The patient got rid of a rare disease called otosclerosis

Udaipur: In the Ear Nose

Throat Department of Pacific Medical College and Hospital, a 23-year-old man was operated on for a rare condition called otosclerosis and got rid of this severe disease.

The team of Dr. PC Jain, Dr. Rajendra Gorwada, Dr. Shiv Kaushik, Dr. Prakash Auditya, Dr. Vikram, and Anil Bhatt cooperated in this successful treatment.

A 23-year-old youth from Neemuch suffered from hearing loss for a long time. Due to the desire to join the army for the country's service, this young man got treated at many places but did not get any benefit.

The relatives brought the young man to PMCH, where he showed him to Dr. Shiv Kaushik, an ear, nose, and throat specialist. It was found that on examination of the young man, advanced stage otosclerosis salt disease was detected, which was curable only by operation.

Dr. Shiv Kaushik said the patient was operated through binoculars without an incision. In this complicated operation, the ear bone was replaced with a piston.

Dr. Kaushik explained that in otosclerosis disease, the hearing begins to be disturbed due to the growth of the bone in the middle of the ear. It is usually hereditary. If the father or mother has it, children are at risk of getting it. The disease begins in one ear and later in life affects both ears. In the beginning, it is less audible, but gradually the person stops hearing it. The patient can hear perfectly, like a normal human being.

The patient's relatives said it was nothing less than a miracle. The relatives expressed gratitude to PMCH Chairman Rahul Agarwal, all the doctors, management, nursing personnel, and staff.
