## Congress Announces New Leadership Team

**New Delhi:** The announcement of the new team of the Congress was made almost 14 months after Mallikarjun Kharge took over as the party president. Congress President Kharge has not made many changes in the old team. In his new team, 12 general secretaries and 12 secretaries have been appointed. Priyanka Gandhi Vadra will continue as the general secretary, but she will not be in charge of any state. Avinash Pandey has been appointed as the in-charge of Uttar Pradesh in her place. Former Deputy Chief Minister of Rajasthan Sachin Pilot has been appointed as the National General Secretary and in charge of Chhattisgarh.

Despite all criticisms, K.C. Venugopal will continue as the organization secretary of the Congress. Ajay Maken was appointed as the treasurer a few days ago and he will also continue in his position. Two joint treasurers, Milind Deora and Vijay Inder Singla, have been appointed. Like before, Jairam Ramesh will remain the general secretary and head of the communication department. Gurdeep Sappal, working in the office of the national president, has been appointed as the in-charge general secretary. Ramesh Chennithala, a prominent leader of the Kerala Congress, has been appointed as the in-charge of Maharashtra, while Devendra Yadav has been given the responsibility of Punjab. Like before, Randeep Surjewala will be in charge of Karnataka, Sukhjinder Randhawa of Rajasthan, and Deepak Babaria of Delhi. Babaria has also been given the additional responsibility of Haryana. Mukul Wasnik has been appointed as the in-charge of Gujarat. In place of Avinash Pandey, Jharkhand's in-charge, J.G. Meir, has been given the responsibility of Jammu and Kashmir. He will also remain in charge of West Bengal. Jitendra Singh will handle the responsibilities of both Assam and Madhya Pradesh. Kumari Selja, removed from Chhattisgarh, has been given the responsibility of Uttarakhand. Deepa Dasmunshi has been made in-charge of Telangana along with several other states. Manik Rao Thakre, who contributed to the Congress victory in Telangana, has been sent to Goa. Senior leader Mohan Prakash has been made the in-charge of Bihar.

Before this, Congress has also formed the Election Manifesto Committee for the Lok Sabha elections. Former Union Minister P. Chidambaram has been appointed as its chairman. T.S. Singhdeo, former Deputy Chief Minister of Chhattisgarh, will be the convener of this committee. Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, Jairam Ramesh, and Shashi Tharoor will also be part of it. Former Union Minister Anand Sharma, party deputy leader in the Lok Sabha Gaurav Gogoi, and others have also been included. Even before this, on Tuesday, Congress formed a committee to discuss the alliance at the national level. Mukul Wasnik has been made its coordinator. Its members include Ashok Gehlot, Bhupesh Baghel, Salman Khurshid, and Mohan Prakash.

## Geetanjali Hospital's Pioneering Medical Achievement

**Udaipur:** Geetanjali Medical College and Hospital's Cardiac Center successfully treated a 30-year-old patient suffering from heart valve constriction and pulmonary arteriovenous fistula without the need for incisions. Utilizing cutting-edge medical technology, the skilled cardiology team, led by Dr. Ramesh Patel, Dr. Dilip Jain, Dr. Jay Bharat, Dr. Gaurav Mittal, and their team, provided successful treatment, ensuring a healthy life for the patient. The hospital's cardiology team consistently employs advanced medical techniques to treat patients.

**Details:** The 30-year-old patient was suffering from valve constriction, causing difficulty in breathing and anxiety. Her oxygen level was also at 70%.



Upon examination, it was discovered that, in addition to the valve constriction, she also had a pulmonary arteriovenous fistula, leading to a short circuit of blood to the left side of the heart without oxygen.

When brought to Geetanjali Hospital, the patient's condition was severe. The cardiology team, headed by Dr. Ramesh Patel, Dr. Dilip Jain, Dr. Jay Bharat Sharma, and Dr. Gaurav Mittal, decided to repair the veins of the foot without an incision. Initially, the patient's mitral valve constriction was enlarged using a balloon, a procedure known as balloon valvotomy. Subsequently, the patient's pulmonary arteriovenous fistula was closed with a device without incising the foot. Due to the complexity of the operation, the fistula was successfully closed using various instruments. This led to a complete improvement in the patient's oxygen level, and she returned to normalcy after being critically ill. Dr. Patel mentioned that this type of complex case was treated successfully for the first time in southern Rajasthan. Such treatments for severe illnesses are usually available at major centers in metropolitan areas.
