The High Court Bench Struggle Committee demanded establishment of the first virtual court in Udaipur

Udaipur: The High Court Bench Struggle Committee has demanded from the Chief Minister the establishment of the first virtual court in Udaipur. The Bar Association has raised concerns regarding parking

Adelegation led by Ramesh Nandwana, coordinator of the Struggle Committee, and Rakesh Mogra, President of the Bar Association, met the Chief Minister today at the Circuit House.

The delegation demanded the establishment of a High Court Bench and the initiation of Rajasthan's first virtual court in Udaipur. Rakesh Mogra, President of the Bar Association, also informed them about various issues in the district court premises.

In the memorandum submitted to the Chief Minister, it was requested to allocate land for the establishment of the High Court Bench in Udaipur, provide housing land for Green Tribunal Service Tribunal advocates, and provide land for parking and open a special court for the hearing of the NDPS (Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances)

cases. The delegation also requested the Chief Minister to start the first virtual court in Udaipur, similar to the ones established in Odisha and Karnataka.

Ramesh Nandwana, the coordinator, stated that due to the absence of a High Court Bench in tribal areas, many tribal districts are deprived of access to justice, and they are unable to secure bail. Additionally, various types of appeals have been pending for 30 years, and the litigants have passed away due to a lack of justice. He empha-



sized the need to start the first virtual court in Udaipur under the Central Government's important scheme.

In the memorandum given to the Chief Minister, Rakesh Mogra, President of the Bar Association in Udaipur, mentioned that 4,000 advocates visit the district court premises daily for practice, and due to insufficient premises in the court, neither the litigants nor the advocates can find parking space. The problem of parking has made it difficult for people to access the court and for the general public to pass through outside the court. He requested the allocation of a direct budget for the construction of state-of-the-art underground parking near the court premises, the transfer of government buildings near the court to the judiciary, and the allocation of
