

Kidney transplant@GMCH Lecture in scientific session by American surgeon Dr. Abhinav Humer

Udaipur: On 08th instant in the scientific session, on the recent changes in the field of kidney transplant was discussed at Geetanjali Medical College and Hospital. Speakers from the US included surgeons Dr. Abhinav Humer, Professor of Abdominal Transplant Surgery and Clinical Director of the Head-Division, Thomas E. Starzl Transplant Institute; Thomas E. Starzl, Professor in Transplantation Surgery, is a pioneer in the field of transplantation figure prominently.



Dr. Abhinav shared lectures on necessary precautions before kidney transplant, patient survival after kidney transplant and viral infection, new therapy, etc.

Dr. Abhinav also said that the HLA matching technique is currently used for kidney transplants. Applet matching is presently at an experimental stage, with the help of which the matching between the donor and the recipient can be done more accurately, leading to more improvement in the result.

Sharma complained of pain, swelling and itching in the right leg. His color doppler test was done in which it was revealed that he has varicose veins. Actually, a type of color image is obtained from the color Doppler test. These colors help determine the speed and direction of blood flow in arteries, veins and organs such as the heart. Sometimes this aging causes the valves in the veins that help control blood flow to break down and this becomes a problem. In this process it was seen that the longest vein of the valve of the patient's foot is not working and the blood is seeping and this is the reason for the accumulation of

blood in the ankle, that is the reason for this problem. There may also be a gradual ulceration on the side of the leg or vein and sometimes it may rupture on its own, causing severe bleeding."

"We discussed some new ways to fix it out of which his relatives chose a latest technique, in which we inject a medical glue into a long vein, it blocks the vein and the blood flow stops immediately. Gets done and complications are almost non-existent in it. Varicose veins can also be treated with laser, but the patient's recovery time is much longer.
