Letter Raises Concerns Over Congress



Udaipur: Bhawarlal Gurjar, the Kulpramukh of Rajasthan Vidyapeeth and former Vice President of the Rural District Congress Committee in Udaipur, has written a letter to Mallikarjun Kharge, the National President of the Congress, holding former Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot responsible for the party's defeat in the state.

In his letter, Gurjar has pointed out the working style of Gehlot and former Legislative Assembly Speaker Dr. C.P. Joshi, citing favoritism, neglect of party workers, and biased ticket distribution as the reasons for Congress' setback. 

Seth Sambliya Ji Temple in Rajasthan: A Spiritual and Tourist Attraction

In the rich tapestry of Krishna temples in India, Seth Sambliya Ji's temple in Rajasthan has emerged not only as a center of devotion and faith for the residents but also as a captivating attraction for tourists. Situated in Mandfiya on National Highway 27-48 (Golden Quadrilateral Road Plan) en route from Chittorgarh to Udaipur, this ancient and contemporary religious site is dedicated to Lord Krishna.

Main Temple in Mandfiya: A Spiritual

The main temple in Mandfiya, where the smallest idol is enshrined, is renowned as the epitome of Krishna Dham. This temple, located 41 kilometers from Chittorgarh Railway Station and 65 kilometers from Udaipur's Dabok Airport, showcases remarkable architectural and sculptural craftsmanship. The design of the temple is reminiscent of renowned temples like Jagannath Temple in Puri, Delwara Temples, and Ranakpur Temples. Due to its artistic significance, the temple has become a focal point of attraction for tourists.



Seth Sambliya Ji's Other Temples

Seth Sambliya Ji's second temple is situated at Bhadsoda-Bagund Chaurahas, where the central idol is consecrated. This temple is also known as the "Prakatya Mandir" or the Manifest Temple due to the manifestation of deities. The third temple is located in Bhadsoda town, considered the oldest among them, where the largest idol is consecrated. These temples were constructed under the patronage of the Mewar royal family and were later expanded over time.

Legend and Recognition:

According to prevalent beliefs, the excavation of these idols is linked to Meera Bai, who worshipped the same Giridhar Gopal as Seth Sambliya Ji. The story goes that during Aurangzeb's reign when Mughal forces were demolishing temples, and upon their arrival in Mewar, it was revealed that these idols were with Sant Dayaram. Fearing desecration, Dayaram buried the idols under a banyan tree in the open ground of Bagund-Bhadsoda village. The spiritual journey of Sant Dayaram culminated, and in 1840, Bholararam Gurjar, a shepherd, had a dream leading him to excavate these idols. Three temples were built to enshrine thesstory of e three idols, establishing the divine presence of Shri Sambliya Seth Ji in Bhadsoda-Bagund.

Professor Manju Baghmar, Serving in Udaipur as an Educator for 25 Years, Now a Minister





Professor Manju Baghmar, born in Byawar and currently residing in Nagaur, has had a long association with Udaipur. She joined Mohanlal Sukhadia University as an Assistant Professor in 1998 and later became a Professor in 2014. Throughout this period, she remained actively involved in the field of education. Professor Devendra Shrimali of the Commerce College mentioned that Baghmar has excelled in academics, securing a gold medal in LLB. She will now be on special leave for five years, as per university regulations.

Baghmar, known for her dedication to student welfare, has served as the head of the Department of Business Administration and also held the position of Chief Warden in the college. She has also been an Associate Dean at the Commerce College.

Having contested in four elections in the Jayal constituency of Nagaur, Baghmar won two of them. She first contested on the BJP ticket in 2008 but faced defeat. She secured victory in 2013 and later faced another defeat in 2018. In the 2023 elections, she contested again with the BJP and emerged victorious, leading to her appointment as a State Minister in the government.
