

# Officials took stock of hailstorms and heavy rain

**Udaipur.** As per the instructions of District Collector Tarachand Meena, teams of agriculture departmental officers visited the entire district on Monday to take stock of the damage caused to the crops in the area due to hailstorms and heavy rains on Saturday and Sunday and got information regarding the damage.

Agriculture officials said that heavy losses had been caused in the district due to falling pods in the standing mustard crop, breaking of ear-

rings in wheat and barley due to hailstorms and breaking of the stem in gram crops. Also, heavy losses have been observed in Rizka, Berseem, and horticulture fruit plants, etc., made for animal fodder.

Damage has also been reported due to water logging in vegetable fields. During the inspection, Additional Director Agriculture Bhuralal Patidar, Joint Director Agriculture Madho Singh Champawat, Deputy Director Horticulture Dr. Laxmi Rathore, Assistant



Director Agriculture Dr. Devendra Pratap Singh Rathore, Subdivision Officer Govind Singh, Tehsildar Chhaganlal Regar, Anil Kothari of Agricultural Crop Insurance, Narayan Lal Agriculture Officer Seema Jhagdawat, Mahesh Ameta, Assistant Agriculture Officer Jayashree Jhala and Agriculture Supervisor of the affected areas and farmers, sarpanch, public representatives were present.

During the inspection of the agriculture departmental offi-

cers on the spot, many farmers were informed about registering information about the loss of crops through the app. During this, the coordinator of the insurance company, Anil Kothari, and representative, Narayan Lal Dang, explained the method of recording the loss through the app so that the farmer can report the loss on time to the Agricultural Crop Insurance Company.

Meena conducted video conferencing to inquire about the losses caused to farmers in the district. He instructed all the sub-divisional officers, tehsildars, and officials of the agriculture department to conduct Girdawari after taking stock of the losses caused by the hailstorm in the district.

**Instructions for reporting damage:** Assistant Director Agriculture Dr. Devendra Pratap Singh Rathore said that the farmers who have suffered damage due to hail-

storms and strong winds and if they have got insurance under the crop insurance scheme, then on toll-free number 18004196116 and mail id Ro.jaipur@aicofindia .com within 72 hours so that the insurance company can take compensation action to assess the loss. He said that along with this, the agriculture supervisors and assistant agriculture officers working in the area could be contacted. Information about the loss could be filled in the form.
