The two-day conference of legalists started at Sukhadia University

Virtual court and legal process will become paperless under the ecourt phase three scheme-Kiren Rijiju

Udaipur (Dr. Munesh Arora): Union Law Minister Kiren Rijiju said that the era of virtual courts has come in the new technological age. We don't need to travel from one city to another by spending expensive fuel for hearing in the High Court. All this will be possible in e-court phase three.

He said that we would make the Indian judicial system paperless and virtual. Rijiju was addressing the inaugural session on the first day of the two-day conference at Vivekananda Auditorium of Mohanlal Sukhadia University here on Saturday.

In this conference on "Sustainable Development in India: Evolution and Legal Perspective" under the joint aegis of the Law Commission of the Government of India and the College of Law, Mohanlal Sukhadia University, Rijiju said that under e Court Phase 2, the Covid-19 lockdown would be held on virtual mode. Courts were going on. It was a matter of surprise all over the world. We are moving forward in e-court phase three, under which we will make the judicial process more efficient.

Minister said there is a long list of pending cases in the courts in India. Case pending and delay in justice do not suit the country and the society. The government wants the judicial process to be fast. The work pressure on the judges is immense. We want to reduce that too. That's why the central government wants to develop a dynamic legal system. He said that in the last 8 years, the government removed 1486 such laws which had no relevance, and the process is to remove 67 such laws which are not helpful in any context. For this, a bill has been brought the Parliament. The campaign to remove the law, which will not be of use, will be intensi-

He said that many problems of Udaipur Court have come before me. The building here is also small, and there are fundamental problems too. My attention has been drawn to the issues of intelligent rooms, toilets, and proper seating arrangements for other people. I will do something for the Udaipur court if a proposal is

He said that the world is moving towards becoming Vishwa Guru under Modi ji. If India is successful, then the world will be prosperous. Now the world is looking towards India, full of hope on the global stage. Prime Minister



Narendra Modi has given the word climate justice on international forums to make it effective; everyone is thinking together. It is the collective responsibility of all of us to understand our responsibility towards the environment and wildlife. Like western countries, we also have the right to live comfortably, but we do not understand our commitment. We have to realize that only then will we be able to move forward better. This is a matter of concern for all of us. He said that under the leadership of Modi ji, the Government of India is moving towards a green economy,

and soon we will achieve our goal.On this occasion, Union Minister of State for Law, Prof. SP Singh Baghel, said that the Government of India has constructed ten crore toilets and built Izzat Ghar under Swasth Bharat Abhiyan. This is a considerable achievement. In the opment has to be acceleratcarbon emissions field, we have also developed an engine with 20% ethanol.

It also has set an example by banning single-use plastic. Baghel said that due to a lack of information, many government schemes do not reach the last man. For this, he urged the University students to help take such schemes to the underprivileged.

The players and coaches of the sports department felicitated the Collector by covering him with a wreath and presenting him with bouquets.


During this, the Collector also talked to the players about the sports facilities in the district.
