

Journalism should not be for bread but for the nation - Acharyashree

Bhilwara: The inauguration program of the newly constructed building of the second phase of the Press Club building built at the subdivision level in the state was organized in Shahpura under the chairmanship of Peethadhiswar Jagatguru Ramdayal Ji Maharaj of International Ramsnehi Sampraday.

In the newly constructed building, three new chambers have been built for MLA, Rajya Sabha, and Lok Sabha MP. District level press conference was also organized in the program with the chief guest of local MLA and former assembly speaker Kailash Meghwal.

Before the inauguration program, Acharya Shri, while giving blessings for the welfare of journalists by writing Ramakshar, also unveiled the inauguration plaque along with chief guest MLA Meghwal.

Acharya Shree Ramdayal Maharaj said at the district-level press conference organized on this occasion that journalism

Kota: Founder and CEO of Motion Education, Nitin Vijay, said that Kota had not become Kota just like that. There is such an



ecosystem for education here that 95 percent of the children of Kota are successful in life.

He was addressing on February 25, the second day of the two-day program 'Ideas of India Summit 2023' organized by ABP Network at Grand Hyatt Hotel, Mumbai. Famous writer Chetan Bhagat asked Nitin Vijay many questions related to Kota coaching, which he answered enthusiastically.

On the stage of ABP, Nitin Vijay said, "Kota teaches children to study with discipline for 14 to 15 hours daily. That's why 95 percent of the children who come out of Kota are successful in life. Success in life comes from persistence, passion, and struggle." The struggle is different from suffering. The effort is a journey. One should learn to love the battle in life. The child should be taught that we should not run toward selection. We should focus more on learning."

"I have studied through Kota. Everyone makes a topper out of a clincher. We should make a successful student even out of an average student. From IIT's first year, I had thought I wanted to become a teacher. There came a time when 2000 children stood outside their house, saying they would study only from me. Then I told them to decide on the fees too. Today, 30 thousand children surveyed from—15 thousand studies in Kota. For them, We have a team of two and a half thousand people."

Significantly, the summit was on the 'New India: Looking Inward, Reaching Out' theme. In this, experts from different fields talked about the journey of India in the last 75 years. Came in contact with some history and archeology experts about ten years ago. Her interest in archeology increased in touch with them, and he started writing after seeing and discover-

ing ancient places. Initially, the Dashavatara plaque was the first attempt. This place is called "Kanha Karai" by the local people. When they came to know, it was suspected that this critical place might not come under threat due to the Chambal riverfront. When he met Dhariwal ji about this, she said, don't worry, if this happens, she will get them kept in the museum. She has also researched two temples in the Kalthoon area, Baniyani Temple and Urna Temple. He will endeavor to bring to light such ancient temples and places not under the Archaeological Department. She is very excited about her archaeological articles being published in some history-related magazines.

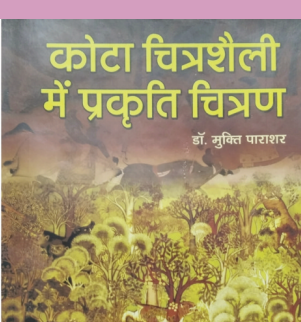
