District Collector's innovation on Beti Bachao Beti Padhao

Bhilwara: Under Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Yojana, a oneday district-level training workshop was organized at Rajiv Gandhi Auditorium and City Council Town Hall under Project Susma.

Speaking on occasion, District Collector Mr. Ashish Modi said that this innovation would be a milestone for the girls and women of the district. He announced that faulty incinerators would be replaced to destroy sanitary napkins in secondary schools. This will benefit girls and women, and there will be a reduction in crimes against women, and society has given us a lot in return, for which we should also return the community in the form of good deeds.

Chief Executive Officer Dr. Shilpa Singh also addressed the program. She emphasized women's empowerment and gave a message to teachers and women supervisors to fulfill critical social concerns. Women's Empowerment Department's Assistant Director, Mr. Nagendra Kumar Columbia, said that under Project Susma, self-defense training had been included in security, good touch, bed touch, hygiene, menstruation management, anemia prevention, and firepower.



On this occasion, about 1500 hundred participants were present at both training sites. Vikram Singh Raghav and Priyanka Kapoor of the Sparsh Abhiyan team took a session on Good Touch Bad Touch. He said that talking to children on sensitive topics is a challenging task. Teachers have an essential role in this. Children become victims of mental depression due to exploitation

In such a situation, the part of these pieces of training becomes essential. He said children should fearlessly raise their voices against wrongdoing and behave responsibly on social media. There should be an open discussion with parents, guides, and teachers. Fifty percent of children are victims of sexual abuse in their lifetime. Chief Medical and Health Officer Dr. Mustaq Khan took a session on menstrual hygiene management and anemia prevention. In this, he highlighted the precautions to be taken during menstruation and the diseases caused by unhygienic conditions.

He told about preventive measures and informed about the Udaan scheme of free distribution of sanitary napkins to girls and women by the state government. On this occasion, selfdefense training was demonstrated by Rajni Bhansali and his team.Addressing the District Education Officer, Mr. Mahavir Kumar Sharma, told the roadmap to take Project Susma to the block and gram panchayat levels. Care India's Khushi team provided technical support in this program. All development officers, child development project officers, women supervisors, chief block education officers, and women teachers were present in the program.
