Strengthening Road Infrastructure Will Pave the Way for Mission-2030: Chief Minister

Shri Ganganagar: Chief Minister Mr. Ashok Gehlot stated that the state government has resolved to make the state a leading one in the country by the year 2030. The path to achieving Mission-2030 will be paved through a robust road infrastructure. He mentioned that significant road development work has been carried out in the state over the past four and a half years, and the appreciation for our roads is being recognized nationwide. The far-flung villages in the state are now connected through safe, smooth, and beautiful road networks, leading to increased employment and income.

On Thursday, Mr. Gehlot inaugurated and laid the foundation stones for 153 road development projects costing Rs. 4,817 crores at the Chief Minister's residence. He addressed officials and representatives through video conferencing as part of the program. He highlighted that the state government is working towards creating a network of high-quality roads to ensure safe and comfortable travel, which is contributing to a positive environment for investors and opening new dimensions of development.

He emphasized that the state has sent several letters to the central government, demanding the upgradation of 50 state highways to national highways to boost industrial development and increase employment opportunities. Toll collection through the FastTag system has been implemented on state



highways, making travel smoother and time-saving for the public. Furthermore, efforts are being made to connect all major religious sites through quality road networks to promote religious tourism.

Mr. Gehlot stated that the goal is to develop over 1.00,000 kilometers of road infrastructure, and significant progress has been made, with more than 66,000 kilometers already completed. The state is investing in road construction and improvement, focusing on quality. He shared that the state's GDP was around Rs. 9,111 crores in 2018-19, which has increased to about Rs. 14,140 crores. The government aims to further increase it to Rs. 35,710 crores

Regarding the Eastern Rajasthan Canal Project (EARSIP) for 13 districts, Mr. Gehlot mentioned that pending dams will also be included in the Detailed Project Report (DPR) of EARSIP.

This inclusion will connect 53 dams from Dausa, Sawai Madhopur, Karauli, Bharatpur, and Alwar to EARSIP, with an additional Rs. 1,665 crores investment. This move is expected to benefit around 11

The Chief Minister noted that the public's active involvement is crucial in achieving the vision of making Rajasthan a leading state by 2030. He mentioned that economists, authors, journalists, students, government officials, lawyers, farmers, laborers, women, youth, intellectuals, and athletes, along with one crore citizens, will be engaged to gather suggestions for Mission 2030. Based on these suggestions, the government will release a vision document for Mission 2030.

In the event, Public Works Minister Mr. Bhajan Lal Jatav highlighted that the inauguration and foundation laying of road projects costing Rs. 4,817 crores will accelerate development in the state.

He added that in the budget for 2023-24, road construction and improvement work for 23,000 kilometers is planned at a cost of Rs. 16,123 crores. Over 66,000 kilometers of road development has been completed during the current government's tenure, significantly boosting development despite the state's challenging geographic conditions.



"Overflowing Joy Again: Four Gates of Fatehsagar **Opened**

Udaipur: The pride of Udaipur city, Fatehsagar Lake, has once again overflowed with water. Due to the renewed activity of the monsoon, the inflow of water into the lake increased, prompting the opening of 2-inch wide gates at four lake points on Monday afternoon.

Anil Kumar, the chief engineer of the Water Resources Department, mentioned that the region has been experi-

encing a spell of rain for the past two days. This has led to an increase in the water levels of the lakes. On Monday, the gates of Fatehsagar Lake were opened to discharge 80 cubic meters per second of water, with each gate opened to a



width of 2 inches. Similarly, at Swaroopsagar Lake, a 2inch gate operates, facilitating an outflow of 50 cubic meters per second. At Fatehsagar Lake, all four gates were opened to a width of 2 inches on Monday afternoon, resulting in a discharge of 95 cubic meters per second.

Upon hearing the news of the gates of Fatehsagar Lake being opened, a large number of city residents gathered at the scene to witness the spectacle of the overflowing water. They were captivated by the sight of the rushing torrents of water, and a sense of romanticism was in the

PM Modi to Visit Rajasthan Again Next Month Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to visit Rajasthan again next month. This will mark his ninth trip to the state in the past ten months.

On September 25th, Prime Minister Modi will address a massive public gathering in the town of Dhaan Ka Chora in Jaipur district, marking the culmination

of the four "Parivartan Yatras" (Change Journeys) that commenced on September 2nd from various parts of the state. This information was revealed during a meeting of the BJP's core committee chaired by the state president, C.P. Joshi, in Jaipur. The committee decided

that the BJP will organize four Parivartan Yatras across different regions of the state starting from September 2nd.

The Parivartan Yatras, spanning 23 days, will cover all 200 assembly constituencies of the state. These journeys have been organized to boost election campaigning and will start from four religious places in the state. The decision to conduct these yatras was made during a two-day brainstorming session of the BJP held in Sawai Madhopur on July 10th, under the leadership of the party's organizational secretary, B. Santosh.

During the core committee meeting, it was announced that the four yatras will commence from Goga Medi Mandir (Hanumangarh) in the northern region, Beneshwar Dham (Dungarpur) in the southern region, Trinetra Ganesh Mandir (Sawai Madhopur) in the eastern region, and Ramdevra Mandir (Jaisalmer) in the western region of the state. The leadership of these vatras is yet to be finalized.

It is speculated that responsibility for these yatras might be assigned to C.P. Joshi for Mewar, Vasundhara Raje for Hadoti and Jaipur-Ajmer regions, Gajendra Singh Shekhawat for Marwar, and Dr. Satish Poonia for the Opposition. All the 71 current BJP MLAs and candidates will be part of these yatras.

The core committee meeting in Jaipur was attended by several key party leaders, including Arun Singh, the national general secretary, Om Prakash Mathur, the in-charge of Chhattisgarh elections, Vijaya Rohatkar, the co-in-charge of the state, Kailash Choudhary, the central minister of agriculture, and Chandrashekhar Mishra, the party's organization sec-

retary. The absence of former Chief Minister Vasundhara Raje, Water Resources Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, and Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal in the meeting was noted, reportedly due to various reasons. The meeting was attended by Arun Singh, the party's state in-charge, Om Prakash Mathur, the Chhattisgarh election in-charge; Vijaya Rohatkar, the co-in-charge of the state, CP Joshi, organizational secretary Chandrashekhar Mishra, opposition leader Rajendra Rathore, deputy leader Dr. Satish Poonia, national general secretary Dr. Alka Singh Gurjar, and MPs Kanakmal Katara of Banswara-Dungarpur.
