Fruit saves water

Udaipur: Under the water onservation and water purification campaign at NCA Senior Secondary School, Nakoda Nagar, water hero Dr. PC Jain conducted a TDS test of the water brought from the homes of 60 students and teachers. Of these, 37 water samples vere obtained from RO, 14 from a tap, and 9 from a borewell, which was tested. Maximum 141 and minimum 8 milligrams per liter o RO, maxmum 671 and minimum 214 in a fixture, maximum 966 and



minimum 248 milligrams in borewell per liter TDS. Then

told them that 250 to 350 TDS water is the most drinkable.

He said that keeping water in a plastic bottle for a long time, microplastic dissolves in that water and can give rise to many diseases, including cancer, so a metal bottle is better. There is also a way to conserve water by spreading coconut shells around the trees. He said that Along with this, soap made from lemon and ash was also distributed for washing utensils to reduce water pol-

Eat fruits to save water. Explaining the relation

between fruits and water, he said that a person spends 300 liters of water on eating fruits for a year, and 15000 liters of water is spent on consuming meat for a year, so when we eat fruits, we also save water. It is best to eat necessary, cheap, and local fruits according to the season. If all of us start doing this, then our dry rivers will begin flowing again, water will be conserved and our health will also be good
