss of vision; then, the patient consulted an eye doctor. After this, new symptoms developed in the patient. The patient was unconscious when he was brought to Paras Hospital, Udaipur. So he was immediately put on a ventilator.

The patient's relatives were counseled to open the artery by a procedure called mechanical thrombectomy for favorable chances of improvement, and they agreed to the same; the procedure was performed with the complete symptomatic improvement of the patient.

Dr. Tarun Mathur, a Sr. Consultant of Neurology and Interventional Neurology at Paras Hospital Udaipur, said that India has more than 4,000 stroke cases daily, of which only 2% to 3% are curable. Every day 400 - 500 stroke cases are reported in Rajasthan. More than 60% of stroke victims in India experience varying degrees of disability, some of which are permanent.

If quick analysis and action are taken to reach the hospital, treatment can help patients more effectively to save their lives. After a clinical examination of the brain with tests such as a CT scan and MRI, the doctor can determine the best course of treatment. The doctor can successfully treat the sprain if the patient is brought in during the golden hour. With newer treatment modalities in some patients, the treatment window for acute stroke exceeds 24 hours.

According to the Indian Stroke Association (ISA), the prevalence of stroke is on the rise, with 1.8 million stroke cases reported yearly. Stroke is a type of brain attack that is the primary cause of disability and the second leading cause of death in India.

In India, one person has a stroke every 40 seconds, and a quarter of patients are under 50, with a significant percentage between the ages of 19 and 30. Stroke affects the most productive sectors of society, the individuals and their families, and the country's socio-economic status

South Rajasthan's first All Inside ACL held in Udaipur

Udaipur: To overcome the complex problem of cutting the bone and screwing for an implant in a knee injury operation, recently operated with state-of-the-art All Inside Internal Race technology at GBH American Hospital. After this operation, the patient was taken away with total body weight.

Ligament (ACL) grafts are usually done during knee surgery. After this, a button is placed on the top and a screw at the bottom to place the implant. Recently, Tarun Shah (45) was injured in an accident. The family took him to Dr. Gaurav Jain, a bone and joint replacement surgeon at GBH American Hospital. On examination here, it was found that the ligament of his knee was torn. On this, he was given a state-of-the-art All Inside ACL internal brace, and after the operation, he was run with total weight. This technique required cutting a minor bone, and no screws were put in.

Up and down buttons were put into operation. The patient was not strapped from the outside. Instead, an internal brace was installed inside, which is not visible from the outside when it is inside. After the operation, the patient was walked at full weight. Simultaneously, the leg was started to 90 degrees immediately afterward, and the patient's knee was bent to 120 degrees by the fifth day. Dr. Gaurav Jain said that this technique is used in international players so that after quick recovery, they can return to the field quickly. This type of operation has been possible for the first time in Udaipur. According to Dr. Gaurav Jain, this has happened for the first time in southern Rajasthan. Dr. Tarun Bhatnagar from the Department of Anesthesia was an associate with Dr. Gaurav Jain in operation.
