

Joint Meeting of Governors : Addressing Border Issues

Udaipur: A joint meeting was held between the Governors of Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan to address various issues concerning both states. Governor Mr. Kalraj Mishra highlighted the importance of effectively implementing the survey of revenue disputes. He emphasized the need to ensure equal benefits for development schemes, especially health-related initiatives, in the border districts of both states. Governor Mishra instructed the officials to focus on providing equal opportunities for girl child education, medical facilities, tribal welfare, and other development schemes

to the residents of these districts. He also emphasized the need for effective resolution of caste-based issues through consultations.

The meeting, chaired jointly by Governor Shri Mangu Bhai Patel of Madhya Pradesh and Governor Mr. Kalraj Mishra of Rajasthan, was held at the Divisional Commissioner's Office in Udaipur. Governor Mishra expressed concern about the confusion in determining the location of accidents or untimely deaths near the border. He stressed the importance of coordination between the officials of both states to quickly resolve such cases through dialogue. Governor

Mishra also urged increased vigilance in the border districts, considering the upcoming assembly and Lok Sabha elections in Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh. He emphasized the need to strengthen the internal security system and utilize modern police technology for crime control and prevention.

Governor Mishra further emphasized the importance of mutually cooperating on development issues in the border districts of Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh.

He stressed the need to resolve pending issues and promote the overall development of the residents in these areas. Governor Shri Mangu



Bhai Patel of Madhya Pradesh emphasized the importance of joint efforts and unanimous

work by officials from both states to ensure efficient development without any negli-

gence.

Governor Mishra highlighted the importance of time-bound action in controlling and preventing criminal activities, demarcating revenue and forest land, addressing worker migration, and protecting folk artists and folk arts through cultural exchange programs. He emphasized the need to develop an effective security system to control crime and illegal activities in the border districts. Additionally, he emphasized resolving the demarcation issues related to revenue boundaries and forest land based on proper rules and regulations.

The Governors stressed

formulating policies and schemes to provide employment opportunities within the states, aiming to curb the migration of people for employment.

They emphasized the importance of ensuring basic facilities such as security, education, housing, drinking water, and healthcare for migrants and their families. They also emphasized the fair treatment of workers in the unorganized sector, ensuring they receive their full wages and are not exploited.

Various officials, including Principal Secretaries, Divisional Commissioners, Inspectors General of Police,

District Collectors, and Superintendents of Police from both states, attended the meeting. The meeting aimed to foster cooperation and collaboration between the administrative and police officers of the bordering districts of Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan.

Concerns Arise Over Fish Mortality During Monsoon Season

Udaipur: In a lake dialogue event held on Sunday, lake enthusiasts expressed their concerns about the potential mortality of fish during the monsoon season.

Dr. Anil Mehta, from the Lake Conservation Committee, highlighted the possibility of decreased oxygen levels in the lakes due to the pollution from catchment areas, the entry of organic matter, and the continuous presence of clouds. Such conditions can lead to fish suffocation and death. It is imperative to ensure the continuous operation of aerators and floating fountains to maintain the required oxygen levels in the water.

Tej Shankar Paliwal, a former member of the Lake Development Authority, emphasized the issue of pollution flowing into Udaysagar Lake from nearby villages along the shores of Udaya and Ayad rivers. Consequently,

Udaysagar Lake's fish population faces the greatest risk.

Nand Kishor Sharma, the Director of Gandhi Manav Kalyan Samiti, called for lessons to be learned from the fish mortality incidents that occurred in the past month. He urged the Fisheries Department and Pollution Control Board to monitor the lakes daily. Lake enthusiasts Kushal Raval and Drupad Singh noted that some individuals are disposing waste and garbage near the lake's banks, decreasing dissolved oxygen levels. They emphasized the importance of stopping such activities to prevent declining lake oxygen levels.

Before the event, a voluntary cleanup drive was conducted to remove floating debris from the lake's surface.
