The problem is that his parents constantly contrast him with other people. As a result, he began to imitate others. But over time, he began to take pleasure in making fun of people. He offers his sincere apolo-

gies to everyone and promise not to imitate anyone in the future. Everyone extends forgiveness and invites him to become their friend. Finally, they all rejoice in their new friendship. Make Udaipur a model district from the point of view of protection of child rights: Collector



Udaipur: In the direction of making Udaipur child labour accessible, the district administration will conduct the campaign again from June 1 to June 30, 2023, in collaboration with local voluntary organizations. This information was given by District Collector Tarachand Meena while addressing the meeting of the Child Rights Protection Unit on Monday.

For the prevention of child marriage, child marriages were stopped in Udaipur last month with significant results. The Collector said that it would be our endeavour to make Udaipur a model district in the country and the state from the point of view of protection of child rights. He informed that along with strict action against the employers in the campaign, work would also be done on better rehabilitation of the child labourers by forming a team. In the meeting, the progress of the works of the Child Welfare Committee was discussed; apart from this, the Collector reviewed the action taken in the cases of child labour, child marriage, child beggary, child trafficking etc. Also took feedback regarding the works of the Child Welfare Committee, Labor Department, Anti Human Trafficking Unit Child Line etc. The Collector also gave instructions for strict action in the cases of sexual offences (POCSO). Similarly, the joint action plan for child drug addiction was discussed. The Collector instructed to keep the children from facing problems in running all government and non-government homes per the rules. Selection of Udaipur in Action Month - Rajasthan coordinator and former member of the 'Child Labor Eradication Campaign' conducted by the National Child Rights Protection Commission, Rajasthan Child Commission, Dr Shailendra Pandya, said that every year on June 12, Child Labor Prohibition Day is celebrated. This year, from June 1 to June 30, 2023,

Action Month will be conducted in selected districts of the entire nation, under which 7 districts of Rajasthan state have been selected, including Udaipur district. Monitoring of child labour rescue will be ensured at the national level throughout this month so that follow-up of every child from recovery to rehabilitation can be provided. Good organizations will get appreciation: Rajeew Meghwal, a member of the Rajasthan Child Commission, gave information about the guideline issued by the Rajasthan Child Commission to rescue child labourers. Nodal Officer and Assistant Director Child Empowerment Meena Sharma said that the shop or restaurant where child labour will not be found during the campaign would be honoured by giving a Child Labor Free Place certificate and Juvenile Justice Act against those where child labour was found working. Action will be taken under At the end of the meeting, a poster prepared for the promotion of the campaign was also released.
