Among the many tourist festivals of the country, the week-long International Kite Festival held every year on Makar Sankranti in Ahmedabad, Gujarat state, has become a worldwide festival after completing its journey of 36 years. The International Kite Festival begins seven days before Makar Sankranti and ends on Makar Sankranti.

The sight of Suryanamaskar by thousands of school children and Aditya Stuti by 200 Rishikumars is heart-touching. The festival begins with a colorful parade of international and national kite fliers. Exhibitions of kites and traditional crafts are held. Yoga and Zumba exercises are performed in the morning, and cultural programs are organized in the evening. Tourists also



enjoy the delicious cuisine of Gujarat.

During kite competitions, excitement and thrill are created on sight. With so much fun, the biggest attraction is the kites of different sizes, and designs, touching the heights of the sky. The whole atmosphere gets colored with millions of colorful kites. The old, the young, and the children are all seen drenched in the colors and fun of kites.



The whole world waits for this famous festival of Gujarat throughout the year. Along with the different states of India - Australia, Canada, France, Russia, Germany, Greece, Israel, Egypt, Colombia, Denmark, New Zealand, Indonesia, Italy, Mexico, South Africa, Belgium, Bahrain, Iraq, and Malaysia, etc. are close to the world Kite fliers from 68 countries participate with full enthusiasm in kite flying com-

petitions by showcasing their kite skills here. The number of kite fliers has increased to more than 660 at present.

The main event is held at the Sabarmati Riverfront. However, kite flying is rampant all over Gujarat. In 2023, along with Ahmedabad, the kite festival was also celebrated in Dakor, Gandhidham, Jamnagar, Rajkot, Surat, Vadodara, Dwarka, Amreli, Palanpur, Pavagadh, Valsad, and Saputara.

Such is the craze for this festival that the kite industry in Gujarat has grown from Rs 8-10 crore in the last two decades to Rs 625 crore. Every year this festival has a unique theme. In 2023, its article was based on "One Earth, One Family, One Future." This year, Gujarat Tourism Corporation has set a target of setting a Guinness World Record for the

maximum number of kite lovers from different countries flying kites at the same time. During the International Kite Festival, all the participants performed a parade wearing T-shirts and caps bearing the G20 logo. The skies of Gujarat were decorated with special kites in the shape of India's G20 Presidency logo.

This festival started from the year 1989 on the occasion of Makar Sankranti. Except for two years of Corona, it is being celebrated continuously. The International Kite Festival has many names. It is also known as Uttarayan or Makar Sankranti in Gujarat. There are different types of kites in the attraction of the International Kite Festival.

People come from far and wide to see them. People watch moths from the roofs of their houses. The International

Kite Festival is considered one of Gujarat's biggest festivals. This festival of kites is a typical Gujarati event when the sky is filled with kites from morning till evening in most of the state's cities. The Kite festival is organized during the second week of January.

On this day, almost all the usual work stops in the state, and everyone flies kites on the rooftops and streets and competes with the people around them. Tourists come from different corners of the world and enjoy this beautiful festival.



Nimbahera: The by-elections of Ward No. 16 of Nimbahera Municipality were held on Sunday, the counting of which was completed on Monday morning under the direction of Returning Officer and SDM Ramesh Sirvi Punadia.

BJP candidate Smt. Sumitra Soni won Vijayashree by five votes while getting 443 votes for this ward.

BJP municipal spokesperson Kamlesh Banwar said that as soon as BJP candidate Soni was declared victorious, BJP supporters expressed joy and congratulated each other outside the counting venue and shouted slogans in support of BJP and former minister Kriplani.

Dr. Uradia noted that when a person's breathing tubes are defective, or the tubes of his lungs become thin, and breathing is difficult, this disease is called asthma or asthma.

More than 33 crores in the world More people are suffering from this disease, and every year, about 2.5 lakh deaths are due to this disease. Dr. Uradia said that the leading causes of asthma are smoke, allergies, and infection in the respiratory tract.

If we want to get rid of asthma disease, along with medicine, lifestyle improvement, getting rid of drugs, avoiding dust and soil, being careful in changing weather, and if there is any allergy, then get it treated with a nutritious diet and time. But care has to be taken to get complete sleep. Dr. Uradia said that many people have many misconceptions about inhaler, but the medicine from inhaler directly affects the lungs, so inhaler is more beneficial than other medicine. Along with this, under the guidance of the Chief Medical Superintendent, a mock drill was conducted to extinguish the fire with the help of fire extinguishers in the Divisional Railway Hospital, Kota.

New species of fungus found in Udaipur, Rajasthan

Udaipur: Coral Fungi fungus species have been detected in the Ubheshwar forest area of the Udaipur district, scientifically identified as Phaeoclavulina spell. The credit for discovering this species for the first time in Rajasthan goes to retired forest officer Dr. Satish Sharma and field biologist Dr. Anil Sasavan of the Foundation for Ecological Security, Anand, Gujarat.



According to Dr. Sharma, beautiful fungus of brown and blue color grows on the underground parts of green bamboo. This fungus has been observed in six different bamboo sticks. It is brown and blue in bloom during the monsoon but later dries to black. This fungus multiplies by repeated bifurcation. The branches of the fungus are roughly the thickness of the pan's refill. It is brown at the bottom and blue at the top. Each branch divides into two sub-branches and grows. This type of division has been observed in up to six chakras.

Dr. Sharma said this fungus has been seen near Ubheshwar Mahadev, a high hill area of Udaipur. So far, it has been seen in Mahabaleshwar, Maharashtra.

Rajasthan is the second state where this species is found. Apart from India, this fungus has been observed in Sri Lanka, Java, Malaysia, Borneo, New Guinea, and North Caledonia. The details of discovering this new fungus have been published in issue 27 (1) of the Indian Journal of Environmental Science.
