South Rajasthan important for tuber crops: Dr. Karnataka

Udaipur: Under the Research Directorate of Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur, the All India Tuber Crops Research Project organized a one-day farmers' training and input distribution program on tuber crops.

Farmers from the tribal region of Mewar and scientists from the university participated in the program.

The chief guest of the program's opening ceremony was Dr. Ajeet Kumar Karnataka, Vice-Chancellor Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, who said that from the point of view of health, the use of tuber crops in food

is increasing because they contain more fiber, potassium, and vitamins. Therefore, every farmer can increase their income by 25 to 50 thousand rupees by cultivating yam, groundnut, sweet potato, arvi, turmeric, etc., in at least one bigha annually. All the South Rajasthan districts favor the cultivation of tuber crops. The need of the hour is to increase the area of these crops in Rajasthan.

The special guest of the inauguration ceremony, Dr. Biju Gangadharan, Director, Central Tuber Zoological Research Institute, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, said that research work on

tuber crops is going on at 21 centers in the country, in which meaningful work is being done on these crops for Udaipur, Rajasthan.

He said that 68 new varieties of tuber crops (Yam, Jamikand, Sweet Potato, Aarvi, Turmeric) had been developed by this institute, which is being delivered to the farmers by this Agricultural University. He said that due to climate change, the yield of rice, maize, and wheat is expected to decrease, but by increasing the area under yam, sweet potato, and pigeon pea, farmers can get more income in the changing season. He said there is a need to move

forward in entrepreneurship by linking the farmers with the processing of tuber crops. He emphasized the adoption of quality seeds of tuber crops, prepared a memorandum of understanding with the university, and emphasized new work under which starch and alcohol production techniques would be taken forward.

Dr. S.K. Sharma, Director of Research, informed that Rajasthan has about 20,000 hectares under tuber crops. But apart from potatoes, the area under yam, arvi, and sweet potato is less than 5,000 hectares which needs to be doubled. He said there are good possibilities for produc-



ing these crops in Dungarpur, Banswara, Udaipur, Rajsamand, and Hadauti areas. Dr. Virendra Singh, the project in charge, said that the chief guest also distributed various inputs to all the farmers in training. The guests

also observed the exhibition organized on tuber crops. At the end of the program, Dr. Arvind Verma, Regional Director of Research, proposed a vote of thanks. Dr. Shalini Piliyan, Assistant Professor, moderated the program.



In the program, school students remembered Gandhiji by singing their favorite songs of Gandhiji along with Ram Dhun. 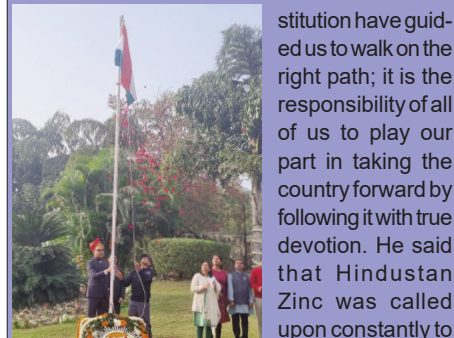
Gunjan 2023 organized at Model School Bagore

Good initiative Changed the rules, farmers got relief

Bhilwara. On behalf of the state government, relaxation has been provided to the farmers in the parameters for implementing the wiring program under the Mukhyamantri Krishak Saathi Yojana, Nutri Serial, NFSM, Crop Security Mission, under the Crop Security Mission. Now instead of 6 horizontal and 2 diagonal wires, farmers can install 5 horizontal and 2 diagonal wires in the fencing. Along with this, now, instead of 10 feet, pillars will be installed at a distance of 15 feet. Also, in place of the 10th pillar, the 15th pillar can be supported with an additional pillar. With this, it will be easier for the farmers to protect the crops standing in the field. Actually, farmers have to fence with barbed wire to protect their crops from animals so that they can protect their crops. But some farmers are not financially capable. In such a situation, the Rajasthan government has started this scheme to protect the crops of small and marginal farmers living in the state from wild animals and nilgai, wild boar.

Tarbandi criteria and grant amount - Due to the requirements of the Tarbandi scheme, many farmers were not showing interest in taking advantage of it. Now the norms of the fencing scheme have been changed, due to which the farmers will get more benefits. Under the plan, 60 percent of the cost for fencing, or Rs 48,000, is given to small and marginal farm-

ers and 50 percent of the price, or a maximum of Rs 40,000, to other farmers.

Application - Farmers can apply online through Janadhar on the Raj Kisan Saathi portal. For more information, you can contact the nearest agriculture office. Or farmers can talk on the toll-free number 1800 180 1551 of the call center.

The subsidy will be payable to the individual or group of farmers for wire fencing up to 400 running meters per farmer or group. However, suppose the field's perimeter is more than 400 meters in the remaining distance. In that case, a declaration will have to be submitted on behalf of the farmer or group of farmers to secure the field in the area required to protect the lot at their level. Only then the grant amount will be available.
