In Peutz-Jahers Syndrome (JPS) disease, lumps occur in the small intestine, large intestine, pancreas, and stomach, along with moles on the lips of the patient. Ten large lumps were taken out from the patient's intestines, about 3 to 5 cm in size. 21-year-old Manu (name changed), a resident of Udaipur, was successfully treated and given a healthy life at Geetanjali Medical College Hospital.

Dr. Pankaj Gupta said that he had been ill for a long time and was getting admitted to the hospital again and again. Due to this disease, he also underwent an operation in a private hospital, but there was no improvement in the patient's condition. When the patient came to Dr. Pankaj Gupta, there were moles and brown spots on the outside and inside of his lips. The patient was advised to undergo an endoscopy, in which large lumps were found in the intestine and closed the small intestine. In such a situation, all the lumps were taken out after the patient's endoscopy, and he was given a healthy life.

Dr. Pankaj Gupta said this disease occurs in one in two lakh people. By treating the patient in time, he can be cured.

If an abnormal mole is seen on the lips in childhood, then the small and large intestines should be examined with binoculars on time so that the patient can be treated in time.

For this, the administration should make arrangements for permanent monitoring.

These thoughts emerged in the meeting of the Udaipur Citizen Society held at the Ambamata office on Saturday. Society's President, Kshitij Kumbhat, said that Mrs. Dolly Bhasin, a well-known tourism visionary, was the chief guest at the meeting. She explained the need for sustainable work for tourism development, including the need for the intelligent integrated command control system in Smart Hote Udaipur.



Smt. Bhasin said that this system, developed in real-time, is being used in

many cities to control the traffic system. Such systems are also used in Indore. Whenever the traffic pressure on a route increases, the system automatically starts diverting the traffic to alternate routes. Similar systems are used to activate alternative methods immediately in case of power supply failure or water supply failure. Every data of his city is available with this command center, based on which this system works.

Mrs. Bhasin said that development should be such that it is sustainable for a long time. She also said that tourists in Udaipur need more facilities regarding traffic. E-rickshaws should be operated free of cost or at a fixed rate in the inner city after keeping the vehicles in the parking lot so that there is no pollution and convenience for the tourists. These e-rickshaws will be helpful for short distances. This facility will also be beneficial for the residents of the city. In the meeting, Kumbhat said that the city looks beautiful now, and every city dweller wants this picture of the town to remain permanent. Society's secretary Kamal Nahata also expressed hope that the city's tourism would get a new height from the G-20 Sherpa conference and said the city should benefit from it.
