Ananta Trust Enables Successful Cochlear Implants

Rajsamand, With Ananta Charitable and Education Society's support, two chil dren born with hearing impairments have successfully undergone "Cochlear Implantation." a procedure performed by renowned doctors specializing in ear, nose, and throat con

Dr. Nitin Sharma, the Executive Director of Ananta Hospital, informed that Jayashree Jhala. a 2-vear-9-month-old resident of Devji Khera, Mavli, Udaipur, and Bhavesh Chaudhary, a 3-year-old resident of Sadari, Pali district, have been unable to hear since birth, which had also hindered their speech development. When their families brought them to the Ear, Nose, and Throat department at Ananta Hospital, the doctors recommended Cochlear Implantation. The cost of the implantation procedure was estimated to be around 10 to 12 lakh rupees, which the families, coming from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, were unable to afford.

In response to their request for assistance, Ananta Charitable Trust came forward and provided the necessary financial support for the Cochlear Implantation of both

The Cochlear Implantation procedure occurred in a workshop led by Dr. Mohanish Grover, a prominent Cochlear Implant surgeon at Sawai Man Singh Medical College Jaipur. Dr. H.S. Bhui, Superintendent of Ananta Hospital, led the team, which included Dr. Sushant Joshi, Dr. Ram Kalyan Meena, Dr. Sumal, Dr. Ankita, Dr. Ashish, and others.ENT specialist Dr. Bhui explained the uniqueness of Cochlear Implantation. describing how these devices are surgically implanted into the inner ear through a medical procedure, allowing children who could not hear from an early age to lead normal lives, including speech and communication. He urged the general public to be attentive to children's hearing abilities and seek specialized medical attention if a child exhibits hearing difficulties or speech impediments.

This endeavor showcases the impact of collaborative efforts in providing essential medical care to children with hearing impairments and ensuring they have a chance at a brighter future.



PTSD can be a serious indicator of a mental condition, don't ignore it

Udaipur: Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) is a type of mental problem that occurs after a traumatic incident. Situations such as car accidents, falling from heights, getting trapped somewhere, have a significant impact on a person's mental state.

After such events, individuals often experience symptoms like flashbacks. nightmares related to the incident, and high levels of anxiety. Dr. Chetan Goyal, Head of Critical Care at Paras Health, Udaipur, explained that it is crucial to pay close attention to the symptoms of the



Many times, patients with this probem are so tangled up in it that they don't even realize what is happening, and even if they do, we tend to overlook it sometimes. Therefore, it is essential to pay attention to the symptoms and seek treatment for the patient.

Dr. Sandeep Bhatnagar, Director of Internal Medicine at Paras Health, Udaipur, mentioned that understanding changes in a patient's behavior is essential. The person may start withdrawing from social settings, avoiding people, preferring to be

If a severe accident or incident occurs. and the person survives, they often cannot escape from flashbacks even after recovery. They keep thinking about this dangerous incident.

The person also faces sleep-related issues and may experience depression. In such cases, it is necessary to observe the patient's symptoms and immediately seek psychological treatment from a mental health professional.

If you take the patient to a mental health doctor in a timely manner, they provide treatment through counseling, hypnosis, and medications. Therefore, my suggestion is to pay attention to the patient's symptoms, and if they exhibit such problems, contact a mental health professional immediately."
